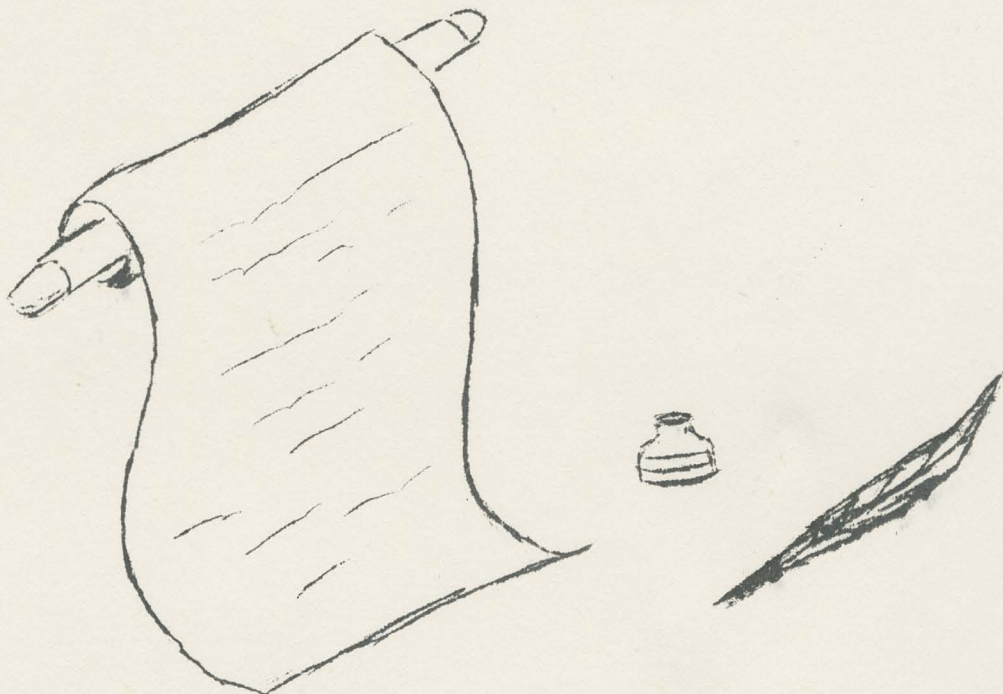

Adjustment... very hard for a man or woman the first time around.
Humiliation... is your first contact... stripped of your freedom...
one cannot explain what it means to be locked behind bars. To lose
your identity and become a number... 22948... become a slave using
only your last name, if that. A-6... 4 x 8 cell... room only for a
bed... maybe a table jammed in... lose your clothes... become the
same as all others. No longer dealt with as an individual... inmate
population. Administrations main concern is security and control...
Forget rehabilitation... that's a joke that is no longer funny...

Now you must adjust to all the bull___! Guards with inferiority
complexes... needing to exert themselves to feed into there ego!! To
somehow feed their hunger for power. Not being able to express your
feelings about the situation. Not being able to say or do anything
for fear of the administrations response. Yeah... jail is hell...
Repress... that's your ticket to the street. No matter how it may
affect you in the future. Doctors tell you that to hold in emotionally
is dangerous. Why... don't we as inmates.. convicts.. or whatever you
are today! ... have any avenue for release? There is nowhere for a
man to go to release his aggression. For those who can channel that
energy, adjustment will come without to much problems. But for the
man who can't... adjustment is hell... he suffers because he either
attacks himself,, his fellow inmates or worst still guards.. counselors
and sometimes even a warden. Usually the man who makes policy is pro-
tected in his office on the outside. Office doors... prison bars...
protect him from any hostility that may exist.. yeah... adjustment is
hell!!!

Humiliation... they strip-search you upon admission... look up
your as h... Humilation, yeah...jail is hell. Given a number...

hell-hole for a cell... Thrown into the "lion's den" with all sorts of criminals... rapist... killer's.... robber's... no matter that you were arrested for cashing a bad check. Half of the population belongs in an institution for the criminally insane. But for a better place to put them they throw them in jail. Humiliation... yeah, jail is hell. A scar is left permanantly... there is no human being on God's earth that can live through this hell and not be nsgatively affected. The scar will be there for the world to see for the rest of his life.

Adjustment came hard for me.. I was first incarcerated in Chesire RE-formatory for 2-5 years.. Fifteen months... first five months was hell. Ten misconduct reports in three months. Three visits to solitary confinement, "the hole" as we know it. Eight..sixteen and thirty days. Before I realize it I had lost 10 months good-time. Time that I hadn't even earn. Yeah... adjustment was hell. Bull___ reports... fighting unnecessary, wasteing food, talking cell to cell... petty stuff that could have been avoided. But at last... something happen to me that don't often happen until it's to late. One night while I was sitting in my cell, the thought came to me; "what is your main objection right now?" The answer of course was getting out as soon as possible. The next question I asked myself was, "what do you do to accomplish this?" This question had to be thought out carefully. It took me awhile.. but while I was trying to figure out what to do I started to grow. I started to become a man and be responsible for my actions. All this aggression I was putting out negatively had to be channeled in a positive direction. As I grew I learn to do this. I started to exert myself at the job I was assigned to (marker shop). I started thinking before I made any moves. I went the last 12 months without a misconduct report. Guards started to over-look little things that in the past they would have busted me for. I was adjusting... keeping my nose clean. One thing you have to watchout for. (continued on next page)

Becoming institutionalize... Not being able to re-adjust to life on the outside. We can deal with that at another time. Right now I'm dealing with adjusting to prison life.

Later I would go to prison.. three times... but that is my problem. I was able to adjust to the prison... but staying away from drugs was another thing. WE can also deal with this later. Whatever your problem.. whatever is on your mind.. we can deal with it

CASE #1: Greg A. came to me the other day with a serious problem. The brother was due for release on Wednesday. Re-entry furlough papers were filled out his people was notified and because of poor communication between staff members Greg A. was not allowed to go home on time. Sure waiting one day may not seem like to much to ask, but when you are prepare mentally for leaving...

24 hours can be an eternity. Not only was this poor communication- this was a matter where the staff showed that they just don't care about an inmate. They refuse to see you as a human being in trouble; a person in dire need of some help. Because of the staff's attitude Greg A. didn't go home on time, My advice to Greg was that he should talk to someone immediately. See someone a step higher then the counselor that he was dealing with. Create some concern for yourself. They don't care about you so you have to create your own interest. Make someone do something by mental action not physical... that can only lead to trouble for yourself and you will never get out of here.

What I as an inmate, excon...con... but first and foremost an individual; would like to do is help you adjust. Do what I can to make life in this institution bearable. Show you how you can adjust and get intouch with yourself. Any problems that you may have can be address to Charles Smith % The Scrool. There is a mailbx in every block. AYATOLLAH'S ADDICTS

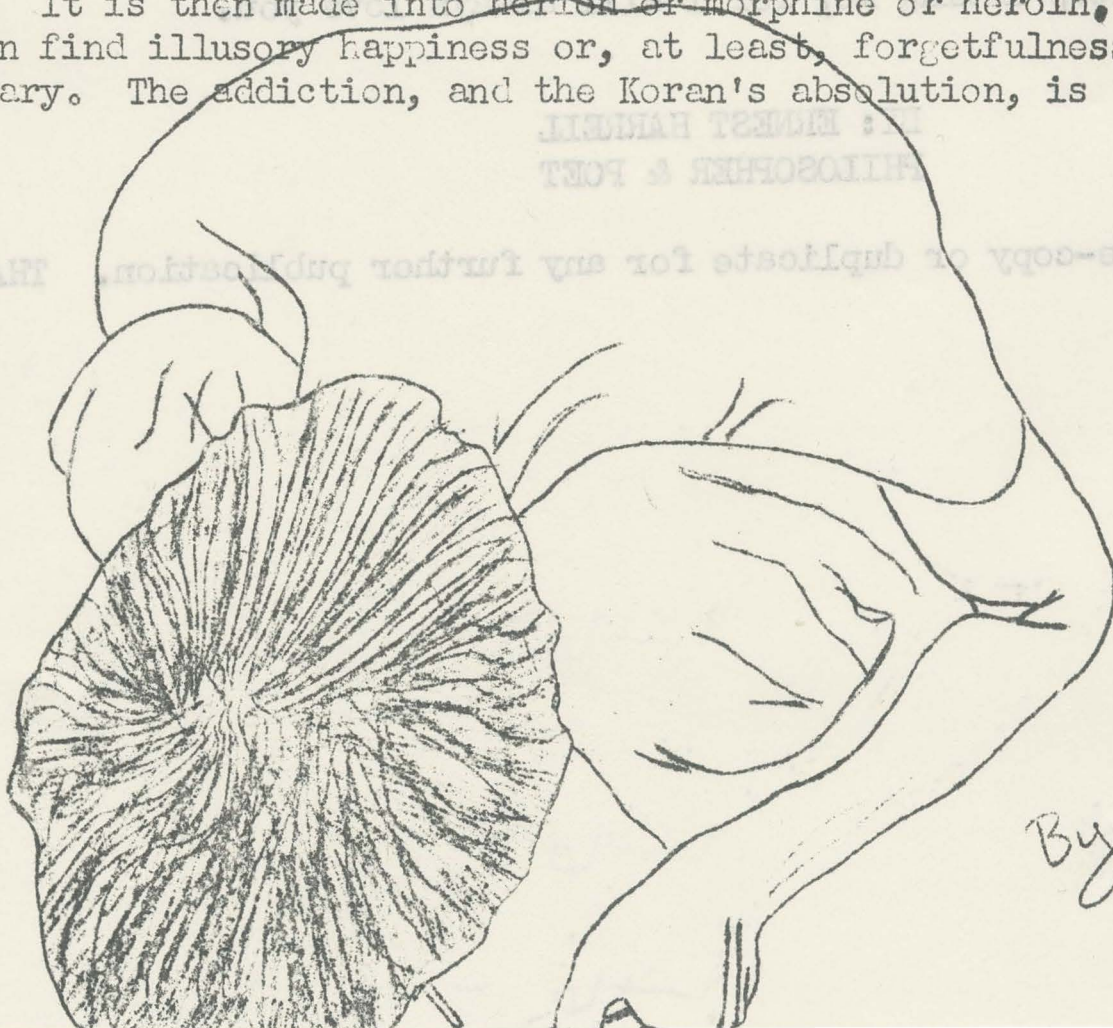
"It is a sin to drink wine or any other drink that induces drunkenness," the Koran says. "It is not a sin to use opium or hashish, even in liquid form." Therefore, the 300,000 drug addicts of Teheran measure out the days of their desperate lives comforted by a partial religious absolution.

The Ayatollah's addicts and the drug dealers are confined to a small overcrowded city-within-a-city in a section of the Iranian capital called the South Bazaar. There, among the disenfranchised, the outcasts, the desitute, the desire for death is often stronger than the will to live. Their condition is an inheritance from the departed Shah. But the benefits of the Islamic revolution have not yet touched them. And though the Koran pardons the addicts and gives hope to the oppressed, most of those who exist in South Bazaar have little hope left.

Hundreds of dealers - it was alleged that they were supplied by higher-ups in the Shah's administration - from all over the Middle East furnish the addicts with their deadly needs. In the red light districts, young girls are offered for a few dollars for whatever sexual pleasure a man might desire. This in the face of the Khomeini regime's attempt to wipe out vice in the name of Islam, wherever it is found. Malefactors are immediately tried and harshly punished; sometimes the sentence is death, with no appeal. But the addicts and their parasitic suppliers are exempt from punishment; the Koran tells them so - or is it the recognition by the regime that the uncontrollable cannot be controlled?

Entering South Bazaar, observing and photographing, was difficult, accomplished quickly. Then - out even more quickly.

The late French author Albert Camus wrote "The sign of youth is a wonderful facility for being happy." But to the young here, youth never existed. And the "happiness" produced by a drug is an illusion. With their bodies deformed, their minds twisted and their eyes dead, they are scarcely recognizable as the young. Transformed by their slow but certain suicide, their youth has already become a ghost of their near-dead bodies. The raw material for the drugs, opium, comes from Iraq and Turkey. It is then made into heroin or morphine or heroin. With it, they can find illusory happiness or, at least, forgetfulness. But it is temporary. The addiction, and the Koran's absolution, is permanent.



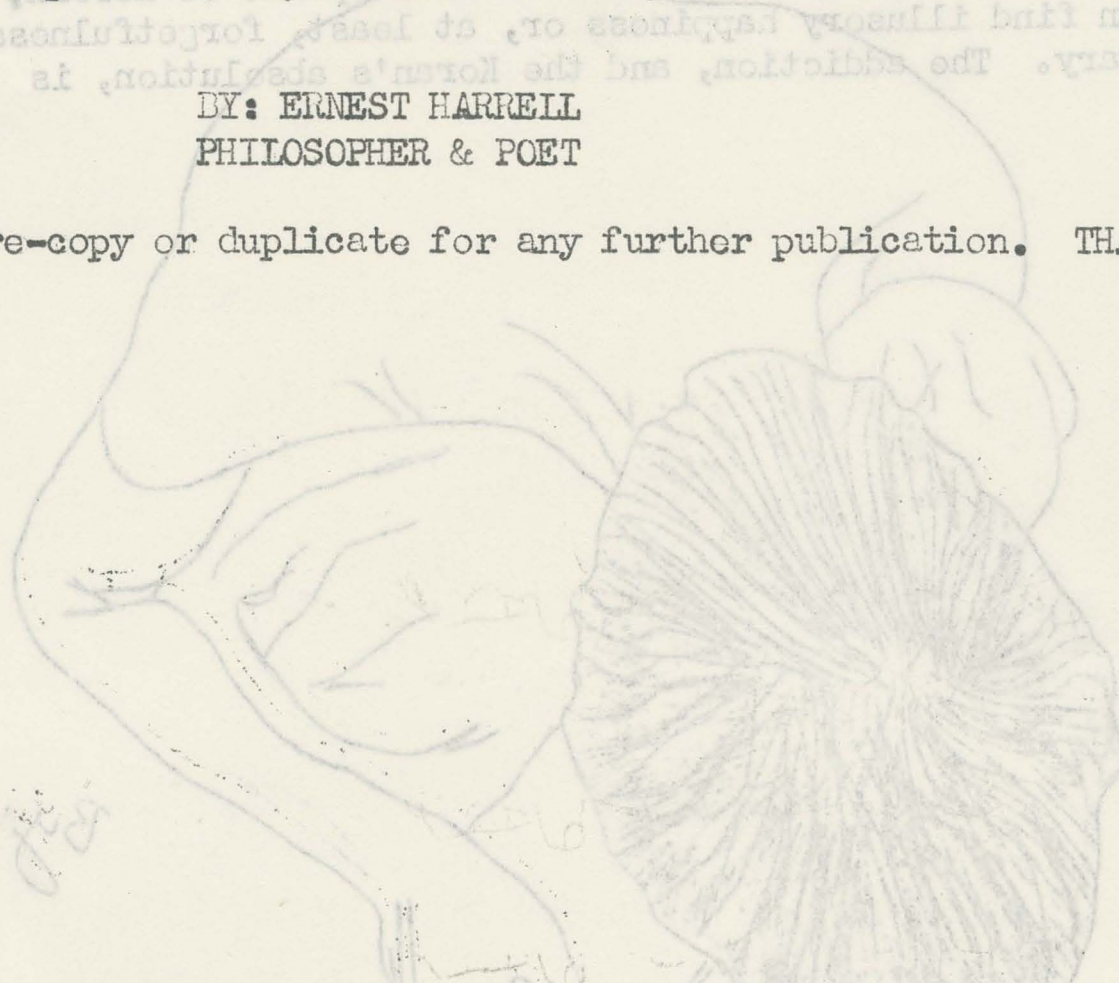

My name is Sheila. My friends call me WILD STRAWBERRY.

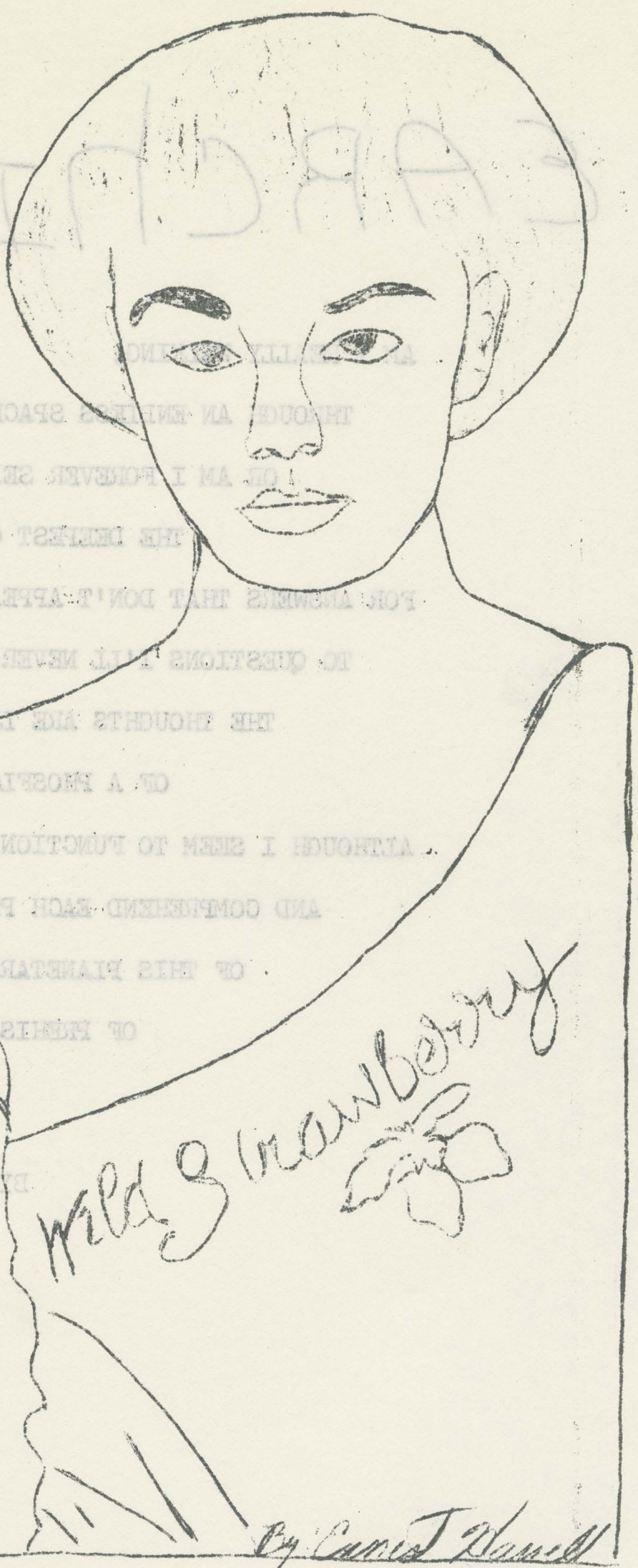
I would like to take a minute and talk to you readers out there.

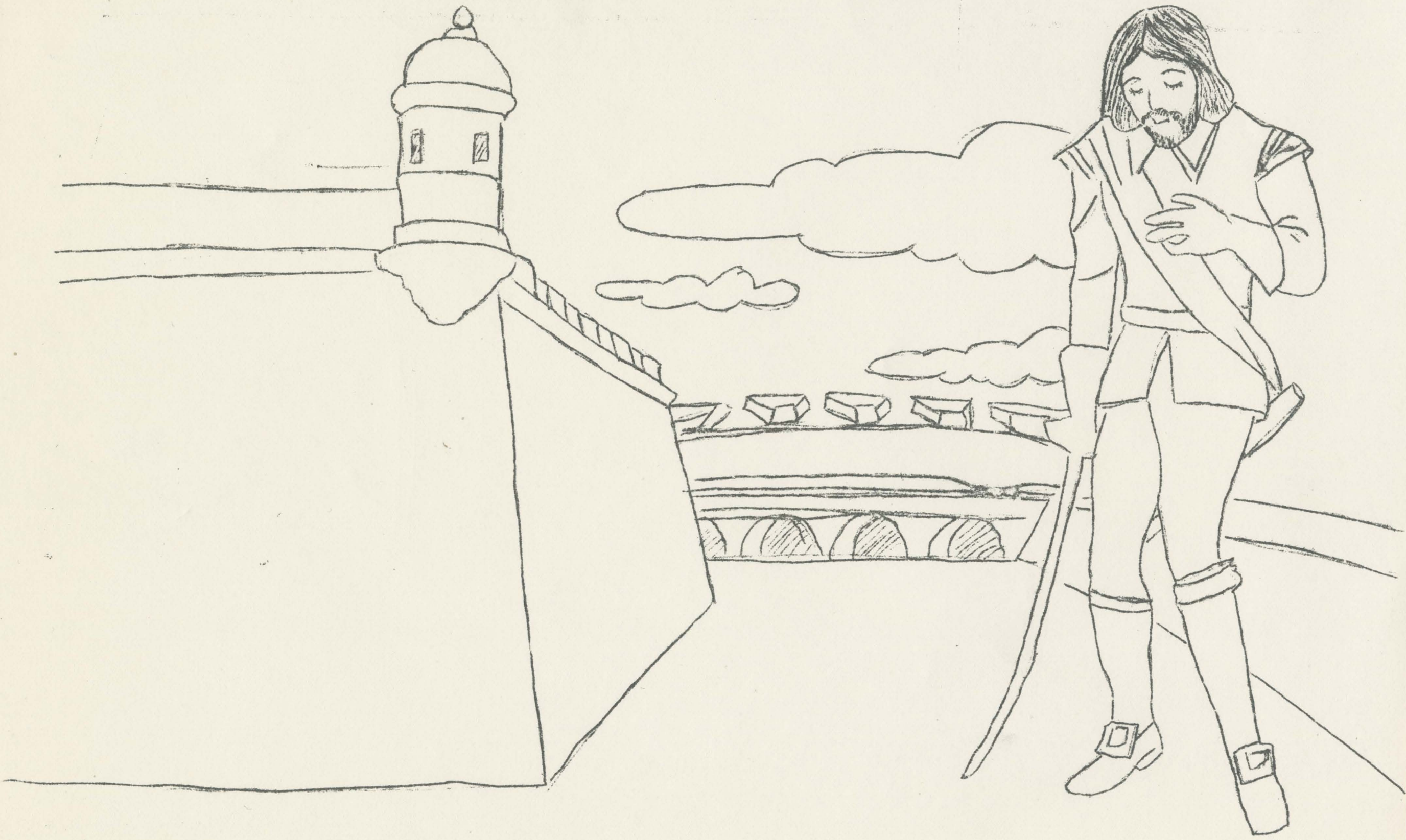
