WASHINGTON AND SOUTHERN NEWS. The Wheeling Convention has adopted an ordinance providing for the financial department and its officers.

A resolution was recommended by the Federal authorities to construct a military road from Webster, on the Northwestern Railroad to a suitable point in Southwestern Virginia.

It was determined to transmit a copy, signed, of the Declaration of Independence to President Lincoln.

From Fortress Monroe there is a report that a large revolutionary force is advancing upon the fortress. The pickets at Little Bethel have been driven in, and considerable excitement prevailed.

A regiment of German Turners and a company of regulars had left Hampton upon a reconnaissance, and nothing had been heard of them after a six hours' absence.

Among letters captured by Gen. Lyon at Booneville, were orders for the destruction of bridges on the North Missouri, and Hannibal, St. Josephs, and Pacific Railroads, and instructions to different persons respecting the organization of troops.

A party adhering to Gov. Jackson left St. Louis on June 19 by railroad, taking what rolling stock they could, burnt some, and destroyed the costly Lamone Bridge, six miles out.
