PRINCIPLES OF LEARNING

Learning is a key process, some would say the key process, in human behavior; it prevades everything we do and think. In one way or another, it influences the language we speak, our customs, our attitudes and beliefs, our goals, our personality traits, both adaptive and maladaptive, and even our perceptions.

Consider the changes that take place in a child's behavior during his first years of life. During this period he is molded, or socialized, to become a functioning member of his society. To be able to do this in any culture, he must learn a staggering number of things. These include learning appropriate ways of interacting with people, learning appropriate ways of eating and eliminating waste, learning to avoid potentially dangerous situations, learning to think somewhat logically and realistically, learning the values and customs of his group, learning to perceive the world as others perceive it, and learning the many distinctive responses and adjustments that make him different from other people. It is a wonder that he does the learning that he does; it testifies to the plasticity of the human mind.

Next week I will tell you of the importance of learning, and the definition of learning, also of arousal and motivation, and classical conditioning. It may help you to understand why things are the way they are.....

IDEAS OFFERED ON PRISON SPACE

A task force studying prison overcrowding in Conn., has recommended a combination of efforts, including finding more prison beds and reforming bail procedures, to alleviate prison overcrowding in Connecticut. In its report released recently, the task force recommended that the state Correction Department begin a search for an existing facility that can be converted to a prison to provide 500 medium-security beds by the end of the year. In addition, the task force suggested establishment of a pretrial release program based on granting the least restrictive condition of the release necessary to ensure the accused's appearance in court. That would result in freeing about 400 beds. The state six jails and four prisons currently hold about 800 more inmates than they were designed for. If nothing is done, the state would have 3,000 more inmates the prison beds by 1985, said Carbone, executive director of the Conn. justice Commission. Reasons for the increase include more incidents of violent crime and longer sentences being handed out by judges, which is a reflection of the "general attitude on the part of the public about crime."

The task force, became embroiled in controversy after it recommended in its first draft report earlier this winter that Laurel Heights Hospital be converted to a prison. The task force asked to be allowed to continue to work toward long-term solutions to the overcrowding problem, Gov. Bill O'Neill has agreed.

Mrs. Grace Davis, who has spent a lot of time during the past several months patrolling the streets late at night chasing wayward kids home, admits sadly that "Atlanta had a problem." But the divorced mother of three (and founder of Women Against Crime) quickly adds, "we're not giving up." Never in the history of the city some call "Martin's (Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.) Town a mecca of Black political power and institutions of higher learning, has a heinous crime wave generated more worldwide concern and speculation of the wildest kind, than the case of the missing and murdered Black children.

Others involved and interested in the series of murders, which the Black controlled Atlanta Police Dept. insists on having jurisdiction - in spite of the participation of other metro-area officers - are trying to minimize the negative rhetoric critical of the small amount of information release publicly about the investigation.

Mayor Jackson and Public Safety Commissioner Lee Brown (who is also Black) contend it's unwise to reveal everything about the investigation for the benefit of the killer or killers. "We made the decision a long time ago to run the risk of criticism from high and low rather than compromise the integrity of this investigation," Jackson said at an ecumenical service given by the clergy of Atlanta.

Bed-wetting, tense nerves, aggressive behavior, and a fear of adults are among the myriad of problems Atlanta's children are experiencing - a torturous existence evolving from the ever-growing number of deaths of their relatives, neighbors and schoolmates. "It's not a tiny percentage of students who are evidencing these symptoms. It's a significant number of children," says Nancy Emmons, psychologist for the Atlanta Public School System. "We're seeing children who don't even want to go onto the playground at recess. We have our hands full," she adds.

School Superintendent Dr. Alonzo Crim is another who projects a concerned and cautious, but less alarming tone when relating the serious ramifications of the crisis and what the school system is doing to aid police, the children and parents.

"I think the problem is with the adults. The children are doing fine," Crim told Jet. "We're providing overall security for the school children and making certain police know when they will be out after curfew hours. There are also mental health programs for staff and students so they can develop a constructive fear, rather than hysteria, so they can perform in a regular and normal manner."

The cost for paying for this special investigation has drained the regular budget and has made it necessary to establish a special fund to underwrite extra expenses. A sellout benefit performance by Sammy Davis Jr. and Frank Sinatra on March 10 of this year grossed \$148,000 to give the fund a big boost. Money has also been coming in from donations received from all over the nation.

News of the killings has spread all over the world resulting and offers to help that has been astounding. "It's wonderful the way people have responded, it lets you know they really do care," Mrs. Willie Mae Mathis (now the mother of six children), whose 10-year-old son Jeffery Lamar was found slain February 13, 1981, 11 months after he was last seen alive.

"This Tragedy has brought people together, Black and White, like never before," noted Mayor Jackson. Mrs. Mathis, like many of the grieving mothers, feels the victims were lured into captivity by someone they trusted, such as a person dressed in the uniform of a law enforcement officer. Investigation in the special task force apparently are not overlooking this possibility since they have been checking the records and backgrounds of former policemen, deputied, security guards and applicants who were rejected for such jobs. "Mothers have a certain sense of intuition about things like this," says Rev. Earl Carroll, who teamed with Mrs. Camille Bell, whose nine-year-old son Yusef was found slain November 8, 1979, to organize the Committee to Stop Children's Murder. They have no way of knowing the nightmare they triggered in May, 1979, when they warned police that the three kids found dead at that time was no coincidence. By March 5, 1980 the toll soared to 20 slain and another missing since September 14, 1980.

"This is all a conspiracy to discredit Mayor Jackson and his administration so that nobody will have confidence in Black leadership," according to Carroll, who himself has become a target of police surveillance. Additional support and inspiration during the crisis has come from the religious community, its spokespersons, and student groups by way of prayer services, marches and rallies similar to those that have been conducted throughout the country.

"We must look to God for the solution," says Mrs. Shirley Harris, vice president of a local alternate education program, who organized a 24-hour prayer vigil for the Atlanta NAACP. "The lesson here is to recognize that prayer to God is the most economical and powerful tool to deal with this situation," Mrs. Harris said.

GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENT - NEW CENTER

EFFECTIVE Monday, March 2nd, sick call and distribution of medication be changed. If you want to see the doctor, nurse, psychiatrist or dentist, fill out a counselor's request slip. Include on it your name, cell number and a description of your medical or dental problem. Be specific. Place the request in the box opposite the officer's cubicle marked "medical request"

The request slip's will be collected daily by the medical staff. Sick call will be held in the hospital when the nurse or medical staff calls you in.

All requests will receive a response. The medic will tour the block areas to dispense medication only on the 12-3 shift. If you are prescribed medication which is to be given, you will receive a medication pass from the hospital which will be kept by the officer on your block.

When your block is called for medication distribution, you will be required to pick up your medication pass from the officer on the way back to your cell or dayroom.

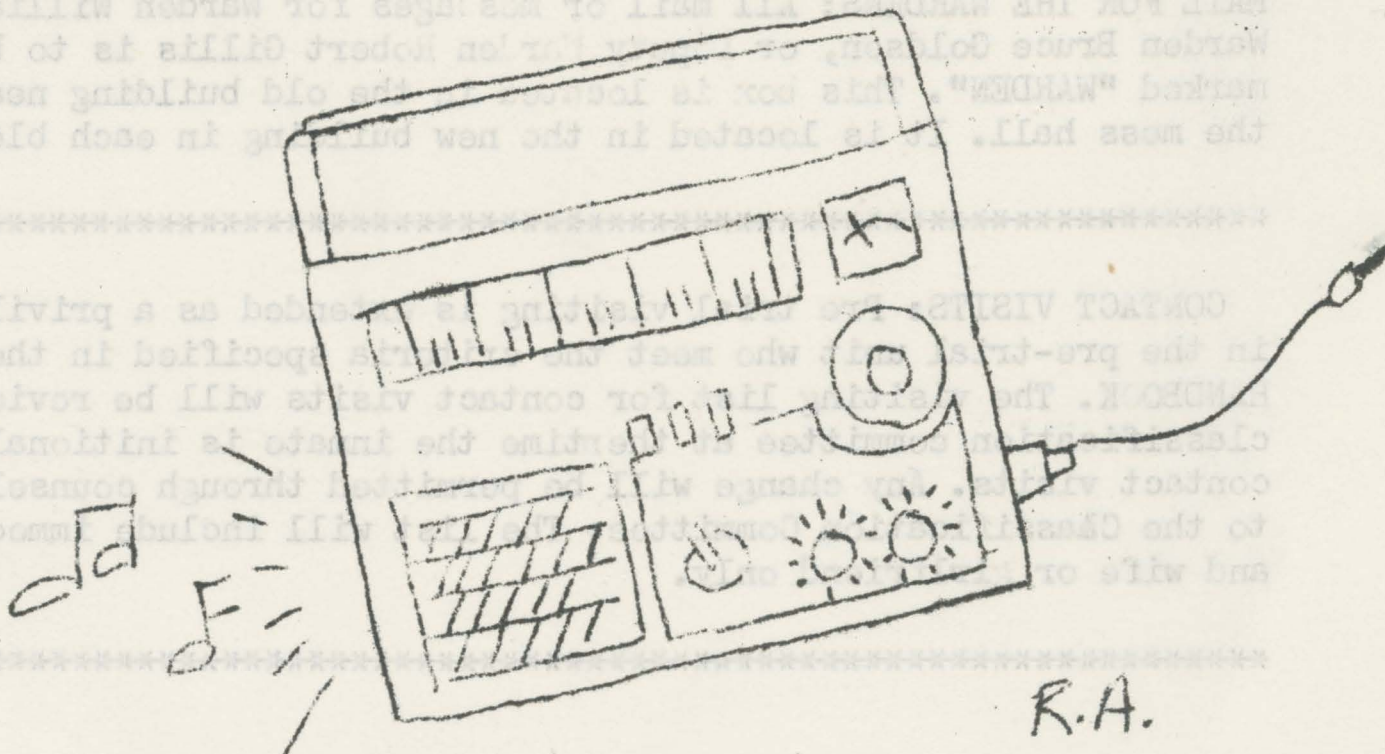

OFFICIAL NOTICE TO ALL INMATES

LEGAL ASSISTANCE TO PRISONER: Free legal to all inmates is provided through all connecticut centers by an organisation called legal assistance to prisoners, (L.A.P.) Attorney Randy Mozzy from L.A.P. visits our institution once a week to help the inmates with their civil and legal problems.-L.A.P. cannot help with criminal cases. these must go to the public defenders office or to a private attorney. You, can contact Atty. randy Mozzy by writing to her at the L.A.P. office address: 340 Capital Ave. Hartford, CT. 06115.

CO-OP Services: Multi-service Center is an agency that serves those offenders in the greater Bridgeport area. The service provides through staff or referral, counseling, clothing and housing, employment referrals, and educational counseling. CO-OP deals with men and women prssently incarcerated or recently released from a correctional center. They bridge the gap between ex-offenders immediate needs and the communities resourses. The goal of CO-OP is to help ex-offenders to help themselves. For more information contact your counselor.

II P.M. COUNT: This concerns all cast wing inmates. Immediately following the II PM. count, all inmates are expected to stay in their cells and remain there, the entire evening. The only exception will be going to or coming from the lavatory, or to inform an officer of something. Any inmate found outside his cell, loitering, talking loud, etc, will be subject to immediate diciplinary action.

MAIL FOR THE WARDENS: All mail or messages for Warden William Tuthill, Warden Bruce Goldson, or Deputy Warden Robert Gillis is to be placed in the box marked "WARDEN". This box is located in the old building near the entrance to the mess hall. It is located in the new building in each block.

CONTACT VISITS: Pre trial visiting is extended as a privilage to inmates in the pre-trial unit who meet the criteria specified in the NEW INMATE HANDBOOK. The visiting list for contact visits will be reviewed by the classification committee at thentime the inmate is initionally cleared for contact visits. Any change will be permitted through counselor referral to the Cclassification Committee. The list will include immediate family and wife or girlfriend only.

The bridgeport correctional center has library facilities available for both sentenced and pre-trial areas. If you wish to make the library has to offer please follow the procedures established to insure easier distribution of book.

The collection of paperback available from the library have been donated to the center by Rev. Smith, Rev. Frank. Denton and Father Como. also credit should be given to Darien book aid, an organization which makes reading materials available to state institutions without cost to inmates. We here at the institution are grateful for their un-ending donations and concern.

If you wish to borrow books look for the library cart which circulates throughout the institution frequently on a weekly basis. You may borrow as many paper backs as you want, within reason we ask your cooperation in returning these books when you are finished reading them or give them to another inmate so that as many books as possible will be available and in circulation.

If you wish to borrow reference material other than law library materials you should make your request to the librarian who will sign you the materials out to you. The materials must be return in one week to make them available to others. Periodically a list of reference materials maintained in the library will be published in the (Scroll).

Inter-library loan privileges which enable inmates to have access to publications housed in libraries through-out the state are available under the inter-library loan services which is provided by the State of Connecticut library.

If you wish to subscribe to or purchase a book, publication, periodically newspaper ect... fill out a request slip to your counselor on the request slip put your name and the title of the publication or book you wish to order you must follow this step in order for the counselor to determine whether the publication you wish to order is approved to enter the institution this step will save you time and effort in ordering and paying for a publication only to find that it has been returned to the publisher.

Books which we do not have in stock can be obtained by Inter-library loan services by request to the school (Only)

Anyone found with or having materials that were removed from the law library without permission will be subject to a disciplinary report. 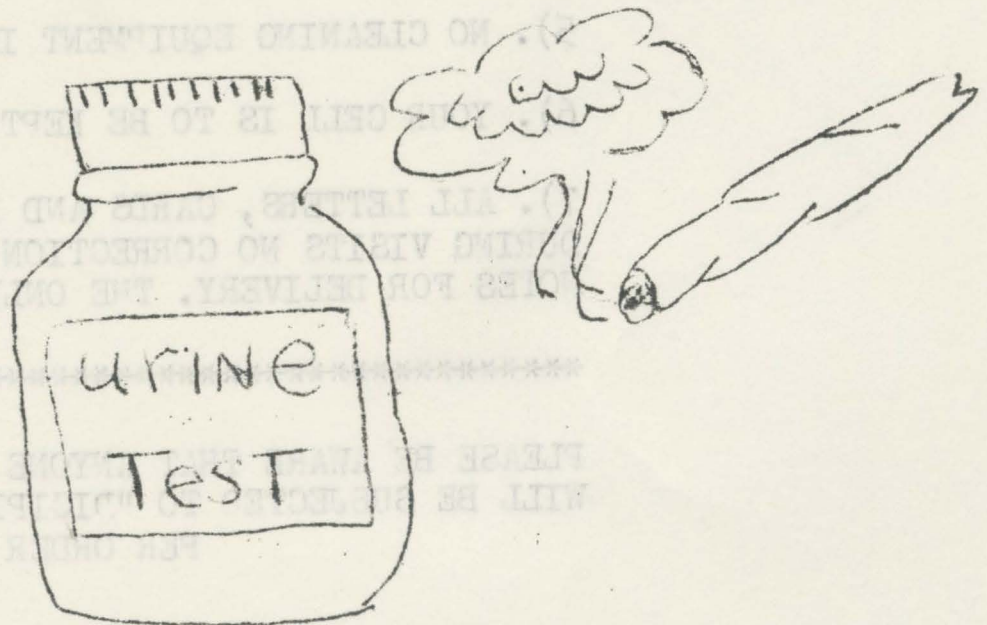
