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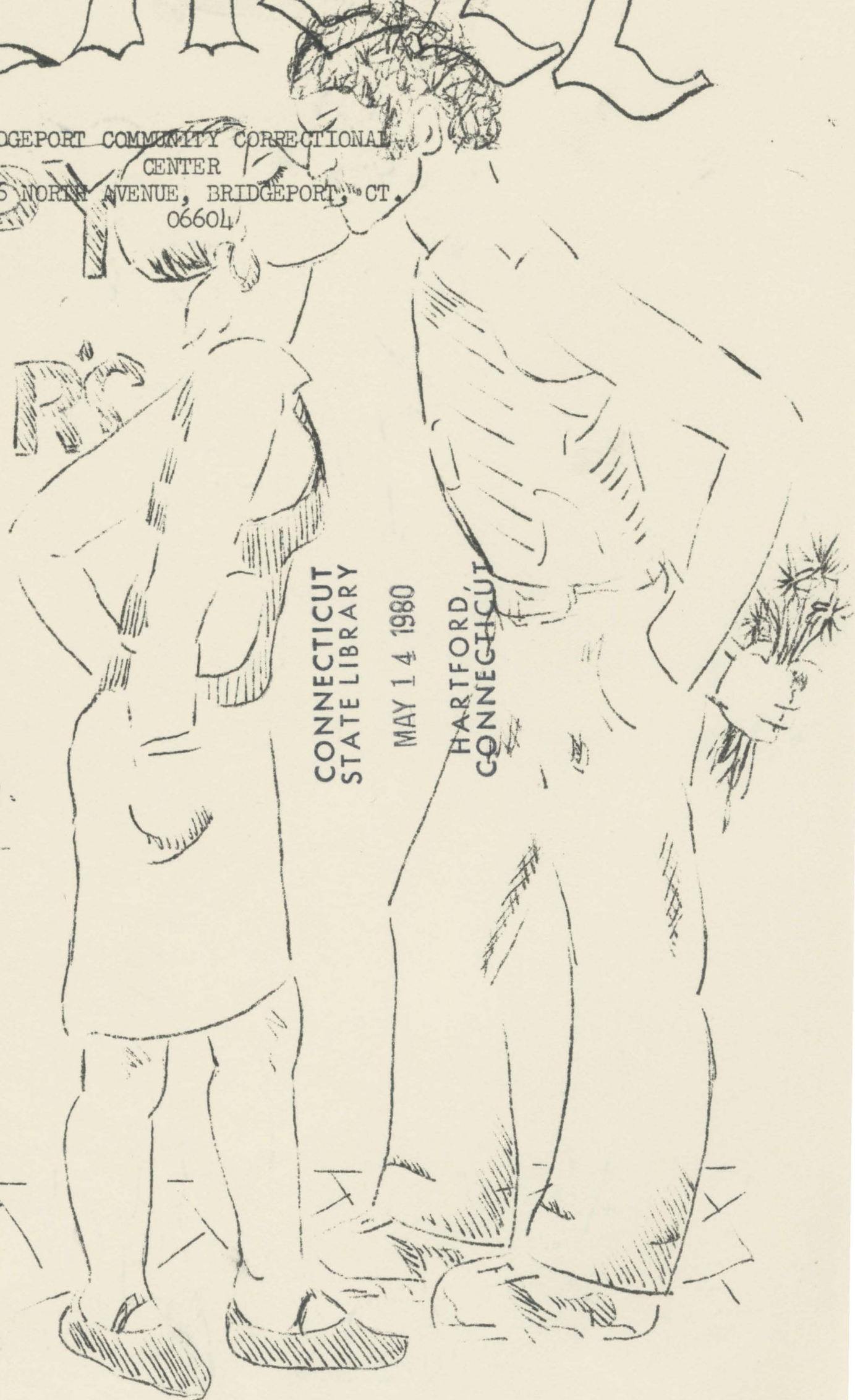
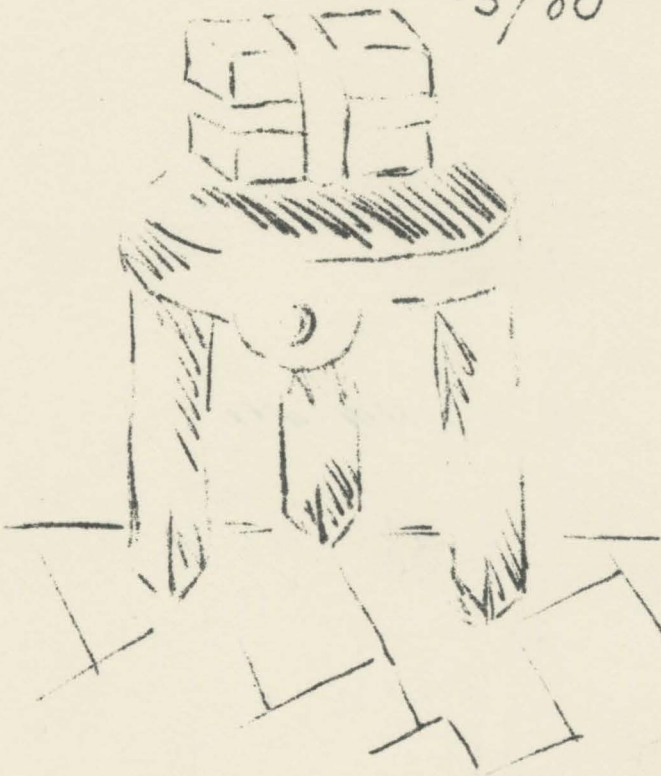

So, if you are a Bridgeport area resident, have at least an eight grade education, have no pending warrants and have a desire to identify career goals, tear off the bottom of the page, write your name and cell number and give it to a counselor or Herb or John.

His function is to assist you in presenting your version of the situation to the Disciplinary Board. He is required to assist the board in uncovering the true facts of the incident, and does not function as a "Defense Attorney". He is also a resource for you to consult if you have any questions on the nature of the charge and the appropriate penalties which could result. His responsibility to you and to the Center is to assure that proper disposition is taken in regards to the disciplinary process.

CIVIL LEGAL ASSISTANCE FOR EX-OFFENDERS

- A. Ex-Offender (Been in jail or prison or convicted of an offense and placed on probation)
- B. Low income (Qualify for legal aid)
- C. Need a lawyer (For non-criminal problems like divorce, eviction, discrimination, child support, bankruptcy, drivers license renewal, or any other civil legal matter)

If you do qualify under all three categories, you can apply for free legal service through Project Advocate of the Connecticut Prison Association. We have volunteer attorneys who will represent you on a no charge basis. The only payment you must make is for court costs and/or fees, if any.

If you think you need legal help with a civil problem, contact one of the following agencies nearest your home for an appointment.

IF ACCUSED OF AN INFRACTION RESULTING IN A DISCIPLINARY REPORT, YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO CHOOSE A STAFF ADVOCATE. HIS FUNCTION IS TO ASSIST YOU IN PRESENTING YOUR VERSION OF THE SITUATION TO THE DISCIPLINARY BOARD. HE IS REQUIRED TO ASSIST YOU AND THE BOARD BY UNCOVERING THE TRUE FACTS OF THE INCIDENT, AND DOES NOT FUNCTION AS A DEFENSE ATTORNEY. HE IS A RESOURCE FOR YOU TO CONSULT IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS ON THE NATURE OF THE CHARGE AND THE APPROPRIATE PENALTIES WHICH COULD RESULT. HIS RESPONSIBILITY TO YOU AND TO THE CENTER IS TO ASSURE THAT PROPER DISPOSITION IS CURRENTLY IN REGARD TO THE DISCIPLINARY PROCESS... THE ADVOCATES ARE:

Revolutionary Nationalism has been adopted as the ideology of an increasing number of organizations with ghetto constituencies. the Republic of new Africa and RAM have endorsed the idea of the necessity of armed struggle to achieve a separate nation. SNCC spokesmen Stokely Carmichael and H. Rap Brown have often spoken of the need for revolution to secure black liberation. Two of the most important groups espousing revolutionary nationalism, however are the Black Panthers, party borrowing its name from SNCC's Political experiment in Alabama, was formed in Oakland, California in October 1966 by Huey P. Newton and Bobby Seale. Newton was a graduate of Merritt College in Oakland, California, where he had been active in organizing black students. Seale an ex-G.I., met Newton at Merritt, together they formed the Black Panthers Party for self-Defense and wrote its initial platform and program. In 1967 Eldridge Cleaver, recently paroled from San Quentin and author of SOUL ON ICE gave the panthers the link to white left that later was to assume great importance. Although he did live in exile in Algeria since 1969, Cleaver is still listed as an editor on the staff of Ramparts. By 1969 the panthers had repudiated much of their early nationalist rhetoric and adopted a version of Marxism in which a socialist revolution to free oppressed people in the United States regardless of race took precedence over the national liberation of black America. The violent conflict between the panthers and the U.S. a west coast cultural nationalist group headed by Ron Karenga, caused the panthers to take a rigid position against cultural nationalism which cost them some black support. The misunderstanding in 1967-1968 concerning a proposed panther merger with SNCC, which resulted in bad feeling between the two groups (personified in the verbal warfare that has been going on between the two groups Eldridge Cleaver and Stokely Carmichael ever since) further limited the potential of the panthers for organizing mass support. A proposed alliance with the League of Revolutionary Black Workers has never been consummated. The panthers have been subjected to tremendous repression, both violent and legal and most of the national leadership is in jail (Bobby Seale), released on bond (Huey Newton), or in exile (Eldridge Cleaver). Local police forces were apparently given a go ahead by the national government to destroy the panthers or killed or wounded a number of them in raids on panthers offices across the country in late 1969 and early 1970. The survival of the Black panthers party as a viable political organization will depend on whether it can maintain past levels of recruitment, break off debilitating ties to the white Left, and regain its early nationalist appeal. The Panthers platform demands an end to the many ways by which black people in the United States are oppressed and cites the Declaration of Independence as sanction for carrying out an armed revolution if panthers demands are not met. The party published a weekly newspaper. The black panthers train black youth in the arts of self defense and in military discipline in a number of cities, they have instituted breakfast-for-children programs which

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MUNOZ MARIN \*\*\*\*\* FATHER OF PUERTO RICAN COMMONWEALTH DIES AT 82.

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Luis Munis Martin, the father of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico and one of the most important figures in modern Caribbean history, died early Wednesday of heart failure in San Juan. He was 82.

Doctors said Munoz Martin died in his sleep at 2:55 a. m. with his wife Inez, at his bedside. Munoz, who had a long history of heart trouble, was admitted to the private Mimiya Hospital Saturday after suffering a stroke.

Swarthy, burly and intelligent, a two-fisted campaigner and electrifying speaker known throughout Puerto Rico as "El Vate" \*\*The Bard \*\*Munoz Marin either authored or shared in virtually every event to effect his island in the 20th century.

A journalist, poet, diplomat and political theorist of the first rank, he was Puerto Rico's first elected governor and the creator and most passionate defender of commonwealth status for the island.

His theories also laid the building blocks that transformed Puerto Rico from a one-crop sugar colony to a modern industrial economy, one of the most sophisticated in Latin America.

Ironically, his pioneer work, known as "Operation Bootstraps", may have sown the seeds of its own destruction, creating a society no longer content with the successes that he helped to create. Munoz Marin's death also came at the most difficult time yet in the years that Puerto Rico has been a "Free Associated State", the not-a-state, not-a-colony status that he designated for Puerto Rico in the dark days of World War II. The Commonwealth, and the Popular Democratic Party that he founded to promote it, is facing an uphill electoral battle in 1980 against the island's pro-statehood government.

Munoz Marin was born in 1898, three days after the battleship Maine was blown up in Havana harbor, triggering the Spanish-American war that eventually put Puerto Rico under the American flag. If his birthday was prophetic, so to were his antecedents. His father, Luis Munoz Rivera, was the most important Puerto Rican political figure of his generation, an advocate of independence from Spain, and after the war, greater self-rule under the U.S. flag.

Munoz ~~Rivera~~ Marin studied at Georgetown University and after his father died in 1916 went to Greenwich Village, where he wrote articles for magazines and poetry in Spanish and English. He returned to Puerto Rico in 1926 and took over his father's pro-independence newspaper, La Democracia. He entered politics scoring heavily with his slogan, "bread, land and liberty."

It was at this time that he developed his awesome campaign style, traversing the island on ballyhooed non-stop handshaking and baby-kissing tours that even today are obligatory for any candidate who expects to win an election in Puerto Rico.

In the 1930's, Munoz Marin became convinced that the island was more in need of economic development than total independence, and he began to think of ways to create a Puerto Rican national identity without losing the benefits of close association with the United States. That stand became Munoz Marin's platform when he formed the Popular Democratic Party in 1938. He was elected to the Senate in 1940 and for seven years served as president of that body, the highest elective office in the colony.

It was during World War II that he developed the idea of a commonwealth status for Puerto Rico, in which the islanders would elect their own governor and pay their own taxes, while still holding U.S. citizenship and serving in the U.S. armed forces.

In developing the theory, which served as the political basis for transforming Puerto Rico from an agricultural backwater into an industrial society in 20 years, Munoz Marin enjoyed the active support and guidance of Roosevelt New Dealer Rexford Tugwell, a college professor sent to the island by President Roosevelt as its wartime director, governor. Gubernatorial elections came for

the first time in 1948 and Munoz Marin won in a land slide. The commonwealth was created in 1952 as Munoz Marin began his second term. He was reelected in 1956 and 1960, finally stepping down in 1964.

During the 1950s, Munoz Marin shifted his focus from politics to economics, launching "Jalda Arriba!"----literally "Uphill!"---but translated into English as "Operation Bootstrap".

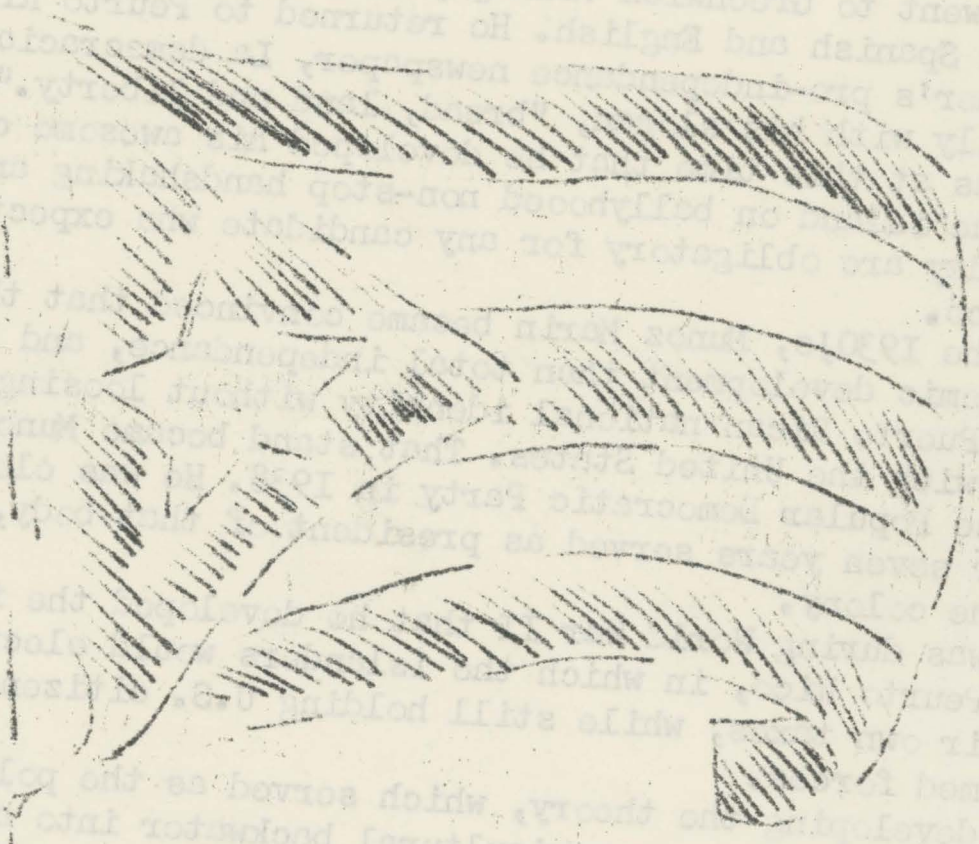
"We must live like the angels and work like the devil" was Munoz Marin's slogan for "Bootstrap, an economic revolution and industrialization program encouraged by tax exemptions and other government incentives.

"Bootstrap" brought prosperity and an industrial economy with a per capita income of \$2,959, currently the highest in Latin American, but after 20 years it also brought distortions.

Agriculture vitually was wiped out, unemployment was widespread and thousands went on welfare. The island became more and more dependent on the United States for basic goods.

Wages were held down to encourage mainland firms to settle in Puerto Rico.

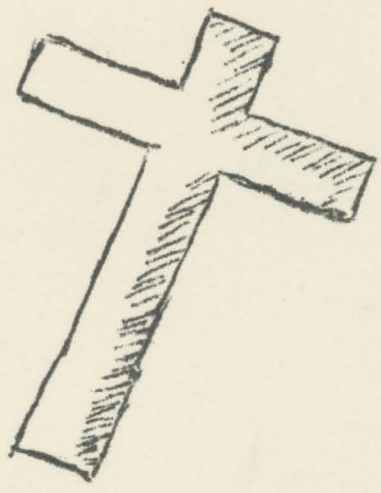

### LAW LIBRARY

IF YOU WISH TO USE THE LAW LIBRARY-FILL OUT A COUNSELOR REQUEST SLIP ASKING YOUR COUNSELOR FOR PERMISSION TO USE THE LAW LIBRARY.

WHEN UTILIZING THE LAW LIBRARY, PLEASE BEAR IN MIND THAT THESE ARE YOUR LAW BOOKS AND MATERIALS, AND IT IS UP TO ALL CONCERNED TO CARE FOR THE MATERIALS THERE. IN THE PAST THESE MATERIALS HAVE BEEN TORN, MUTILATED AND STOLEN.

WHEN YOU USE BOOKS OR OTHER MATERIALS FROM THE LAW LIBRARY-PLEASE RETURN THEM AS YOU FOUND THEM-ANOTHER INMATE MAY NEED THEM TO ASSIST WITH HIS LEGAL WORK ON HIS CASE. IT CANNOT BE STRESSED ENOUGH HOW IMPORTANT THESE MATERIALS ARE TO THOSE WHO SEEK LEGAL ASSISTANCE.

SENTENCED MEN WILL BE CALLED OVER THE PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM TO COME TO THE LAW LIBRARY WHICH IS LOCATED IN THE SCHOOL BUILDING-OR A PASS WILL BE ISSUED TO THE PERSON REQUESTING USE OF THE LAW LIBRARY. THIS PROCEDURE WILL APPLY TO ALL THOSE WHO RESIDE IN THE EAST WING. PRE-TRIAL MEN WILL BE CALLED TO THE COUNSELING AREA WHERE THE LAW LIBRARY IS LOCATED.

AS FAR AS IS POSSIBLE, YOU WILL BE ALLOWED WHATEVER TIME YOU NEED WITHIN THE ESTABLISHED INSTITUTIONAL SCHEDULE.

MATERIALS IN THE LAW LIBRARY MAY NOT BE BORROWED UNLESS SPECIAL PERMISSION HAS BEEN GRANTED. ANYONE FOUND WITH, OR HAVING MATERIALS THAT WERE REMOVED FROM THE LAW LIBRARY WITHOUT SPECIAL PERMISSION, IS AND WILL BE SUBJECT TO A DISCIPLINARY REPORT.

IF YOU WISH TO BORROW REFERENCE MATERIALS OTHER THAN LAW LIBRARY MATERIALS, YOU SHOULD MAKE OUT YOUR REQUEST TO THE LIBRARIAN WHO WILL SIGN THE MATERIALS OUT FOR YOU.
