STOPPAGE OF FREIGHT FOR THE SOUTH.

LOUISVILLE, May 30.—Immense quantities of freight for the South are going by the Nashville railroad.

The exodus of Southerners northward is unprecedented, partly attributed to the stoppage of boats on the Mississippi.

It is rumored that if the Nashville road is stopped, the Tennesseans will advance into Kentucky and take possession of the road.
