



(TRIADS; SEVENTHS; NINTHS; ELEVENTHS; THIRTEENTHS)

TRIADS:

Triads are chords consisting of three notes. The three notes are always onethird apart. There are four kinds of triads: major, minor, augmented, and diminished. In the key of "C", they are as follows:

NOTATION:

The distances between chord notes always remain the same, regardless of the tone the chord is built on. Major Chords always consists of a major third plus a minor third.

Seventh Chords:

There are five types of Seventh Chords. (A Dominant seventh chord is found on the fifth step of every Major scale. See cycle of fifths.) In the key of "C" they are as follows:

Cma, 7 -- C E G B Cm7 -- C Eb G Bb

C7 -- C E G Bb

CKem7 -- C Eb Gb A (Bbb)

NOTATION:

The four notes of the seventh chord are also called "1-3-5-7". Any one of the four notes may be raised or lowered.
