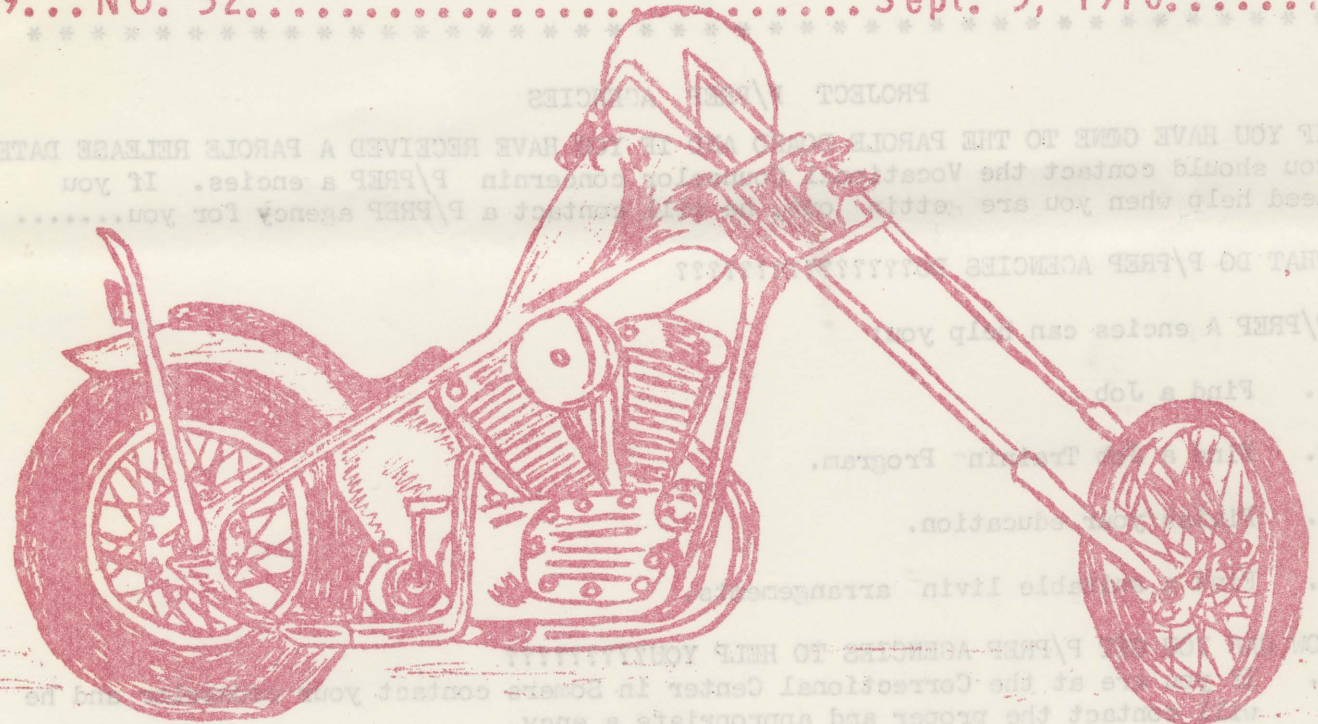

Mr. Mone, fellow prisoners, the purpose of this 'critique' is to refute the "Merry Go Round" article of the previous issue of the 'weekly scene' quote... Mao Tsetung, "At no time shall we place personal interests first."

Mr. Mone, on "indulging their own egos at the expense of the majority." In the Peoples Republic of China, who is the majority? In a land 3,691,500 sq. miles with a population of 850,000,000 million (1973 est.), who is in the drivers seat? The people, the Peoples Republic of China, that's who. Everyone working together for the common good of a peoples republic democracy. They do not dispende "your" so-called "dogma" at the expense of the majority.

Mr. Mone on "Independent thinking", "time is running out!" "Do not talk" of time running out!", while the peoples of the earth are being killed and starved daily, and you refuse, "...to state your views publically."!? A recent visit to the Peoples Republic, by the 'Committee of Concerned Asian Scholars'; fifteen American scholars who went to China in 1971. They spent a month touring major cities and country communes. From this tour they have compiled a book/study, 'China Inside the Peoples Republic.', in this study you will see how, 'propaganda of Imperialism' is our own worst enemy. Here are two achievements to the credit of the Peoples Republic, quote "China", "In 1949 the new born peoples republic faced the worst drug problem in the world. Today (1971) that problem has been totally eliminated." No drug addiction?!? No need to escape reality?!? Another quote... "Disease- for the young people of the U.S., the most serious problem after drugs is venereal disease-which in 1949 affected tens of millions in China-this disease is totally under control." A social-disease, Mr. Mone, a disease curable if people cared to accept that cure. Some people do need "guidance Mr. Mone, the 'lords' guidance?" Freedom of religion is guaranteed by the Peoples Republics Constitution" quote the 1973 almanac.

As to the statement Mr. Mone made, "...the right-wing points out that only with a authoritarian government structure can socialism be successful. Even more interesting is that both sides agree!" A very good point, but your studies must have been shallow, for you missed the difference between authority in the hands of the bourgeoisie (ruling class) and the dictatorship of the proletariat (working class), for without the applied study of Marxist-Leninist theory, you cannot understand the "difference". Socialism is but a step towards Communism. Karl Marx himself stated in the "Communist Manifesto", that, "The Communist revolution is the most radical rupture with traditional property relations; no wonder that its development involves the most radical rupture with traditional ideas." Also, "The proletariat will use its political supremacy to wrest, by degrees, all capital from the bourgeoisie (ruling class), to centralize i.e. (belonging to the dominant political party-the proletariat), all instruments of production in the hands of the (peoples) state, and to increase the total of productive forces, as rapidly as possible. You Mr. Mone, and fellow prisoners, can thank the "federally approved" media for the "Deliberate confusion." And "rhetoric" is rhetoric, and always will be rhetoric i.e. (art of literary expression), until it is refuted or understood.

Now, Mr. Mone, by bunching together Mao Tsetung.... Hitler, Rocky etc., you are putting your literary 'foot' in your mouth. Mr. Mone's "Tyranny" i.e. (cruely administered government), Hitler?, Rockefeller? Maybe. Mao Tsetung, no. Again you have not done a study on the man. You are spewing false-hoods.

Mr. Mone points out that we have allowed, "this sort of exploitation to go on for centuries." Mr. Mone you have a good point. But the statement, "for centuries" is not even close. For example, the Romans were searching out slaves and plunder in the year 337 A.D., one thousand six hundred and thirty years ago! And the fathers of "democracy", the Greeks, did own slaves and would not let non-members of the Forum vote. Put that in your memory-bank and smoke it! But let us continue.....

For your information Mr. Mone the statement, "Organize...like cattle." is as close to the truth as you came. People of our enlightened society do not follow the masses, everyone prides himself/herself as an individual, looking out for me first. This is an individualist attitude, and must be refuted. There are some people who refuse to use products 'pushingly advertised' by big-business and their advertising agencies, just so they won't be the only "kamel" smoker, who is depicted as the only real (sane) person on the entire beach. Then there are those people who see through the cheap bull-dung used to disillusion the people of this country. We are not, "all snowed", by propaganda. Some people think and research their thoughts, then put them into practice. You can be led to a tunnel, but you must see the light at the end, in order to know which way is out, into the light, you.

On Mr. Mone's, "self styled radical", how can you be so blind??? Mr. Mone speaks of the self styled radical, like it is some kind of thunder-struck youth in in spring, when in reality they are/were our courageous brothers and sisters, I say were in reference to Kent and Jackson State, revolutionizing and demonstrating against the war in Vietnam. - 1) Changes in attitude toward self and others.
 - 2) Reasons underlying changes.
 - 3) Personal goals and description of personal strengths or resources available to maintain motivation for law-abiding behavior.
- E) Personal and social history.
- 1) Family and marital.
 - 2) Intelligence and education.
 - 3) Employment and military experience.
 - 4) Leisure time.
 - 5) Religion.
 - 6) Physical and emotional; health.
- F) Institutional experience.
- 1) Program goals and accomplishments in areas.
 - 2) Acedemic.
 - 3) Vocational education, training or work assignments.
 - 4) Recreation and leisure time use.
 - 5) Religion.
 - 6) Therapy.
 - 7) Inter-personal relationship with staff and inmates.
 - 8) Behavior, including misconduct.
 - 9) Physical and emotional health, and treatment.
- G) Community resources, including release plans.
- 1) Residence; Live alone, with family, or others.
 - 2) Employment; Training, or acedemic education.
 - 3) Special needs and resources to meet them.
- H) Use of scientific data and tools.
- 1) Psychology and psychiatric evaluations.
 - 2) Pertinent data from uniform parole reporting system.
 - 3) Other statistical data.
 - 4) Standardized tests.

To lose ones freedom and be returned to prison for a number of years is assuredly to "suffer a grievous loss", and the interest in avoiding that loss of freedom certainly, " Outweighs the governmental interest in summary adjudication". Goldberg Vs. Kelly, supra., 397 U.S. at 263.

The constitutional rights...which he claims were violated apply prior to conviction. They were not applicable to a convicted felon whose convictions and sentences are valid unassailable and whose sentences have not been served. Rose Vs. Haskins, supra 288 F. 2d. at 95.

While it is readily conceded that not every prisoner is innocent, the treatment they receive within the courts and penal system victimizes each one. Throughout the Nation, the Prison Reform Advisory Board receives reports of gross inhumane, oppressive and punitive treatment meted out to prisoners. No longer can the citizens of this country stand idle and pass the buck to the next guy. Prison reformation concerns each of us. Each year it costs the taxpayers upwards of \$20,000 to keep EACH INMATE CONFINED in a penal system that cannot produce results to deter criminality. Each year the penal systems throughout America reap millions in profit from "slave labor" and non-productive rehabilitation programs. Each year - YOU - are ripped off under the guise of "LAW AND ORDER" to support these nullified modes of behavior modification.

America's prisons are operated as private satrapies, since no clear formulation of what prisoners are supposed to accomplish and the officials, judicial and penal.... are indifferent over what occurs once a sentence is imposed. Every Warden runs his prison as he sees fit, and every judge has broad discretionary power. They are rarely accountable to anyone for their actions.

Our prisons are designed with one purpose in mind: to extinguish the prisoner's will to be a free man. As long as prison administrators are concerned about the length of a prisoners hair instead of what is under the hair, (in the inmate's mind) we can never have penal reform. Monotonous routine, beatings, military lock-step marching, silence, demeaning work assignments, lack of privacy...even when performing bodily functions, obedience to arbitrary rules and punishment, humiliating taunts, homosexual attacks tolerated by Prison Administrators, and in some cases, even.... murders. These, coupled with the sometimes obvious Klu Klux Klan type prison personnel makes the present penal system a complete failure.

The central question is: what has any of this to do with the offender obtaining gainful employment upon release and becoming an asset to their community?

If there must be a penal system, then the system must work. The statistics of the present system proves it's failure to curbe the crime and recidivism.

The Prison Reform Advisory Board advocates effective rehabilitation and alternatives to incarceration, such as community based treatment centers operated by those from the offender's own community. Almost all studies and experts agree on the changes needed for prison reform; more in-community facilities like Half-Way houses, more academic and vocational training in institutions, more work-release programs whereby

local business and industry cooperate by providing job opportunities and follow-up counseling services, more separation of offenders not only by type of offense, but by amenability to rehabilitation, and more pooling of State and Local facilities....

If these changes are not instituted, and Justice granted everyone accused of criminal action, then our penal facilities will continue to see the BLOOD OF ATTICA, with more like murders in the name of Just-us.....

"Behavior modification.....includes a variety of activities built around the thesis that by adjusting systems of rewards and punishments we can effectively control the behavior both of individuals and people in groups. It is distinctively American in that it is characterized by a passion for results. It is also deliberately insensitive to the mental processes associated with obtaining these results."

"The net of behavior modification has been cast wide. Under the rubric of behavior modification, unruly prisoners are injected with a drug that makes them experience sensations of drowning. College students are invited to join programs in which they will be painlessly cured of smoking or overeating. Furthermore, that philosophical question is complemented by the practical one: could a government intent upon extending its authority over the daily lives of its citizens accomplish its goals by using the technology of behavior modification?"
