PARDON BOARD

SPRING SESSION MEETS ON THE FIRST MONDAY IN APRIL AND THE FIRST MONDAY IN MAY.

APPLICATIONS: All inmates who are planning for appearance at the next session are encouraged to submit their request to SUPERVISOR OF RECORDS, at CCI SOMERS.

Their request should be submitted immediately, if possible, and inmates are reminded that the last day for receiving requests is February 25, 1977.

APPLICATIONS RESULTING IN STARRED(*) CASES: Under the established rules of the Par-
don Board, cases cannot be heard if the petitioner has:

(1). Appeared within the year. (2). Served less than a year. This one year cannot include jail-time. (3). Appeared or was eligible for Parole.

The Department of Corrections nor the Pardon Board will assign Attorneys. Each inmate must retain his own council.

A starred case in one of these categories is rarely heard. By therefore waiting for a regular session, not only are the inmates saved the labor of preparing required letters, but friends, lawyers, prison staff, States Attorney and the board is spared the effort which should be given the regulars petitioners.

It is suggested that before undertaking the task of starred petition, an inmate should seek the advise of the prison staff which is readily given.

The book fair this year will be held on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, March

The book fair this year will be held on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, March 14, 15, and 16 1977. The rules are as follows:

1. The actual sale of books to inmates will take place from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. on each of these nights.
 2. Inmates will come to the book fair only on the night when their block is scheduled. Inmates wishing to attend the book fair will not be released from their cells at the beginning of the evening recreation period. Instead, they will be released when the library is ready to accomodate them.

THE SCHEDULE IS AS FOLLOWS:

Monday Night Q-1, Q-2, Q-3, and Q-4 Blocks.

Tuesday Night B. C. D. and E Blocks.

Wednesday Night-----H, J-1, and J-2 Blocks.

3. The library will be closed all day on the days of the book fair. Library books cannot be checked out of the library on those days.
 4. The cost of the books will be deducted from the inmate's account. Books may not be bought on credit.
 5. There will be discounts ranging from 15% to 30% on all books.
 6. All sales are final. Books may not be returned once they have been purchased.
 7. No one will be allowed to bring any of their personal belongings into the library when the book fair is in session. This includes coats, jackets, books, notebooks, bags, etc.
 8. Paperback books, only, will be sold. Hard cover books will not be available at the book fair.*****
 9. Inmates should place their suggestions for the bookfair in a "Suggestion Box" which will be placed near the front entrance to the library.
