MORE PARTICULARS OF THE GREAT BATTLE. BALTIMORE, June 13.—The county bridge, where the battle was fought on Monday, is near the head of a branch of Back River, better known as Great Bethel. After crossing a narrow but deep stream, the road deflects to the left. Along its side, just beyond the bridge, the rebels planted their batteries, consisting of at least one twelve-pound rifle cannon and two field-pieces.

Nine entrenchments then followed on the right side of road—a ditch between them. The position was excellently chosen. There were stream and morass on the left of the road, widening so as to render futile any attempt to out-flank the rebels on that side. The formation of ground on the right made a flank movement very circuitous. The first intimation the U. S. troops had of the battery was a sharp discharge of artillery upon the Zouaves, who at once attempted to carry the works, but were unable to pass the stream and had to fall back among the trees. Other regiments came up in good order, but for want of good commanders fell back in confusion.

A council of Colonels was held and the order was given to retreat, after the men had been exposed to a heavy fire. In the meantime Lieut.-Col. Washburn with two hundred and fifty men had reached the rear of the battery, and it is quite evident that the rebels did not number six hundred, and were on the point of leaving the field! Notwithstanding the reported pursuit, the rebels were not seen this side of Great Bethel. It is fortunate that the rebel cavalry did not pursue. On the disappearance of the whole force the enemy fearing an attack under better auspices, left their entrenchments and hastily withdrew towards Yorktown, carrying away their artillery and burning the adjacent buildings.

Col. Taylor, with nearly one thousand men, yesterday made a reconnaissance from Newport News, but returned in the evening, and no other military movement occurred. A Captain of the Zouaves with a flag of truce and a Sergeant-to-day has gone to Great Bethel, bearing a letter from Gen. Butler respecting the burial of the dead. They have not yet returned.

The official returns of loss is not yet complete. Four of Duryea's Zouaves were killed, two dangerously wounded and ten badly, and ten missing. Altogether there were certainly twenty-five killed and fifty wounded. Two of the wounded died yesterday. Benedict's regiment has three killed, seven wounded, and two missing. An accident in the morning cost Townsend's regiment two lives; several wounded. At Great Bethel he had nine killed and two mortally wounded. Quite a large number are still missing.

Lieut. Groble, whose funeral was celebrated with imposing ceremonies, was killed on horseback by a rifle cannon ball. Major Winthrop fell mortally wounded in the arms of a Vermont Volunteer. He was an aid and acting Secretary to Gen. Butler, and author of the brilliant Seventh Regiment article in the Atlantic Monthly.

Brigadier-General Pierce has not yet given an official account of the unfortunate affair. The Montecello has just arrived from Washington with a large amount of ammunition. The weather is intensely hot.

THE REVOLUTIONISTS AT HARPER'S FERRY.

FREDERICK, June 13.—A returned Baltimorean from Harper's Ferry states that the number of troops at that place has been rather underestimated than over stated.

Additional numbers were arriving by every train, and were so distributed that their presence could be scarcely detected fifteen minutes after. The probability is that they are forwarded to other points. They have an abundance of artillery, which is so posted in his estimation as render the place impregnable. Two thousand troops are expected there to-day and to-morrow.

The Baltimore regiment is encamped at Bolivar, armed with Tennessee rifles. The Kentuckians regarded all with general suspicion and dislike and almost open mutiny. Provisions are abundant and strictest discipline enforced.

The destruction of the bridge at Point Rocks was unauthorized. The officer by whom it was ordered has been severely reprimanded. The Baltimore City Guards are stationed at Suffolk near Portsmouth. Maryland Heights to be abandoned.

PRESIDENT DAVIS' LETTER. MONTGOMERY, May 25.—The following is President Davis' letter to the Maryland Commissioners:

GENTLEMEN:—I received with sincere pleasure the assurance that the State of Maryland sympathizes with the people of these States in their determination to vindicate the right of self-government. The people of Maryland are enlisted with whole hearts on the side of reconciliation and peace. The people of these Confederate States, notwithstanding their separation from their late sister, have not ceased to feel deep solicitude in her welfare, and to hope that at no distant day a State whose people, habits and institutions related with theirs, will seek to unite her fate and fortunes with this confederacy.

The Government of the Confederate States receives with respect the suggestions of the State of Maryland, that there should be a general cessation of hostilities now impending until another meeting of Congress in July next, in order that said body may, if possible, arrange for an adjustment of existing trouble by means of negotiations rather than by the sword, but is at a loss to reply without repetition of language it has used on every possible occasion that has presented itself since the establishment of their independence.

In deference to the State of Maryland, however, I again assert in most emphatic terms, that since its sincere and earnest desire is for peace, that whilst this Government would readily entertain any proposition from the Government of the United States tending to a peaceable solution of pending difficulties, recent attempts of this Government to enter into negotiations with the United States were tended without results, which forbid any renewal of proposals from it to that Government, if any further assurance of the desire of this Government for peace are necessary.

MATTERS IN KENTUCKY. LOUISVILLE, June 13.—It is thought that the transmission of arms, ammunition, &c., through Louisville to the South will be stopped in a few days.

Business in Louisville is completely prostrated. There is no mail now between Louisville and the South.

The steamboat "Mendoza" exploded near Louisville Wednesday, fatally scalding one and drowning two boatmen.

A prominent German at Louisville has advised his countrymen to beware of disunionism.

It is said that a citizen of Louisville has been hung at Memphis, Tenn.

The Louisville Journal accuses secessionists of taking the oath of allegiance, merely for the purpose of obtaining arms.

MATTERS IN MISSOURI. ST. LOUIS, June 13.—Troops have been sent out from St. Louis to take possession of the Southwest terminus of the Pacific Railroad; also to protect the bridges on the road; also to protect the telegraph lines.

Troops are also to be sent to Jefferson City.

Attempts are being made in St. Louis to enlist troops for the Southern army.

Mr. Barrett, brother of the late Congressman from St. Louis District, has been arrested for treason. Proofs against him are said to be strong.

The west end of the large rail-road bridge nine miles from Jefferson City was burned yesterday.

THE CHARLESTON BLOCKADE. NEW YORK, June 13.—Advices from Charleston state that the revolutionary steamer Gen. Clinch came near being captured while engaged in towing an English barque in distress into Savannah harbor.

The Minnesota, when last seen, had a schooner in tow.

ENCOUNTER AT ROMNEY, VA. CHAMBERSBURG, Pa., June 13.—Some troops from this place surprised five hundred revolutionists at Romney, Va., yesterday. They routed them after a sharp conflict. Several were killed and wounded; and the camp equipage was taken by the Pennsylvania troops.

MICHIGAN TROOPS. GRAND RAPIDS, June 13.—The Third Michigan Regiment, numbering over 1000 left this place this morning. They are equipped ready for active service.

LIEUT. GREBLE'S BODY. BALTIMORE, June 13.—Lieut. Greble's body arrived here this morning, and was immediately taken to Philadelphia.

ELECTION IN BALTIMORE. BALTIMORE, June 13.—The Congressional election is proceeding quietly. There is no disturbance so far.
