WASHINGTON, June 20.—The Henry Clay factory, owned by the Dupont Co., worked by Mr. Griffith manufacturing Government cloth, was burnt this morning. Part of the machinery was saved. Building insured. Origin of the fire unknown.

WASHINGTON, June 20.—The British schooner Tropic Wind has been decided by Judge Dunlap. The vessel and cargo are forfeited for infraction of the law of blockade. The Court however still holds under future advisement the ultimate determination of a question of fact respecting such an alleged relaxation of strict law of blockade in favor of British ships, as would have allowed the Tropic Wind to load her cargo and come out of port after having received information that the blockade had been established.

WASHINGTON, June 20.—The U. S. Cavalry are under marching orders perhaps already started. The artillery and Fire Zouaves are ordered to hold themselves in readiness.

EUROPEAN NEWS. ARRIVAL OF THE AFRICA. NEW YORK, June 20.—The steamer Africa arrived this morning: Cotton dull. Breadstuffs declining. Provisions dull. Consols 95 1/2 to 85 1/2. Money 90 1/2 to 90 1/4.

THE AFRICA has £65,000 in specie. The Syrian question is settled. The government financial measure has passed to the second reading in the English House of Lords.

IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS it was stated that the Queen's advocate had given an opinion favorable to the right of interdiction which the laws of nations gave every power—hence Government issued prohibition. Mr. Gregory's motion for the prompt recognition of the Southern Confederacy was postponed sine die.

THE U. S. GOVERNMENT has ordered 275,000 muskets from Germany. Southern commissioners are also expected in Germany on a similar errand.

CAVOUR'S DEATH is universally deplored. He was buried with great pomp. Garibaldi is reported to be seriously ill. The Pope is also said to be indisposed.

PRINCE NAPOLEON has been forbid visiting the United States. He will, however, visit Canada. Taxes are being collected in Hungary by the military.

THE CENSUS OF ENGLAND AND WALES shows a population of over 20,000,000; increase over 2,000,000 in ten years. Population of London 2,800,000. Emigration from United Kingdom in ten years 2,500,000.

THE AFRICA PASSED THE VIGO on the 11th. The Hungarian, Arago and Minna have arrived. Trade at Manchester is depressed. The weather in England is favorable for the crops.
