

IF THE SHOE FITS, WEAR IT!


Inmates, I usually would address my articles "gentlemen", but at this time it isn't appropriate.







Last week the Trojans played two games and split, bringing their record to 4 wins against 2 losses, in practice games for the year. The first game was played on Monday, the 24th., of Nov. and this game went to the Trojans 85061 over a team by the name of Paul's AllStars. 

The second game played by the Trojans was on Wed. the 26th. of Nov. against the Glatsonbury Jets. The final score read, Jets 108, Trojans 99. GIANTS ROLL OVER COLTS BY A 52-0 SCORE

The Giants who just last week ran up the highest recorded shutout ever here at CCI, broke their own record by white washing the Colts, 52-0. Last week they beat the Packers, 48-0. For the Giants this was their fifth shutout out of 6 games played. Only the Packers managed to score 6 points against them during the year. In an awesome display of power, the Giants scored at will almost every time they got the ball.

On the first play of the game after the Giants kickoff, the Colts fumbled to the Giants. One play later, the Giants Santos on an option play threw a 55 yard bomb to Lucas, who carried the ball into the end-zone, for the score. Fourty two seconds later, on another Colt fumble it was Shelton on an 8 yard gallop for another Giant score. Later on in the period Shelton scored again on a 5 yard run around end. Tinsley hit Lucas on a pass for the extra-point, and the first quarter ended with the Giants out front 20 to nothing.

Midway in the third period Shelton scored again on another end sweep. Tinsley threw a pass to Hewitt for the extra point and the Giants were ahead at halftime by the score of 28-0.

In the third period the Colts came to life momentarily as their defense blitzed Tinsley repeatedly while dropping the big quarterback for big losses. This was brief though as the Giants retilated by getting Santos loose on a 32 yard run and another score. Three and a half minutes later, Santos went up the middle for 8 more yards and another Giant score. Santos also ran the extra point in and the third period came to a half with the score Giants 36-0.


The fourth period was again all Giants as Hewitt intercepted a pass and returned it back 20 yards. Ellington also picked off a Colt pass. Santos scored twice, once on a 52 yard run along the sidelines and another on a run up the middle for 20. Lucas and Hewitt scored points after, to round out the scoring. Santos ended up

with 136 yards on 8 carries. (In last weeks Scene the record yardage by an individual should have read 220 yards, not 120 yards, as indicated, and is held by Larry Sykes, for one game back in 1964. Sorry Fellows, my mistake.) Santos also scored 4 touchdowns. He has now 12 on the year. Shelton had 32 yards on 8 carries and three touchdowns. Scott had 33 yards on 8 carries. Lucas caught 3 passes good enough for 70 yards. He had one T. D. and scored 2 times on points after touchdown. Tinsley was thrown for minus He also hit on 2 of 5 16 vards losses, passes for 15 yards. Boiding was the only offense the Colts had all day as he gained 10 yards on 8 carries. In all the Glants gained 185 yards on the ground and in the air for a total of 225. The Colts were held to minus 7 yards for the day. The Giants had 9 first downs. The Coits none. Thirty yards in penalty were assested on the Giants. The Colts had 10 against them. The Colts lost the ball 4 times on fumbles...the Giants 2 times. On a good note of defense by the Colts, Harvey intercepted a Tinsley pass in his own endzone preventing another Giant score. in the fourth period.


