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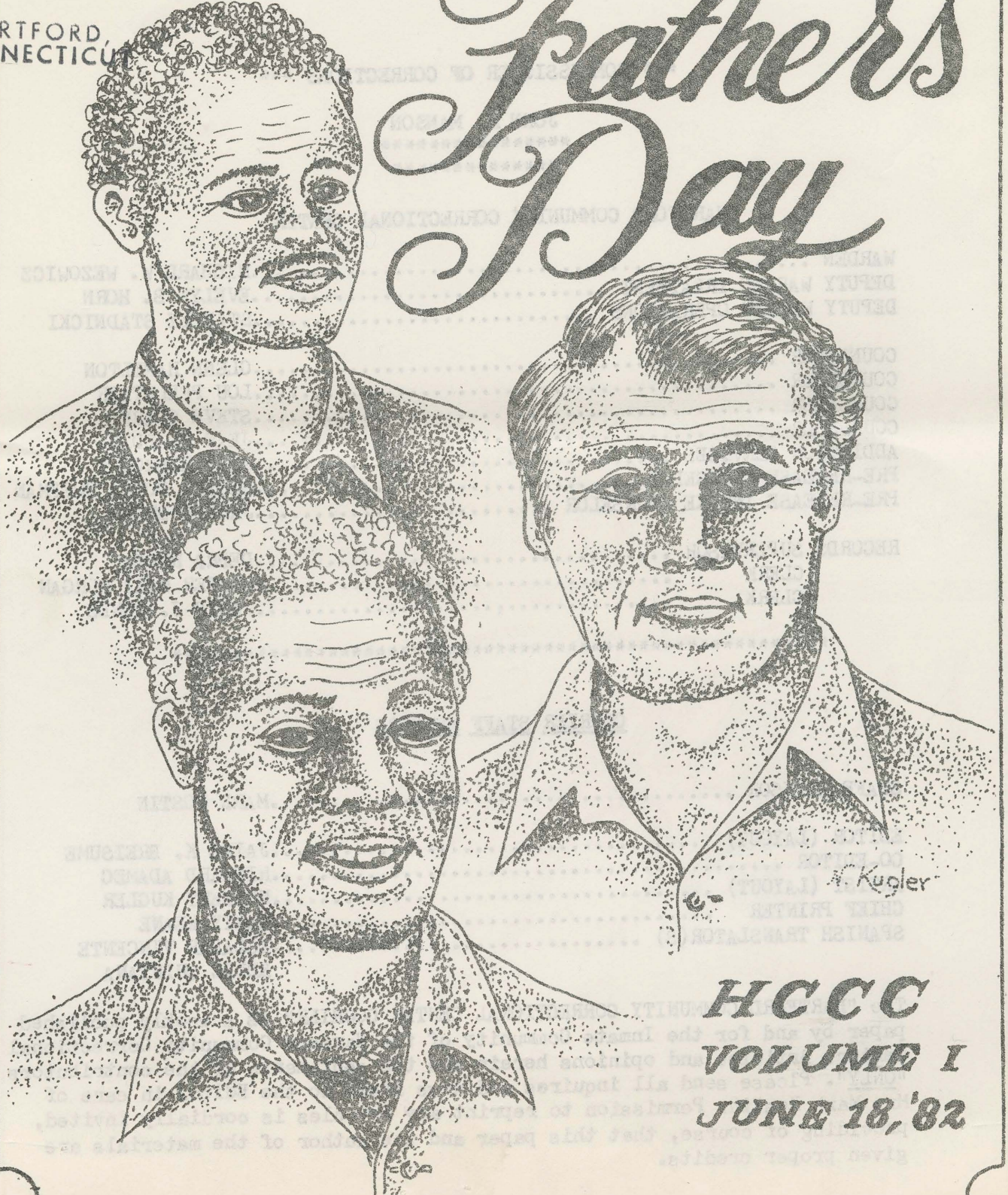

# Reglas del CMB, Para pelea Por Campeonato Mundial

FROM: "GUANTES"-CONT.

XIII-11 - Excepto en el ultimo round, la campana no salvara al boxeador que haya sido derribado limplamente. Si al terminar un round un boxeador es derribado por un golpe limpio, el referee continuara el conteo, y declarara a dicho boxeador perdedo por nocaut si no se pone de pie sin asistencia antes del conteo de 10 segundos. En el instante preciso en que el boxeador se ponga de pie, el cronometrista sonara la campana para indicar el fin del round.

XIII-12 - Los guantes seran de 6 a 8 onzas hasta el peso welter, y de no menos de 8 ni mas de 10 onzas en los pesos superiores, en la inteligencia de que el peso de los guantes debiera estar de acuerdo a las reglas de la comision de boxeo local y no debiera estar en violacion de obligacion contractual alguna relativa a la pelea y que sea consistente con dichos reglamentos del CMB. Los guantes requeriran la aprobacion de la comision local y del CMB.

XIII-13 - Los vendales se pondran en los vestidos, bajo la supervision de la comision local y de un segundo del boxeador contrincante.

A menos que se convenga en lo contrario los vendajes seran de crepe o gasa y no seran de mas de 5 metros de largo y 5 centimetros de ancho para cada mano. La cinta adhesiva debiera ser de 1 metro de largo y 2.50cms. de ancho para cada mano, no en los nudillos, que solo podran estar protegidos por los vendajes. Se prohiebe el uso de agua, ptro liquido o material alguna en los vendajes.

Puesto que a veces los materiales permitidos para vendaje y la cinta adhesiva son insuficientes para optima proteccion de las manos de los boxeadores, ambos boxeadores podran convenir en metodos alternativos de vendaje bajo la estricia supervision y con la aprobacion de la comision final respecto a todo vendaje alternativo de dicha naturaleza.

XIII-14 - Esta absolutamente prohibido que un boxeador beda liquido alguno excepto agua durante una pelea; y cualquier uso de drogas, estimulantes, etc., durante o antes de la pelea, sera causa suficiente para descalificacion del boxeador. Las pruebas para deteccion de drogas seran obligatorias en toda pelea por titulo mundial certificada por el CMB. Cuando en la localidad de una pelea por titulo no existan instalaciones para pruebas de deteccion de drogas, se utilizara alguna ciudad cercana. Si no se dispone de laboratorio, el CMB instruira a un medico neutral a que supervise y tome las muestras para pruebas de deteccion de drogas. Dos botellas con muestras de orina de cada uno de los boxeadores, deben ser obtenidas.

XIII-15 - Solo vaselina, utilizada segun el criterio del referee y ninguna otra sustancia, se permitira en el rostro, los brazos u otra parte del cuerpo de un boxeador durante una pelea. Durante una pelea no se podra administrar sales aromaticas, amoniaco ni otra sustancia alguna, ya sea para revivir a un boxeador o por cualquier otro motivo. En caso de un corte, solo se podra utilizar en la esquina para reparario, una solucion de adrenalina al 1/1000. Los receptaculos de la solucion de adrenalina al 1/1000 y de agua seran provistos a los esquineros por el medico local, o se-

ran llevados a las esquinas por los esquineros bajo estricta supervisión del CMB o la comisión local y no se permitirán ni se podrá usar otra botella o receptáculo alguno en las esquinas durante la pelea. Toda otra solución o sustancia está prohibida. En la esquina solo se utilizará durante la pelea, a) agua, b) vaselina, c) hielo, d) sustancia de adrenalina 1/1000, e) almohadillas de gasa, f) isopos o contonetes de algodón, g) tijeras romas, h) cinta adhesiva, i) toallas, j) algodón y/o vendas suaves.

XIII-16 - Si se produce un corte, el referee consultará con el médico de ring para determinar si se jefe de segundos está en desacuerdo con la opinión del médico de ring, lo puede expresar, pero el médico de ring es la máxima autoridad en asuntos médicos y normalmente el referee deberá seguir la recomendación de este, aunque el referee es en todo momento la única persona autorizada para detener la pelea.

XIII-16(a) - Cuando se produzca corte por un cabezazo intencional que cause la detención inmediata de la pelea, el boxeador que haya sufrido el cabezazo ganará por descalificación del otro.

XIII-16(b) - Cuando se produzca corte por un golpe legal que cause la detención de la pelea, el boxeador herido perderá por nocaut técnico que se inscribiera en su historial como KOTC para mostrar pérdida por motivo dicho corte.

XIII-16(c) - Cuando por un cabezazo se haya producido o agrandado un corte, el referee deberá detener la acción para informar a los jueces del cabezazo. Si en la opinión del árbitro o del médico el peleador puede continuar, habrá deducción automática de dos puntos del peleador culpable del cabezazo si fue intencional, y de un punto del boxeador no cortado si el corte fue accidental, según se determine por el criterio del referee. Si la pelea se detiene en rounds posteriores por causa del mismo corte agrandado por golpes limpios, el resultado será decisión técnica y el ganador será el boxeador que haya estado ganando por puntos al ser detenida la pelea. Si un corte producido por cabezazo es agrandado, y la pelea se detiene por causa de otro cabezazo, el contendiente herido ganará por descalificación del otro.

Cuando se produzca un corte por cabezazo accidental que cause detención inmediata de la pelea, el ganador será el boxeador que haya estado ganando por puntos en la ocasión de dicha detención, una vez restados los puntos, en su caso, del contendiente que haya cometido el cabezazo, todo ello según la instrucción del referee. Si por un corte por cabezazo accidental ocurrido antes o hasta el tercer round se causa la detención inmediata de la pelea, esta será declarada empate técnico.

XIII-16(d) - Excepto según se dispone a continuación no habrá descalificación por golpes ilegales al cuerpo. Cuando sea apropiado, el referee ordenará deducción de puntos por causa de golpes ilegales repetidos o graves, y proporcionará al boxeador lesionado todo el tiempo necesario para su recuperación. Si el boxeador lesionado no continúa la pelea, perderá por abandono. Pero en casos de golpes bajos intencionales, sumamente obvios o extremos o continuos, y una vez hechas constantes amonestaciones por el referee, este, si el boxeador se revela contra la autoridad, podrá ordenar descalificación pero solo si el médico del ring determina que la pelea se debe detener.

XIII-17 - Ningún segundo podrá interferir con un boxeador que haya sido derribado, a menos que sea llamado por el referee.

XIII-18 - El funcionario médico tiene el deber de tener disponible un resucitador portátil u otro equipo similar, en buenas condiciones de

funcionamiento, y de examinar a los boxeadores invariablemente despues de la pelea, para expedir un certificado medico por escrito respecto a las condiciones de estros. La comision de boxeo local actualizara la Licencia Internacional de boxeo de cada boxeador, despues de la pelea. Debera existir una ambulancia estacionada en lugar de inmediata accesibilidad, desde una hora antes, hasta una hora despues del termino de la funcion.

XIII-19 - A cada boxeador se le permite tener 3 segundos, y uno mas que sirva de asistente de piso, pero no en el ring. Un segundo debera ser el jefe de segundos, sera responsable del comportamiento de los demas, y sera el unico con derecho a trabajar dentro de las sogas durante los periodos de descanso. Se requerira informar al referee, antes de la pelea, la identidad de cada jefe de segundos.

XIII-20 - Los golpes ilegales reconocidos como tales por todas las autoridades de boxeo se sancionaran firmemente, con amonestaciones fuertes y con deducción de un punto despues de 3 amonestaciones respecto al mismo golpe ilegal intencional, segun el criterio del referee.

XIII-21 - Si un boxeador deja caer su protector bucal durante un round, estrara obligado a continuar sin el mismo durante el resto de dicho round pero ningun round podra comenzar sin que ambos boxeadores lleven sus protectores bucales. Si requerira que haya dos protectores bucales en cada esquina, para lograr mejor proteccion, limpieza e higiene.

XIII-21(a) - La comision local estrara obligada a poseer un juego sustituto de guantes para pelea.

XIII-22 - Antes de la contienda, la comision local debera satisfacerse de que el ring este dotado de un enlonado, de que el tamaño del ring no sea inferior a 18 pies ni superior a 24 pies por lado que las sogas

gas sean cuatro, no sean menos de una pulgada (25.4 mm.) de diametro, cuelguen a tension normal y esten envueltas seguramente con material suave, y no se coloquen accesorios extranos tales como bancos, cubetas o microfonos, donde pueden causar lesion a un boxeador. El piso del ring o lona debe extenderse cuando menos 26" fuera de las cuerdas.

XIII-23 - El campeon - vestira calzones de color \_\_\_\_\_, y el retador \_\_\_\_\_ vestira calzones de color \_\_\_\_\_.

XIII-24 - La sequina de color \_\_\_\_\_ sera la del campeon, y la esquina de color \_\_\_\_\_ sera la del retador. Las otras dos esquinas seran "blancas", en sus caracteres de esquinas neutrales.

XIII-25 - Ambos boxeadores deberan estar presentes en los vestidores del local de la pelea, al menos una hora antes del inicio de la misma. Antes de la pelea, solo se permitira en los vestidores a los representantes autorizados de los boxeadores, los comisionados de boxeo y los medicos de la comision antes de la pelea no se permitira en los vestidores a reporte alguno de periodico, television y/o radio ni a otra figura alguna de prensa, ni a otra persona alguna que no este autorizada, solamente podra hacer su equipo de personal oficial o los comisionados de boxeo local o del CMB.

XIII-26 - Si surge algun problema o controversia relativa a algun asunto que no haya sido tratado en estas Reglas y Reglamentos, o si ambos boxeadores no han convenido respecto a algun asunto conforme a estas Reglas y Reglamentos que requiera su convenio, la comision local expedira decision respecto a dicho problema controversia u otro asunto, previa consulta y aprobacion del representante del CMB; en la inteligencia de que en el caso de desavenencia sostenida, la decision final respecto a cualquiera de dichos problemas, controversias u otros asuntos, sera tomada por el Consejo Ejecutivo CMB.

spans.

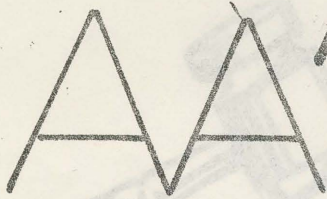

The things you read in this article are true, I am an Alcoholic and I hope what you read will be of help to any one here at H.C.C.C., as I know from experience that A.A. beats sitting in a cell.....

### "THINGS WE DID WHILE LOCKED UP"

We kept getting sent back to jail, or prison, or reformatory, or work farms time after time. We figured we must be doing something wrong. Maybe drinking had something to do with it. We could see where we had been. We could also see where we were headed, unless something changed.

### "WE DECIDED TO LEARN ABOUT DRINKING FROM EXPERTS - THE DRUNKS"

Men and women in "Alcoholics Anonymous" call themselves alcoholics or drunks. They must know the real truth about drinking, if anybody does. If there is an A.A. Group where you are, and you think you might have a problem, connected with drinking, you do not have to say you are an Alcoholic. A.A. does not care how much you drank. A.A. meetings are like a social club. They do not care what you drank or what you did. All A.A. cares about is your drinking problem.


### "WE LEARNED THAT FOR SOME PEOPLE DRINKING IS A SICKNESS"

It is kind of like being allergic. Some people that for some reason can not drink safely. Doctors do not know why some people can drink a lot and be all right, while others get sick. Doctors say this is a disease, called, "alcoholism." We in A.A. call ourselves alcoholics. But this does not mean we are all wino's or bums,

many of us had pan-handled, slept in doorways, spent time in mental hospitals, jails, and flop houses. But many of us--never did none of those things. Many A.A.'s never lost families, never had car wrecks, and never got into trouble with the law. Alcoholics are all kinds of people. It is not what you drink, or how much, that make you an alcoholic. What if you have diabetes or a broken arm, and have to take a pill or a shot of medicine every day? You do not let other people keep you from getting well. For us going to A.A. is sort of like taking our medicine. We do not care what other people think of it. We tried not to get A.A. mixed up with Religion or Group Therapy. Here at H.C.C.C. we can go to (1) A.A. Meetings, (2) Group Therapy, (3) Religious Services. And it is important to keep those three things separate in our mind. A.A. is different. It is not run by people with professional training. It is run by people like you and I. And the primary purpose of our A.A. Program is to stay sober and share our stories and help any one else who wants to stop drinking. And A.A. is not connected with any type of religion. A.A. members have their own choice of religion they want, or none that is their business. It is what the drinking does to you. But in one way all alcoholics are alike. We all wound up with problems connected with our drinking. Some



# VOICE OF THE LAW



Last week within the Center's Courier, there existed a message of news that was created out of the manifestations of "Truth", but there also existed within this frame-work the phantom of falsehood, and being that man is Truth and Falsehood strangely mixed, I am in trust that our readers bare the proper understanding to this fact and allow the correcting of such falsehood to be demonstrated by "I" The Law-Man of Truth.

The message within the news were done in good faith by the particular party that attempted to aide his brother-man during last week. I was in Court on another matter of Truth and this particular party attempted to assist me in placing a Law Issue in the newspaper, unfortunately the source in which this news-emerged from was not that One of Truth or being about what they know. They were merely going by what they have been told only to find that the source of information did not know but was merely guessing.

The Speedy Trial error was not in the fact of it being your right as an accused, because that is your right, the error is the one-hundred twenty(120) days issue, that one-hundred twenty(120) days only applies to individuals who are sentence and must appear in Court on writ.

The time factor for a pre-sentence is twevle(12) months a painful lengtl of time I agree, but it is the law.

Now in behalf of this illegal evidence, you can and will be charged for anything you say to not only a Peace Officer, but a plain citizen as well. Now there is also a form of law know as "Speedy Information" which can allow a officer to search and arrest you even without a warrant. I would also like to add that again, you can put in your own Motions, fore all you would have to do is give it to your attorney in a copy form and deliver it personally to the Court upon your appearance before the Court.

Your Good Time is considered as follows: being arrested for a particular charge before July 1, 1981 you will recieve five(5) days a month and if you are employed in the institution you will recieve ten(10) day a month, now after an arrest on a charge dating July 1, 1981 you will recieve ten (10) days a month for your stay within the institution and fifteen(15) days a month if you are working providing however that you meet the institutional rules of Good Conduct . I am with trust that the above will cure the error of good faith.

Than the one we shared before...

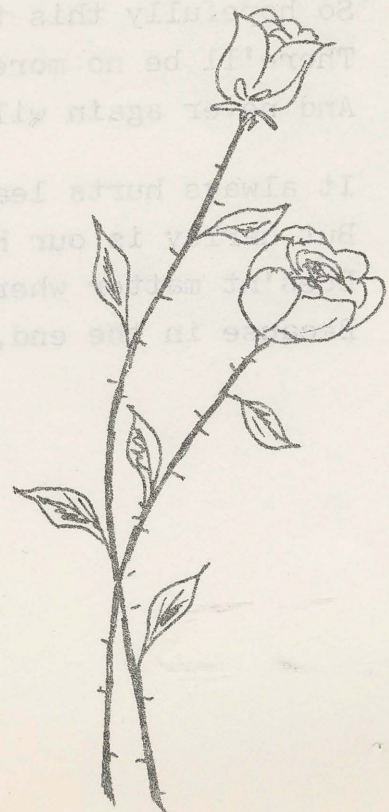

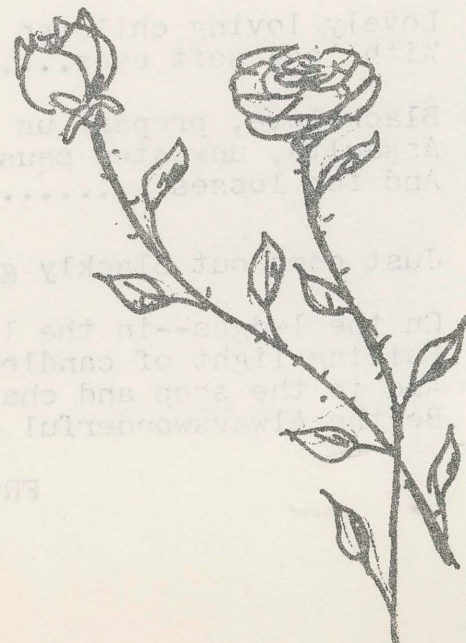

Walls and bars is all I made!.....

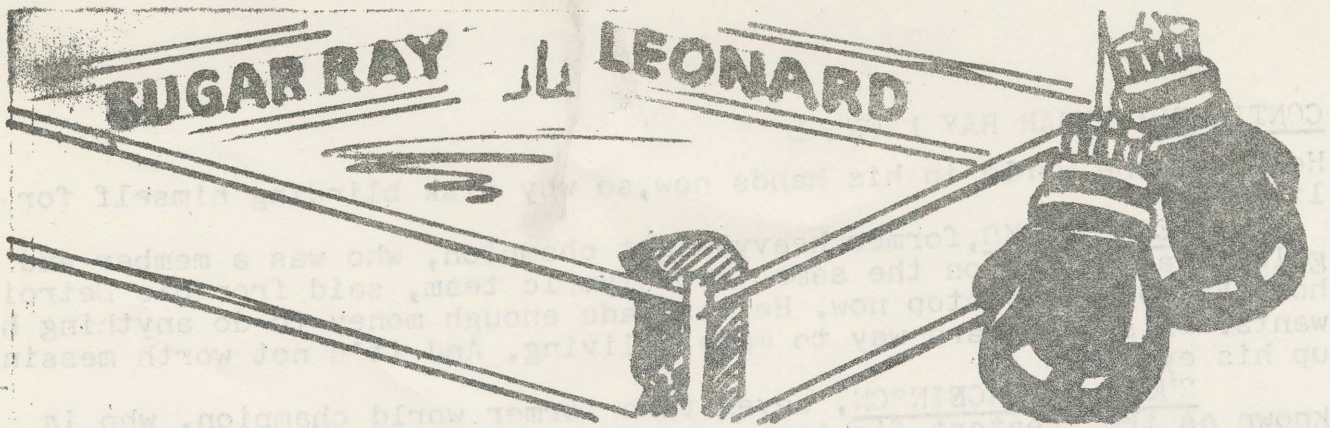

"If it was my son, I'd tell him, he's a grown man and has to make up his mind. But I'd also say remember that the world is going to kick your butt enough with two good eyes, so think about what happens if you only got one." That's how former heavyweight champ Joe Frazier feels about Sugar Ray Leonard's future in boxing.

While Leonard recuperates at home after surgery to repair a detached retina in his left eye, the world waits to learn whether the king of boxing's welterweights will return to the ring or retire to a ranch.

And although friends, fans & former foes agree, "it's a decision only he can make," an overwhelming percentage echoed, "you fight professionally for fame and fortune, & Sugar Ray Leonard can't get any richer or more famous where it would make any difference."

MUHAMMAD ALI, touted as the world's most famous athlete and at one time among the richest, said of the 26-year-old Leonard: "I hope he doesn't have to quit, because he's in the middle of his prime--with another five good years. I hope & pray he's all right because I love him."

THOMAS HEARNS, who lost his WBA welterweight title last Sept. 16 to Leonard, and the man who may have been responsible for the injury, revealed: "I'd hate to see his or anyone's career cut short like that. I'm hoping that he comes out of this OK because I would like to win my title back from him. He has been good for boxing, but he must first be good to himself."

MARVELOUS MARVIN HAGLER, the undisputed middleweight champ who owns the other title that Sugar Ray wants before retiring, lamented: "I feel bad for Sugar. As a boxer person and a family man, we have a lot in common. So I have an idea of the things that go through his mind. But in a way, I have to feel sorry for myself, if he decides to quit, -cause a fight between us could mean a lotta bucks."

ERNEST CHAVERS, heavyweight contender who at 37 is still busting heads and taking the punishment said: "I know what he's thinking, -cause I been there." Two years ago Chavers suffered a detached retina in a loss to champ Larry Holmes. "I came back and so can he. He has the talent, so I think he'll be back."

EMANUEL STEWARD, Hearns' manager, who coached Leonard during the Olympic trials in the 1970s says, "If he were my fighter, I'd advise him to retire. No matter how good he can see now, another injury, and more serious, is a big possibility. Hilmer Kenty, one of the fighters who lost his lightweight title last year, suffered the same injury to his left eye. I advised him to quit and that's one of the reasons we're not together now. He's determined to make a comeback."

DAVE JACCOBS, who until two years ago trained Leonard: "I guided him since he was 14 years old through the Pan American Games, two national golden gloves titles, 3 AAU championships, a gold medal at the Olympics and to the world title. Although we're not together, I still love him like a son, and I would advise him to quit."

He's got the world in his hands now, so why risk blinding himself for life?"

LEON SPINKS, former heavyweight champion, who was a member and a gold medal winner on the same 1976 Olympic team, said from his Detroit home: "I would say stop now. He has made enough money to do anything he wants. This is a hard way to make a living. And it's not worth messing up his eyes."

SUGAR RAY ROBINSON, seven time former world champion, who is known as the greatest fighter pound for pound in history, who shares his name with the young veteran of 33 fights, feels "he should do whatever he thinks is best. He's one of the greatest fighters out there today, and I'll be praying for him."

DON KING, boxing promoter who backed the Leonard-Hearns fight of last year, states, "he's great and he's been blessed by God. He's multi-talented and shouldn't risk even a million-to-one shot on his sight. He was named after (blind) Ray Charles, so I hope he won't come back and run the whole gamut."

FLOYD PATTERSON, former heavyweight champ who is a member of the New York Athletic Commission, revealed, "I would hate to see him try and come back. But it's his decision. I had to be part of a decision on a similar problem facing Earnie Shavers and Harold Weston. Shavers' doctors guaranteed us (the commission) that he could fight without risking further injury to the eye, so we gave him a license. Weston's doctors would not, so we had to ground him."

HAROLD WESTON, former middleweight contender, now retired, adamantly bellowed, "if he don't quit, I'll go up there and beat him with a stick."

## Chronological Order

The first five verses of the 96th chapter were undoubtedly the first revelation, and these were equally certainly followed by the first part of the 74th chapter, while again was, in all probability, followed by the first chapter, after which came the first part of the 73rd chapter. Beyond this it is impossible to give a tolerably certain order. The attempt to give a chronological order is an undoubted failure, as even the shorter chapters were not revealed entire. For instance, chronological order would place the 96th chapter first, while, as a matter of fact, every historian of Islam knows that only the first five verses were revealed first. VV. 6-19 coming long afterwards, when persecution of the Prophet had actually begun, as is made clear by VV. 9, 10, which speak of the Prophet being prohibited from saying his prayers, and must be referred to about the time when Argam's house was chosen for saying prayers, and event belonging to the fourth year of the call. If then, we are confronted with such a serious difficulty in giving the first place to a chapter with which the revelation of The Holy Quran undoubtedly began, what about the later chapters, and especially the longer ones? Take the second chapter in the present order as another example. There is not the least doubt that its revelation began in the first or at the latest, in the second year of the Hijrah, but it is equally certain it contains verses which were revealed in 10 A.H.

A chronological order of the different chapters is, therefore, an impossibility, and all that we can say with tolerable certainty is that the greater part of a certain chapter was revealed during a certain period, and this is my reason for assigning particular periods to particular chapters.

Makkan and Madinan Revelations intermingled in the final arrangement.

The first thing that strikes us in the present arrangement is the intermingling of Makkan and Madinan revelations. Surely there must have been some reason underlying this arrangement and to discover this we must find the chief features which distinguish the Makkan from the Madinan revelations. A contrast of the two makes it clear that, while the Makkan revelation grounded the Muslims in faith in God (Allah), the Madinan revelation was meant to translate the faith into action. It is true that exhortations for good and noble deeds are met with in the Makkan revelations and faith is still shown in the Madinan revelations to be the foundation on which the structure of deeds should be built, but the main stress is laid in the former on faith in an Omnipresent and Omnipotent God who requites every good and evil deed, while the latter deals chiefly with what is good and what is evil; in other words, with the details of the law. Another feature distinguishing the two revelations is that, while the Makkan revelation is generally prophetic, the revelation that came down at Madinan deals with the fulfillment of Prophecy. Again, if the Makkan revelation shows how true happiness of mind may be sought in communion with God (Allah), the Madinan revelation points out how man's dealing with the world may be a source of bliss and comfort to him. Hence, a scientific arrangement of the Quran could be made to rest only on the intermingling of the two revelations--the intermingling of faith with deeds of prophecy with the fulfillment of Prophecy of Divine Communion with man's relation to and treatment of man.

# BLACK HISTORY

## THE "BLACK MADONNA"

The Lady of Czestochowa has inspired millions of Polish citizens to fight tyranny. The most sacred religious shrine in the European country beset by Soviet Union troops is "The Lady", for centuries known as the Black Madonna.

Veteran American diplomat William B. Davis, one of the few Blacks who is a specialist in European affairs, says that the Black Madonna attracts hundreds of thousands of Catholics to its site yearly at the town 50 miles south of Warsaw. It is recognized as an inspirational factor in the drive of the Polish people to achieve freedom.

Countering that the Polish, like Black people, refuse to accept oppression, Davis feels that they will struggle vigorously against slavery. "Blacks started more than 250 slave uprisings," says Davis, "and eventually won their freedom in the U.S." He counters that the Polish people, too, are as determined and persistent and that Blacks should easily identify with this eastern European grouping.

Recently returned from duty in Vienna, Austria, Davis is awaiting reassignment during a home leave in Washington. He served in Austria as press spokesman for the U. S. and ten NATO countries in the mutual and balanced force reduction negotiations. With more than 21 years of service as a diplomat, principally in Europe, he has followed economics, political and social developments in the border countries and the Soviet Union.

In Vienna, he spent many hours at the Trauskirchen refugee camp and became well informed on the operations of "Freedom Camp", the place where refugees from Poland and the Soviet Bloc nations came to seek entry to the West. "The one factor that endears the Polish people to Black people," says Davis, "is the fact that their Black Madonna shrine has become an institution in their long history toward freedom. It's hard for Americans to believe that such a Black Lady is the freedom heroine in Eastern Europe."

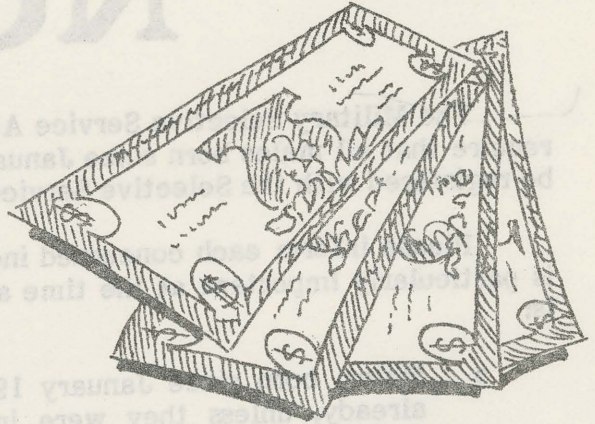

# Selective Service System

## NOTICE

The Military Selective Service Act (MSSA) and a current Presidential Proclamation require that all males born since January 1, 1960, who have reached their 18th birthday, be registered with the Selective Service System.

Please inform each concerned individual in your custody of this requirement. This is particularly important at the time an individual is released. The specific information is:

- o Males, born since January 1960, who are 18 years old should have registered already, unless they were incarcerated at the time they were required to register.
- o Unless incarcerated, a person's registration should be accomplished during the 60 day period commencing 30 days prior to their 18th birthday.
- o Persons who are incarcerated at the time they are required to register must register within 30 days of their release from confinement.
- o Registration may be accomplished at any classified U.S. Postal Service office within the United States, its territories or possessions.

# VIEWPOINT

## BEWARE OF BAD LEGAL BITS AND PIECES.

Although the whole is always equal to the sum of its parts, the converse is never true...particularly when it refers to law. That is, a mere part of a statute or legal citations taken out of context are not only usually misleading, but in fact are dangerous.

It should be noted that even a complete citation which appears to be "right down the pike" where your particular case requirements are concerned, could in reality be absolutely useless..nothing but a waste of time, effort and expense unless they are properly "shepherdized." That-is-to-say, the legal researcher must consult shepherds cross-reference citations in order to determine whether or not your particular legal "out"(techincality) is still valid in the light of any new precedents setters which the other side (the state) will use to refute or impeach your motion.

Shooting from the law book hips could, and usually does result in a fatal legal blunder. For example: A recent issue of the Courier erroneously referred to Connecticut General Statute Sec. 54-82C, implying that 120 days constitute legal jeopardy on the part of the state to provide the prisoner with a Speedy Trial.

Actually, careful reading of the statute clearly explains that it affects only sentenced inmates having pending chrages(warrants) which they'd like to dispose of. I have taken the trouble to cite Sec. 54-82e below. And for your further edification the reader should benefit from the following article I wrote last year, but it just as valid today.

### Sec.54-82c. Prisoner's Right to a Speedy Trial or Pending Charges

(a) Whenever a person has centered upon a term of imprisonment in a Correctional Institution of that state, and during the continuance of the term of imprisonment, there is pending in this state any untried indictment or information against said prisoner, he shall be brought to trial within one hundred twenty days(120) after he has caused to be delivered to the States' Attorney or Assistant States' Attroney of the judicial district or geographical area, in which the indictment or information is pending, and to the appropriate court, written notice of the place of his imprisonment and his request for final disposition to be made of the indictment or information.

NOTE: Until very recently the state of Connecticut had never subscribed to any Speedy Trial Law in general. Not even the familiar six-month statute of limitations recognized by the Federal Courts. However, a bill recently enacted by the General Assembly will Summer of 1983, and even more effective when the Second Amendment of this bill takes effect in 1985.

But, notably, neither amendment is associated in any way with Sec. 54-82c.

Thus, for all practical purposes, if you are an inmate presently incarcerated in the Connecticut Correctional System, there is no present speedy trial relief stipulation. It should, however be further noted that the inmate may conceivably fall under the balancing "guidelines of McCarthy or The Warden".

## JAILHOUSE LAWYER ADMONISHED FOR FLOOD OF LAWSUITS

Washington(UPI) - A "jailhouse lawyer," with a reputation for working harder than any prisoner in American history to challenge his confinement, is in trouble for going overboard in his campaign to flood the courts with appeals.

Clovis Carl Green, who has filed more than 700 complaints from his jail cell without legal assistance was warned by a federal appeals court Tuesday to stop his paper blizzard of frivolous appeals-for his own good.

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia ordered - "in all likelihood the most prolific prisoner litigant in recorded history" - to put away his typewriter unless he comes up with a legitimate beef.

If not, they threatened him point-blank with spending more time in jail for contempt of court.

"Ironically, Green appears to be his own worst enemy," wrote the court, "Green's 10-year sentence for rape, imposed by the Jackson County, Missouri circuit court in 1975, apparently was completed in 1980."

He would be a free man today were it not for the several sentences the (Missouri) district court imposed for contempt convictions in 1978 and 1979

stemming from Green's writ-writing and jailhouse lawyering on behalf of his fellow inmates," the court said.

The appeals court decision was handed down the same day the Supreme Court heard oral arguments in a case that centers precisely on whether felons should be allowed to appeal their convictions indefinitely.

Green's appeals - dismissed almost without exception as frivolous, malicious and repetitive - are well known in courts across the nation, especially in Washington, D.C., Missouri and Texas.

They cost him nothing to file under his status as an indigent prisoner, but they eat up the time and patience of clerks and judges.

In rare exception Tuesday, the Washington appeals court found merit in one of Green's pleas.

The three-judge panel handed down a 16 page order saving him from a lower court ruling that would have barred him from filing any more appeals in that court unless he could post a \$100 security for each.

The appeals court ruled it would have denied him his constitutional right of access to the courts.

Most of Green's appeals challenge the terms and condition of his confinement, including the rights and activities of a "church" he claims to have founded behind prison walls.

## ON JAILING AND JAILHOUSE LAWYERS

The reader will do well to study both companion articles above and at the end of article which I have selected as depicting both sides of a serious problem: the so-called flood of legal paperwork promoted by incarcerated inmates frustrated by what they feel to be denial of civil rights and delay after trial delay. Quite understandably, this flood of writs and motions is currently plaguing our judicial system. These motions are part of the problem and sometimes (but not always) comprise little of the solution to the current backlog in disposition of the abominable caseload presently harassing the criminal justice system.

On the one hand we require relief via Speedy Trial; on the other hand sometimes we are our own worst enemy (see clippings). Sort of a catch-22 situation that we place ourselves in; damned if we do, and damned if we don't.

A disturbingly concerned inmate approached me recently with a lengthy motion duly notarized, and which he was all set to file with the Superior Court. Although the document was moderately well-written and ostensibly displayed reasonable merit, I was appalled over his intentions to file because of the following reasons:

- 1). The motion contained gross errors which would have served only one purpose; to implicate the defendant even further

instead of exculpating him.

- 2). The motion could have prejudiced the defendant's case insofar as it could have destroyed his attorney's trial strategy.
- 3). There were errors of contradiction which depicted the exact reverse of the relief sought, thereby complicating the case even further.
- 4). It is very unlikely that the motion would be granted even if presented in proper form, due to the fact that the court frowns upon Pro-se motions filed by inmates who have court-appointed attorneys. Thus, the motion stands an excellent chance of either being summarily kicked back, or simply shelved with no action taken.

Therefore, in conclusion, the inmate defendant would do well being most careful in his selection of jailhouse help; granted that some of this assistance is performed by well-meaning inmates often trying to help, and despite the fact that many defendants here require help out of desperation due to attorney's who are conspicuous by their absence or who fail to file the proper motions within the required statutory time limits. As Former Law Librarian I have constantly heard complaints from inmates whose attorneys simply fail to communicate with their clients at all; don't even respond to letters and phone calls. Often times their case-loads render them more of a liability than an asset. And, were we to run our profession on the street the way some lawyers conduct theirs, presumably we would not last very long.

Never-the-less, it is urged that prior to becoming your own fool for a client, the inmate should exhaust all possible avenues of assistance through the retention of a crack private defense attorney if at all affordable - one whose experience deals with primary criminal law and has expertise in the Exclusionary Rule and knows his way around everything from discovery to research, and who knows just what juries and salesmanship are all about. In soliciting attorneys the magic thought is "caveat emptor" (Let the buyer beware).

Since many prisoners are practically paupers when presented in court, the next alternative would be to accept the services of your court-appointed public defender and hope that you are fortunate enough to acquire a conscientious lawyer willing to devote time, energy, research, interest and concern for your predicament so that you can at least expect a fair shake as opposed to a fast shuffle.

In retrospect, the defendant must avoid at all cost committing a fatal blunder which hopefully, was avoided in the aforementioned inmate situation. Keep in mind that incorrect legal advice freely given can be deadly. Beware. Beware of inmates claiming to be "Jailhouse Lawyers" this despite the fact that I remember one who was tops. I knew that and so did all his "clients" now at Somers, because he told us so often.

## ABCs of CHESS

International Master Larry D. Evans & National Master Bruce Pandolfini

We ended the last series by asking a couple of questions. The moves given were:

1. e4 e5

Does Black's initial move discourage White from building a strong center with 2. d4?

The answer is yes, because Black is prepared to capture White's d-pawn with his pawn on e5, playing 2...exd4. On Move 3 White could, of course, choose to recapture the pawn with his Queen, but that would be in violation of:

### Open Game Principle #7

**DO NOT DEVELOP THE QUEEN TOO EARLY**

You may be wondering why White's most powerful piece should be kept from the action. The reason is that the Queen's power makes her valuable, and her value makes her vulnerable. After the moves 3. Qxd4, for example, Black is likely to play 3...Nc6. In order to avoid losing his Queen, White would then be forced to move her again. This would break:

### Open Game Principle #8

**DO NOT MOVE THE SAME PIECE TWICE IN THE OPENING**

The longer White continues his folly the more trouble he invites: 4. Qd5? Nf6 5. Qf5? d5 6. Qf3 Bg4. While White has been dancing around with his Queen, the enemy forces have been brought into play Black has outplayed his opponent by employing:

## NINTH CIRCUIT REJECTS REJECT'S ATTEMPT TO DISMISS PRISONER'S 33 COMPLAINTS

The Ninth U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals has rejected an Oregon judge's effort to dispose summarily of 33 complaints filed by a state prison inmate.

The appeals court, in Franklin v. State of Oregon, Nos 80 3306 to 3338, reinstated 11 complaints, saying a trial court should not dismiss complaints on its own motion prior to the issuance of a summons unless the court clearly lacks jurisdiction.

"We reach this conclusion primarily to preserve the adversarial nature of our judicial system," Circuit Judge Robert Boochever wrote in the 12-page opinion handed down Monday. Boochever said that by dismissing the complaints before defendants had been served, the court in effect acted as adversary to the plaintiff.

The case arose from 33 complaints filed an Oregon inmate, Harry Franklin, against

various state officials. The filing ranges from allegations of intentional physical harm to complaints for failing to provide him with new T-shirts and for allegedly being his cell in the psychiatric unit.

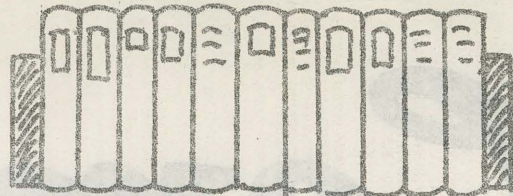
Judge James Burns, chief U.S. District Court judge in Portland, dismissed all 33 complaints before a summons was issued to state officials to respond. In defending Burns' action, Virginia Linder, an assistant attorney general in Oregon, cited "an increasing problem with pro se filings,"

John Ransom, the Portland attorney who represented Franklin, applauded the appeal court ruling, saying the issue was one of due process. He said he handled the case for free "because of the principle," but gave an ironic explanation for how the case came to him.

"That's a good story," Ransom said. "Judge Burns brought it to our office; he gets an accolade for that."

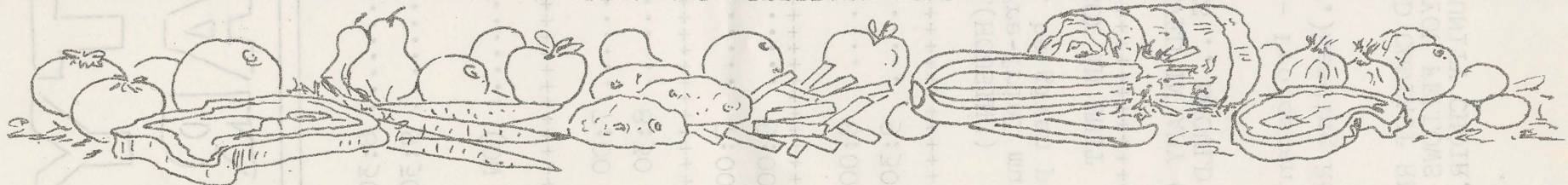

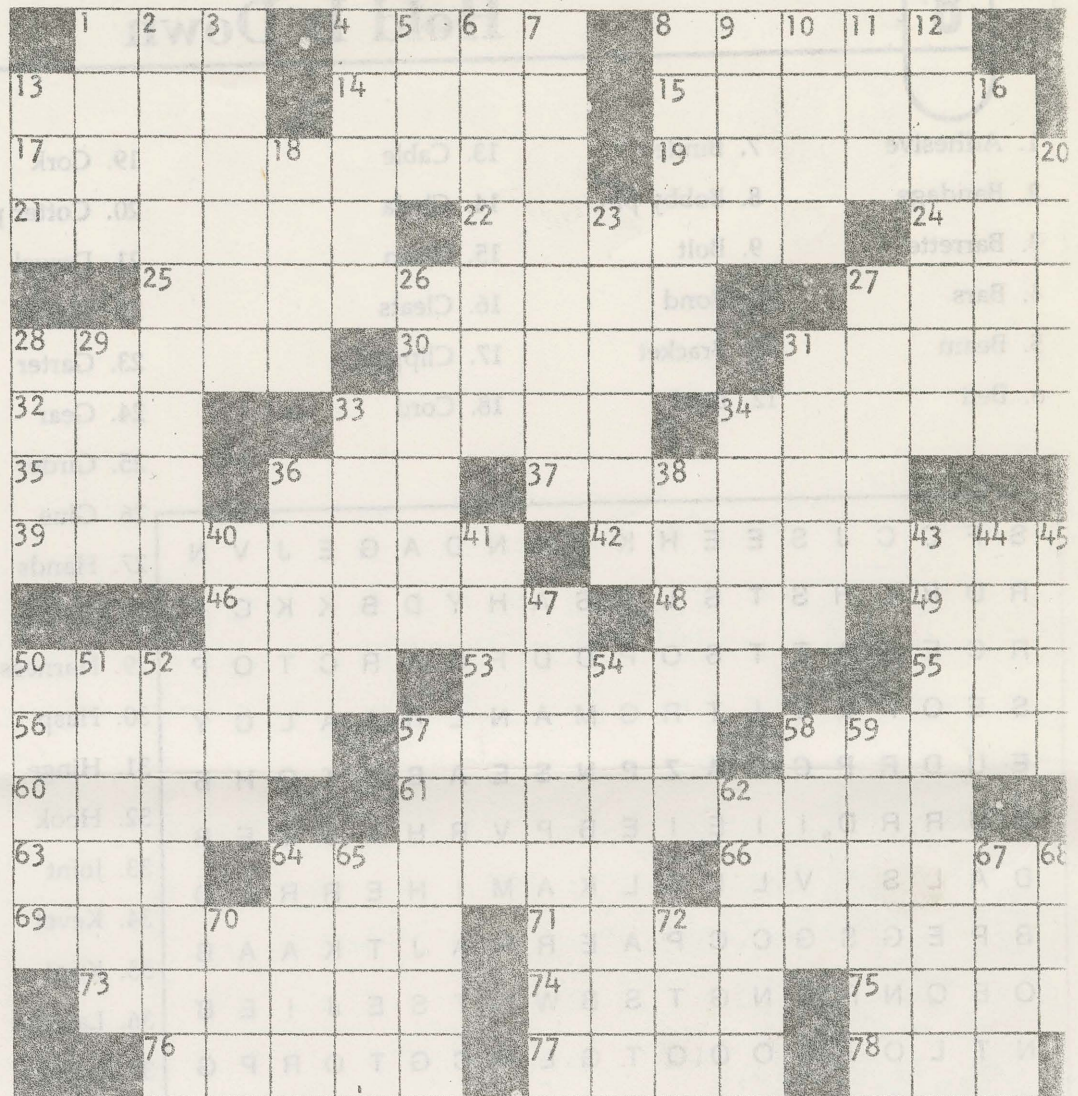
