After the interview, your agency counselor will keep you informed of his or her progress by personal visit or mail. Picture yourself in the country, or whereever you may desire to be; alone or with someone; working out, or just laying back relaxing listening to music without a care in the world-a picture so complete that there is no need for improvement. 

IMPRISONNENT

Judges spend their lives consigning men and women to prison, and when some whisper reaches them that prisons are horrible, and destructive places, they remark calmly that prisons are not meant to be nice or comfortable. But to deter and punish, except that the word Rehabilitate is the word used now, not punish. To know what it means to be a prisoner, how it feels to be confined, the agony of suffering is impossible for a person to know if he has never been imprisoned. The psychological state of complete passivity and dependence on the decisions of guards and officers must be included among the pains of imprisonment along with restrictions of physical liberty, the possession of goods and services and heterosexual relations. The frustrations of the prisoners ability to make choices, and the frequent refusals to provide an explanation for the regulations and commands descending from the bureaucratic staff involve a profound threat to the prisoners self image because they reduce the prisoner to the weak, helpless, dependent status of a child. The imprisoned criminal finds his picture of himself as a self determining individual being destroyed by the regime of the custodians.

The idea of punishment as the law interprets it seems to be whenever a man has offended society, society must officially offend him. It must deliver him a tit for the tat that he committed. This tit must be impulsive retaliation, not mob action. It must be done dispassionately, by agency, by stipulation, and by statute. It must be something that will make the offender sorry (or sorrier) for what he did, and resolve to do it no more. The Constitutional prohibition against "Cruel and Unusual" punishment implies that in some way or other the state must be consistent in means, and something not unexpected. To deprive a man of decent social relationships, decent food, normal friendships, and sexual relations, and constructive communication is not———in the eyes of the law, Cruel or Unusual. Neither is the labor which is extracted from the inmate which more often than not is disagreeable, monotonus, menial, and often pointless, cruel or unusual, and at times used as another form of punishment.

Monuments to stupidity are these institutions we have built. ity not so much of the inmates, as of the free citizens. What a mockery of sciences our prison descipline, our amassing of iniquity in prisons. The good and the bad together in one big stope cave. How silly of us to think that we can prepare men for social life by reversing the ordinary process of socialization. Repressive regimentation of men who are in prison because they need to learn how to exercise their activities in constructive ways, outward conformity to rules which repress all efforts at constructive expression, work without the operation of economic motives. Motivation by fear of punishment rather than hope of rewards on appeal to higher motives, cringing rather than growth in manliness. When all offenders early learn to present a steadfast attitude of bostility, where men live in an atmosphere of complete monotony, futility, hate, and loneliness, while time grinds by, and operated by a society that claims it cares!

REMABILITATING AND CORRECTING SOCIAL DEVIAT BEHAVIOR IN THOSE INDIVID-UALS THAT DISPLAY IT IS A VERY INVOLVED AND DIFFICULT PROCESS. WHEN INSTITUTIONS BEGAN IN THE U.S. THEIR PURPOSE MAS FOR REPENTANCE ALONE. THE QUAKERS FELT THAT PUTTING AN INDIVIOUAL IN SOLITARY CONFINEMENT WITH ONLY A BIBLE FOR COMPANIONSHIP WOULD DETER THAT INDIVIDUAL FROM COMMITTING ANOTHER UNLAWFUL ACT. THEY ASSUMED THAT HAVING DIGESTED THE BIBLE FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS THE INDIVIOUAL WOULD AUTOMATICALLY BECOME AN UPSTANDING CITIZEN. THIS PROVED TO BE INEFFECTIVE NEARS OF CURBING CRINE. THEN PUNISHMENT WAS INACTED AS THE ANSWER TO COMBAT CRINE, THAT ALSO PROVED INEFFECTIVE AS A DETERIENT EVEN THOUGH IT STILL EXISTS IN A NUMBER OF PRISONS, USUALLY OUT OF PURE FRUSTRATION OR RECAUSE OF THE LACK OF INTELLIGENCE ON THE PART OF THE PRISOR ADMINISTRATORS. NOW RE-MABILITATION IS THE IN THING, SOMETIMES LTS DIFFICULT TO JUSTIFY LTS EX ISTENCE TO THE PUBLIC SECAUSE OF ITS OBVIOUS LACK OF SUCCESS. INSTEAD OF EXISTING IN A PRISON ENVIRONMENT ON A PURE PHYSICAL LEVEL, THE PEROL OGIST HAVING CURSED THE PHYSICAL BRUTALITY TO A DEGREE EXPECT THAT AT-TACKING THE HIND IS THE ANSWER. THEY NOW HOPE TO MAKE DEPENDENT ROBOTS OUT OF MEN, ITS EFFECTIVE FOR MAINTAINING ORDER IN PRISONS BUT ITS NOT VERY BENEFICIAL FOR THE INDIVIDUAL WHEN HE RETURNS TO THE STREET. THE JOKE IS, THE JUSTICE SYSTEM AND THE PRISON ADMINISTRATORS AREN'T VERY CONCERNED WITH THE EFFECTIVENESS OF PENAL INSTITUTIONS, THEY WOULDN'T WANT TO BE TOO SUCCESSFUL AND PUT THEN SELVES OUT OF A SWEET JOB.

THE ANSWER TO THE PROBLEM IS REGIRECTING THE OFFENDERS. A COMMUNICA-TION GAP SETWEEN STRAIGHT PEOPLE AND OFFENDERS IS ALWAYS PRESENT. 178 NOT REALISTIC TO CONSIDER IT POSSIBLE TO CRAM SOCIETIES NORMS, SANCTION AND VALUES DOWN AND OFFENDERS THROAT, BECAUSE HE HAS NEVER FOUND THEM BENEFICIAL FOR HINSELF. MOST OFFENDERS ARE AWARE OF THE MANY INCONSES-TENCIES AND DOUBLE STANDARDS THAT EXIST IN AMERICAN SOCIETY, RICH, POOR BLACK AND WHITE ETC. THOSE SOCIAL DEVIAT THOUGHTS WILL ALWAYS BE LUEL IN THE BACK OF AN OFFENDERS MIND, NOTHING IS MORE EXPEDIENT THAN TAKENO WHAT YOU WANT, IMMEDIATE GRATIFICATION CAN BE PRETTY SWEET. ALL ANYORE CAN HOPE TO ACCOMPLISH IS REDIRECTING THAT ENGLESS ENERGY INTO A POSIT! DIRECTION. INSTEAD OF PLACING SO MUCH EMPHASIS ON GROERLY RUN PRISONS, MORE EFFORT SHOULD BE DIRECTED TOWARDS MENTAL NEALTH, GETTING THE INCI-VIOUAL IN TOUCH WITH MINSELF AND NIS FEELINGS. THE FAMILIES OF THE OFFENDER AND MAYRE EVEN HIS VICTIMS COULD BE INSTRUMENTAL IN ENLIGHTEN! HIM OF THE EFFECT OF HIS ACTIONS ON OTHER PEOPLE. A CRINE IS USUALLY PRETTY IMPERSONAL ACT, SO RARELY DOES ANY REMORSEFUL FEELINGS RESULT FI IT. IT WOULD MAKE A DIFFERENCE IF THE OFFENDER WAS ABLE TO HAVE GROUP SESSIONS WITH HIS VICTIMS, HIS FAMILY AND A PROFESSIONAL. CONCERN FOR OTHER PEOPLES RIGHT WOULD ELIMINATE MOST CRIME. COMPASSION AND RESPECT FOR OTHERS RIGHTS COULD DEVELOP FROM THESE GROUP INTERACTIONS.

MOST PENAL INSTITUTIONS SHOULD RE CORD, DENVING MAN THE COMPANY OF A FE MALE AND VISA VIRSA IS JUST AND THER PORM OF PUNISHMENT. POLICE PRIOR KNOWLEDGE OF ILLEGAL PRIVATE SEARCH DIDN'T TRIGGER FOURTH

Suppression of evidence unwarranted in absence of government instigation or encouragement of private party.

A defendant seeking to suppress evidence seized as the result of an unlawful entry by a private party must, the U.S. District Court for Nebraska says, show more than mere governmental knowledge of or acquiescence in the entry. Instead, the Fourth Amendment exculsionary rule applies only "When the government has in some manner instigated or encouraged the search". Finding no evidence of such involvement in the case before it, the court rejects the habeas courpus petition of a Nebraska defendant convicted on stolen property charges.

The petitioner relied on language from two fifth Circuit cases, U.S. v Mekjian, 505 F. 2d 1320, and U.S. v. Clegg, 509 F 2d 605, 16 Crl 2539, in arguing that police knowledge and acquiescence are sufficient in themselves to trigger the Fourth Amendment. But the U.S. Supreme Court has made clear in another context that the "true significance" of a state's involvement in private action can be determined only after evaluating the totality of the circumstaces. Moose Lodge No. 107 v. Irvis, 407

U.S. 1630.

The court also finds useful those cases which attach importance to whether the private party acted purely in the government's interest or for reasons of his own.

(Gundlach v. Janing, 10/13/75).

Digest of Opinion: Harold Cheesman, a parts manager for an airplane supply company, was told by the landlady of an apartment complex that she was suspicious of items in a garage rented to the defendant. She gave him permission to check the garage. Before checking, Cheesman talked to police officers; they told him that they would not act wiyhout a criminal complaint and suggested that he should establish that there was property missing from his inventory. He was also told that if he found something he should report back to the police. Cheesman than checked the garage and reported back. At that time he did no definitely know if his company was missing any items. Warrants were later obtained and items from two companies were found in two garages rented to the defendant.

Gundlach contends that the fruits of Cheesman's search, the two subsequent police searches, were inadmissible under Wong Sun v. U.S., 371 U.S. 471. His theory is that the police had knowledge that Cheesman might make an unlawful entry of the premises and, having refrained from deterring him, in effect participated in his unlawful search. After reviewing certain testimony, the court finds that the police knew in advance that Cheesman might make an unlawful entry and took no steps to deter him. Moreover, they utilized the information he gained in his unlawful entry to obtain search warrants.

In Burdeau v. Mcdowell, 256 U.S. 465, the Supreme Court ruled that the use in a criminal prosecution of personal papers stolen from the accused by a private individual did not violate the defendant's Fourth Amendment rights when the government was in no way involved in the theft. This holding has never been overruled.

Cases deeming private searches to be governed by the Fourth Amendment have usually involved searches conducted under the active supervision of state or federal authorities. Gundlach asks this court to extend these cases to police inaction in failing to advise Cheesman that he could not legally enter the garage. He relies upon U.S. v. Mekjian, in which the Fifth Circuit stated as follows: "If government officials were awere, or should have been aware, that Mrs Jones was removing and copying records for their use, they will not be permitted to stand by or blink their eyes and accept the benefits of her activities." See also U.S. v.Clegg

THE RESERVE OF THE PARTY OF THE

(Text) The Subrete Court has held that the decisive factor in determining whether a search is a government one "is the actuality of a share by a (government) official in the total enterprise of securing and selecting evidence by other than sanctioned means. "Lustig v. U.S., 338 U.S. 74,79 (1949); U.S.v. Mekjian, at 1328. As Mr. Justice Clark held in a landmark case discussing state responsibility under the equal protection clause of the fourteenth amendment "(o)nly by sifting facts and weighing circumstances can the nonobvious of the State in private conduct be attributed its true significance "Burton v. Wilmington Parking Authority, 365 U.S. 715, at 722(1961). The Court therefore rejects prtitioner's argument that governmental knowledge of an illegal search and acquiescence is per se an unreasonable search in violation of the fourth and fourteenth amendments. The decision in this case must depend on the factual circumstances.

The purpose of the exclusionary rule in this type of case is to discourage officials from participating in or encouraging "private" searches which would be illegal if conducted by the government may not accomplish by circuitous means what

they themselves cannot properly accomplish. ***

In determining whether the search in this case is governmental, the Court finds the "airline search" cases to be instructive. In U.S. v. Wilkerson, 478 F.2d 813, 13 Crl 2254 (8th Cir.1973), the Circuit held: "(S)earches of luggage by airline employees are private searches that are invulnerable to fourth amendment attack so long as the searches are conducted by the carrier for its own purpose and without the instigation or participation of government officers" Id. at 815.***

(See also) United States v. Cangiano, 464 F.2d 320, 11 CrL 2341 (2nd Cir.), vacated on other grounds 413 U.S. 913 (1972), remanded 491 F. 2d 905,14 CrL 2356,

cert. denied 418 U.S. 934 (1974)***

Although the airport search cases are distinguishable from this case because the airlines act pursuant to their duty to insure that luggage does not present a danger, the cases are appropriate authority for the proposition that the intent of the private person in conducting a search with governmental knowledge that the search might take place is a proper factor for consideration.

In petitioner'r appeal to the Nebraska Supreme Court, the court found that "Cheesman was acting in the interests of his employer and not under the diretion of

the police" 192 Neb. (692) at 695,224 N.W. 2d (167) at 170.

Under the facts presented in this case, mere knowledge that Cheesman might conduct an illegal private search without taking any deterrent action is insufficient to turn the private search into a governmental one. In determining state action in race discrimination cases, the Supreme Court has placed emphasis on whether the government's action or inaction in any way fostered or encouraged racial discrimination. Moose Lodge No. 107 v. Irvis. Similarly, the Court holds that a search conducted by a private party is a governmental search which must comply with the fourth and fourteenth amendments when the government has in some manner instigated or encouraged the search.

(text) There is an additional basis upon which the Court concludes that Cheesman's search did not violate the fourth amendment. The fourth amendment protects the right of the people to be secure against unreasonable searches and seizures. A search conducted by the police in violation of the fourth amendment does not necessitate the conclusion that the same search, if conducted by a private person with the government's knowledge, would also violate the fourth amendment. Clearly the police could not have searched the garage with the landlady's consent absent a search warrant.Cf. Stoner v. California, 376 U.S. 463 (1964). However, the Court concludes that the search by Cheesman with prior police knowledge that he might conduct the search was not an unreasonable search in the constitutional sense. The degree of governmental knowledge and participation, as well as the conduct of Cheesman in entering the premises with a key given to him by the landlady for the purpose of viewing the stolen goods, compel the Court's conclusion that the search was not an unreasonable search in violation of the fourth amendment. (End text)-Denney, J.





Thumbs Up? For Finger

Raising the middle finger in a gesture of contempt is offensive, but not obscene, a three-judge state panel ruled Tuesday.

The decision by the Appellate Session of Superior Court cleared a 16-year-old Columbia High School student who made the gesture to a state trooper following his school bus last December.

The trooper charged the boy with making an obscene gesture. The boy, who was not identified because of his age, was fined \$25.

Judge Leo Parskey, who wrote the opinion overturning the conviction, said for the finger gesture to be obscene it must be significantly erotic or arouse sexual interest. Parskey said the practice dates back to ancient Greece when Diogenes, a philosopher, insulted Demosthenes, an orator, with the gesture.
