THE HOUSE CRISIS COMMITTEE.

The following resolutions were offered by Mr. Bristow, of Kentucky, Jan. 3, and adopted by the committee of Thirty-Three, as expressive of the views and feelings of the Committee: Resolved, That we recognize slavery as now existing in fifteen of the States by the usage and laws of those States, and we recognize no authority, legal or otherwise, outside of a State which is entitled to interfere with slaves or slavery in such States, in disregard of the rights of their owners or the peace of society.
