WASHINGTON AND SOUTHERN NEWS.

A rumor that the U. S. fleet—six vessels—had appeared off Charleston harbor, Tuesday night, created an intense excitement, not only among the Carolinians, but throughout the whole South, within sweep of the telegraph.

The Virginia Convention had important action on Tuesday. A resolution offered by Mr. Wise in favor of recognizing the independence of the seceded States was adopted by an overwhelming majority—one hundred and twenty-eight to twenty.

President Lincoln, it seems, has sent to Gov. Curtin of Pa., a hint, that being uneasy in the Capitol, he may need force from Pennsylvania to keep him there, against threats from Maryland and Virginia.

There are reports of contemplated changes in the Cabinet. Mr. Chase, Secretary of the Treasury, will, it is said, be appointed a Supreme Court Judge; Mr. Cameron will go into the Treasury Department and John M. Bots, of Virginia, will be appointed Secretary of War in place of Mr. Cameron.
