UNLAWFUL OF THE CONSTITUTION.

Those who will look at the acts of the Executive Branch of our Government for the past six weeks, in a constitutional light, will see that Mr. Lincoln and his Cabinet have taken a position which is in open rebellion to both the Legislative as well as the Judicial branches of our Government.

The President has exceeded the legitimate powers of his office, and usurped a right which Congress refused to give him. And he has also defied the judiciary in telling an officer of the army to suspend the *habeas corpus* act; for that power belongs only to Congress.

In his mad endeavor to annul the glorious Constitution given us by our fathers and substitute in its place the sectional platform of his party, he has attempted to assume powers denied him by both the Judicial and Legislative branches of our Government, and is now acting more as a Dictator than as the Chief Magistrate of a Republic—more like a tyrannical despot than as the ruler of a people before celebrated for the freedom of their institutions.

The facts stated may be too strong for some timid minds, and the real truths too suggestive and unpalatable; but the existing state of affairs shows that the Constitution by which our country has heretofore been governed, has been, with ruthless hand, unceremoniously thrust aside, and our government is being conducted by a policy originated by "higher law" politicians who have always been opposed to giving the South her just and Constitutional rights, and who have done all in their power to force her out of the Union. Let us, therefore, hear no more cant about supporting the Government until we are assured that the Government will support the Constitution. Let every true patriot take a firm and bold stand for supporting the Constitution, and for carrying out the principles of the same as they were interpreted by its founders; and when those in power are willing to take this position, then our present troubles will be quickly and easily settled—settled without the shedding of any more blood; settled peacefully.

But if those who are at the head of the Executive branch of our government are determined to carry on this unconstitutional war to the bitter end; are determined to drench our once peaceful and happy land with human kindred blood; are determined to pursue such a suicidal course as will render union impossible forever; if these fanatics are determined to pursue such a course, and override and trample upon—as they have already done, and are now doing—the two other branches of our government; it is time, high time, that the people of the North who still believe that we are a free people should arouse at once, and prevent our Constitutional government from being overthrown and a military despotism substituted.

There is a terrible pressure of office seekers at Washington. They come almost as fast as the army, and quite as numerous. As numerous as the army contractors, would be the proper pronunciation. The removal of Democrats goes on faster than ever—notwithstanding the "no party" "no party now" cry which is being used to draw, and which has evidently drawn, a few Democrats into the trap set for them by wily Republicans. As to the appointment of many officers just made, the New York News says:

We hear that Mr. George Dennison has received his appointment as Chief of Naval Office of this port. Mr. Dennison is a close and intimate friend of President Lincoln's family, and it is said, by one of the Washington correspondents, that the office conferred upon him is to be considered as a sort of reward in view of his being at the head of the relations with the family, in monetary countries it will be remembered, it is customary to pension the members of the blood, when they marry, out of the public funds.

One of the dispatches sent from Washington by the Administration, states that a general impression of all persons between sixteen and sixty is said to be going on in Virginia. This dispatch was undoubtedly sent North for the purpose of deceiving the people in regard to the true state of feeling South. We saw two gentlemen on Saturday who have lately traveled over the South. They say that five men offer their services where one is accepted. Letters from various sections of the South received in this city state the same fact. This does not look much like a general "impression;" and an administration that is obliged to circulate such stuff to keep up the sinking courage of its friends is unworthy of the confidence or support of every true patriot.

WASHINGTON AND SOUTHERN NEWS.

Mr. Wilson G. Smith, of Derby, has shown the editor of the New Haven Courier a new style of breech-loading rifle or musket, which in simplicity and convenience appears to be an improvement over Sharps'. The breech is thrown up by a hinge on the side, the cartridge inserted, the breech dropped and the piece fired. Old style muskets are readily altered and made effective at nearly twice the distance they could be used at before, while the cost of the operation is comparatively trivial.

Justin Hodge, Quarter-Master of the First Regiment, has been appointed Quarter-Master of the Connecticut Brigade.

Among the regiments ordered into Virginia are the Second and Third Regiments of Connecticut Volunteers.

The Republican and war papers, are having a great deal to say about what Senator Douglas said on his death bed. That which they say he said, was undoubtedly manufactured by some Abolition Republican trickster for the occasion. The position taken by Senator Douglas in his speech in the Senate, March 15, proves conclusively that he was a strong opponent of the present administration, and bitterly opposed to the unconstitutional aggressive policy which he then foresaw it had determined to adopt. The substance of a portion of Mr. Douglas' speech is this: "Every tyrant that has undertaken to trample upon the constitutional rights of the people under him, and to deprive them of the same, has endeavored to draw supporters to his standard by crying out, 'Have we a government?' but has always failed to carry out his despotic plans and failed in his lawless attempts." Mr. Lincoln ought to learn a lesson from history, and adopt a constitutional policy now. It will be more honorable for him to do so of his own free will, than to wait until he is obliged to—for sooner or later he will find out that the free people of this country will not tolerate a policy that tends to a military despotism—and with all its evils and burdensome taxes.

A correspondent in New York sends the editor of the New Haven Courier a broad of something that looks like tough hemp, and avers it is a "section" of a whip lash braided from a piece of beef, such as is served out to our Third Regiment C. V., now in Washington. This is not exactly the entertainment our Volunteers were invited to. The fact is, the Republican Quarter Masters are so anxious to make money fast, that they don't care what the soldiers have to eat, if they can only fill their own pockets. This certainly is a beautiful state of things. But we suppose it is all right—as the chief actors are good war Republicans. No one, therefore, must say against their acts; if they do, they will be called traitors and charged with treason. Freedom of speech must hereafter be indulged in only by those who support "our" side, and "our military despotic acts."

Another severe thunder storm passed over Stratford, Tuesday evening, the lightning striking in many places. Several trees have been discovered more or less damaged. Four or five telegraph poles nearly opposite the residence of Mr. C. H. Rodgers, were also torn to splinters; a little son of Mr. Charles Gilbert was passing at the time and was nearly prostrated by the shock, from the effects of which he has not yet entirely recovered; the splinters flew in all directions, some of them striking one of the animals the lad was driving in the neck and head. Nearly every telegraph pole between Bridgeport and Bruce's creek, Stratford, bear marks of the fluid. Many of them are nearly destroyed. The "oldest inhabitants" declare this storm to almost equal the storms of old times when thunder showers lasted three or four days, and then turned into a settled rain.

The Democrats of New London refused to be caught in the "no party!" "no party now!" trap of the Abolition Republicans at the late city election in that place. Good for the Democracy of New London. We commend them for the firm stand they have taken. Their position is the right one. Those who from interest or fear support the policy of the present unconstitutional, tyrannical administration, endorse in a measure the aggressive principles of the Chicago Platform, principles that have caused the existing state of things.

The Corwin amendment to the Constitution, submitted by Congress to the Legislature of the States passed the Legislature of Rhode Island on Friday last, in the Senate, unanimously, and in the House by vote of forty-three to eighteen. This is right. We are glad to note movements of this kind. They may be productive of some good in the end. We hope that the Connecticut Legislature will do likewise, although we notice that the Republican press and leaders are using every exertion to defeat its passage.

The statements of the New York City banks for the week ending June 8, foot up as follows: Loans and discounts \$117,509,075; specie \$36,837,025; circulation \$8,963,007; net deposits \$87,656,730. These figures show a decrease of \$7,811,106 in loans; \$665,377 in specie; \$2,540,699 in net deposits, and an increase of \$279,227 in circulation.

Edwin M. Roberts has been appointed Postmaster at East Hartford, vice Samuel G. Phelps, East Hartford, resigned.

Horse thieves are driving a brisk business in New Haven and vicinity.

WASHINGTON AND SOUTHERN NEWS.

It appears, upon reliable authority, that the defenses of Richmond are very complete, and have been in course of construction for some time. The easiest approach to the city is by the York river, although it is situated upon the James river; but the latter stream is narrow and tortuous a little below, and difficult of navigation. The York river, on the contrary, is a deep broad stream. On this side, then, fifteen or sixteen heavy batteries, mounted, with rifled cannon and columbiads, have been erected at intervals down its banks. They are said to be in perfect order, and the guns well manned by disciplined artillerymen. President Davis has recently inspected them, and pronounced them satisfactory. The defenses at Manassas he considers sufficient to protect Richmond on that side.

Gen. Butler, having learned that the revolutionists were forming an entrenched camp at Great Bethel, nine miles from Hampton, decided on an attempt to dislodge them. Several regiments were detailed for this purpose on Sunday night but the enemy's position was defended by a masked battery of rifled cannon, and the expedition was not sufficiently supplied with artillery to carry it. The troops retired in good order after using all their ammunition, with a loss of twenty five or thirty killed and about one hundred wounded. Lieut. Greble, of the regular artillery, was killed. An awful blunder was committed at the junction of the forces at Little Bethel previous to the march on the enemy. The German regiment, in the darkness, fired on the Albany regiment, killing one man and wounding two others.

A convention of delegates from the different banks of the revolutionary States met at Atlanta, Ga., on the 3d inst. Resolutions were adopted recommending the banks to receive and pay out the Southern Confederacy treasury notes; recommending all the railroad companies to do the same; advising the Legislatures of the different States to enact laws authorizing tax collectors to receive said notes, and recommending "all States, cities and corporations having coupons payable in the city of New York or elsewhere in the Northern country," to appoint some place of payment in the Confederate States. The Convention will meet again in Richmond on the 24th of July.

One dispatch says the Harper's Ferry troops are falling back towards Winchester and Manassas Junction. On the other hand, it is reported from Hagerstown that the troops on the Potomac at different points have been reinforced, and that the Union men at Williamsport were fearful of an immediate attack.

Letters from the seceded States received at the West have no additional postage charged by the Confederate States, showing that their new arrangements have not yet gone into effect. It is understood that Postmaster-General Blair requires the recipients to pay the United States postage, the stamps on the letters being regarded as appropriated without being paid for.

Assurances come from Washington that Belgium will not recognize the Southern Confederacy; and it is said that the recent statement that a large shipment of arms for the South from that country had taken place is an exaggeration.

An order has been issued by the War Department for the employment of female nurses, properly trained and over thirty years of age. Miss Dix will superintend their employment.

The fight at Clearspring, Md., between the Home Guards and the revolutionists who were endeavoring to destroy dam No. 5 on the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal, resulted in no loss to the Marylanders, and slight casualties to the enemy.

Steamers have been notified at Evansville, Ind., that transportation of provisions to Smithfield and Paducah, Ky., is in violation of the instructions of the Government, and will be prevented.

The Frankfort Yeoman says that the invasion of the sacred soil of Kentucky by Gen. Prentiss will not be submitted to for one moment.

The Vermont Regiment at Newport News threw up, in four days, a strong breastwork, three thousand yards long, with a ditch sixteen feet wide and twelve feet deep.

It is said that the breastworks erected by the federal troops on the Virginia side of the Potomac, extend for ten miles, and are mounted with heavy batteries.

One thousand men are employed in throwing up earthworks near Alexandria, as a precaution against an attack.

It is rumored that Governor Wise is to be placed in command of the Virginia forces in the Northwestern portion of the State.

General Beauregard has issued a proclamation from Manassas Junction to the people of that district.

Great activity prevails in the Ordinance Department at the Washington navy yard. The yellow fever has made its appearance in New Orleans.

The revolutionists have destroyed some twenty-five canal boats in the vicinity of Harper's Ferry, to prevent their use as transports.

Indiana has been called upon for six additional regiments. Colonels S. Meredith, W. L. Brown, and McMillen are each to command a regiment.

The Charleston Mercury reports that a privateer captured off Georgetown, S. C., a portland grain valued at \$40,000.

The ship Sebasticook, of Bath, Me., has been seized at Savannah, in consequence of remaining longer than allowed by law.

Gov. Pickens, of S. C., has issued a manifesto against sending funds to the North.

A person by the name of Charles Bates, of Darien, was run over by the cars at that place and killed, on the night of June 10. It is stated that he was intoxicated at the time.

FOREIGN NEWS.

By the Adriatic, from Galway, at St. Johns, N. F., we have telegraphic reports from Europe to the 5th of June, three days later.

The steamship Great Eastern, from New York on the 25th of May, arrived in the Mersey on the 3d of June at St. Johns.

The horse Rotterdam, unknown on the turf previously, won the Derby stakes on the Derby Day. Betting had been sixteen to one against him.

Napoleon had fully discussed the Roman question, by autograph letter, with Victor Emmanuel and it is said that the integrity of the Papal territory is to be guaranteed by the great Powers. The new kingdom of Italy was to organize an army of National Guards, made up of two hundred and twenty battalions.

Lord John Russell had announced in Parliament that the Government had determined to prohibit privateers and to prohibit from bringing prizes into British ports, and that France intended to abide by its law, which prohibits privateers remaining in prize over twenty-four hours to dispose of prizes when they are taken.

He also said that England and France had sent propositions to Washington, based on the Declaration of the Paris Congress, and that an answer was expected by every mail.

Troops are still encamped in the streets of Warsaw.

Cotton was firm and in active demand in Liverpool on the 4th of June. Breadstuffs remained very dull.

STATE ITEMS.

E. K. Manderville, of New Haven, was knocked down in that city while on his way home early Tuesday morning by a person named Gibbs, who attempted to rob him of his money. Some officers who were near, prevented him from carrying out his design, and put him in safe quarters. Gibbs is a sailor about thirty years old, and formerly belonged in Bridgeport. He is now in jail awaiting his trial.

Samuel D. Hobby, an old and respected citizen of Greenwich, was run over by the cars at that place and killed, June 7. He was walking on the track at the time near a curve, and being deaf, did not hear the cars as they approached.

In Danbury, on Saturday afternoon last, as a man named Casey was engaged in unloading ties, near the Freight House, the horses started and threw him off the load. He had one leg broken and was otherwise injured.

Judge Sanford, of the Supreme Court, was thrown from his horse when in Litchfield on Wednesday June 5, of last week, and so badly cut upon the forehead in the region of the eye, as for a time to awaken serious apprehensions. The accident however is not likely to prove a serious one.

BUYING A FORT.—Quite an original method of taking a fort is described in the number of Blackwood's Magazine. In 1896, a large Russian army besieged the Turkish fort of Anz, which was situated on a plain, strongly fortified, and had a small but well equipped garrison. No common approaches could be made to it, and the Turkish commandant was determined to take the place at any cost, proposed to bury it with dirt by gradual approaches. He had a large quantity of earth and stone, and he set to work to dig a trench, and to work with spades, throwing up a high embankment of earth, and advancing nearer and nearer every day to the place, by throwing up the huge earth wall before them in advance. The men were kept in camp, working day and night, the earth being thrown from one to another like the steps of a stair, the top gang taking the lowest place every half hour in succession. In five weeks the huge earth wall was carried forward nearly one mile until it rose to and above the highest ramparts, and the Turkish Governor to hang out the white flag and give in. Had he not done so General Gordon would have buried the fortress.
