PARDON BOARD

SPRING SESSION ON THE FIRST MONDAY IN APRIL AND THE FIRST MONDAY IN MAY.

APPLICATIONS: All inmates who are planning an appearance at the next sessions are encouraged to submit their requests to SUPERVISOR OF RECORDS, at their respective institutions. Your request should be submitted immediately, if possible, and inmates are reminded that the last day for submitting requests is February 10, 1978.

After having submitted your request, you will be sent (3) three copies of the Board of Pardon Pétitions. You must fill these petitions out completely and return (2) two copies as soon as possible to your Record Office for scheduling of your appearance. Retain (1) one copy for your records.

APPLICATIONS RESULTING IN A STARRED (*) CASE: Under the established rules of the Pardon Board, cases are rarely heard if the petitioner has: 1) Appeared within the year. 2) Served less than one year. This one year cannot include jail time. 3) Appeared or was eligible for parole. A Starred case in one of these categories is very rarely heard, therefore, by waiting for a regular session, not only are indices saved the labor of preparing required letters, but friends, lawyors, prison staff, State's Attorney and Board members are spared the effort which should be given the regular petitioners. It is successed that before undertaking the task of a starred petition, an inmate should seek the advice of the prison staff which is readily given.

The Department of Corrections nor the Pardon Board will assign Attorneys. Each inmate must retain his own council.

"SYSTEM BREEDS CRIME: PRISON WATCHER" By Greg Roberts

WINDSOR LOCKS - Fundamental injustices in American society have given it the highest crime rate in the Western world, New York Times columnist Tom Wicker said Wednesday night. And the public's fear of crime, fueled by the media, hampers efforts to eliminate the injustices, Wicker said in a speech to the Connecticut Prison Association. This "vicious circle" is reinforced by a political system that "all too often is designed to preserve the status quo and protect privilege," the veteran political reporter said.

Until the public recognizes the political system's role, he said, "We're not going to be able to do anything about the rate of crime. If ever we are to bring down the rate of crime, and make our society more just and equitable, then we have to dedicate ourselves to the principles of generosity to the weak and justice for the disadvantaged." The liberal North Carolinian said he was no expert on prisons and the criminal justice system, but that he had "a deep and abiding interest" in the subject. Wicker was an observer during the bloody prison uprising at Attica State Prison in New York in 1971 that resulted in the deaths of 43 persons - all but four of them killed by state police and guards - and his experience there produced the penetrating book, "A Time to Die."

Wicker cited several types of inequality that build crime in America, including: Economic injustice. "We have so much poverty cheek-by-jowl with so much affluence," he said, stating that the distance between his wealthy neighborhood on 80th Street in Manhattan and Harlem 20 blocks north "is the same distance as going around the world. That kind of inequity is going to be noticed by those suffering from it," he said. The columnist added that unemployment, which contributes to crime, is highest among those under 25, and highest of all among young blacks - two groups responsible for many crimes.

"They very people who are most likely to hit you over the head when you go home tonight are the ones who most need economic justice and the least likely to get it," he told his audience of 160. - Social injustice. Racism and sexism help create poor schooling, housing, and health care for the economically disadvantaged, creating bitterness and mistrust, he said. - Legal injustice. "We have a criminal justice system shot through with arbitrary decisions" on arrest, bail, trials, sentencing, and parole, he said. Though these injustices can be recognized as boosting crime, Wicker said, "The hyper fear of crime by the public tends to defeat efforts to do anything about crime itself."

The fear of crime produces a public clamor for "typically American" shortcuts, he said, such as the current move to restore the death penalty. This "single most discriminatory act in the American criminal justice system" is desired not so much because it deters crime, which statistics show it does not, and not so much because people want others executed, but because irrational fear demands the creation of a class of "people who have been ruled unfit for the human race," Wicker said. Fear of crime contributes to a lock-them-up-and-throw-away-the-key mentality that often results in the imprisonment of basically non-violent persons who are more likely to become criminals in jail than to be rehabilitated, Wicker said.

"If you live in Queen's and have three locks on your door and walk your daughter to school every day because you're afraid she'll get raped," he said, "you're going to want to put more persons in prison for a long period." The newspaperman said the prisoner knows when his term ends - a measure also favored by audience member and Correction Commissioner John R. Manson as a way of reducing uncertainty and removing imprisonment from the whim of parole boards and administrators. Judges should be allowed to give specific sentences within a limited range, Wicker said. Sentences should be shorter, and persons should be sent to prisons only as a last resort, he said. And, Wicker said, prisons should be morden, well-run, and humane. Hatred and mistrust of the law is bred among prisoners, he said, because "The law that put them in prison cannot protect them once they are in there."

"CAPITAL PUNISHMENT FAILING TO STOP MURDER, STUDY CLAIMS"

WASHINGTON - The death penalty rarely if ever deters murder, according to a new statistical study. The report in the University of Minnesota Law Review disputes the widespread belief that some potential criminals will change their minds about committing murder because they fear execution. Washington researcher Brian Forst concluded in the latest statistical analysis of the issue that "capital punishment does not, on balance, deter homicides."

However, the report said there was some evidence that a high murder conviction rate and prison sentences for murders have a deterrent effect. Forst, a senior research analyst at the Institue for Law and Social Research, studied murder statistics for 32 states between 1960 and 1970, a decade when the murder rate was rising nationally and the number of executions was declining. Between 1967 and last Jan., there were no executions in the United States because of court challenges to the constitutionality of capital punishment.

But after the Supreme Court ruled in 1976 that the death penalty for murder is constitutional under certain circumstances, many states passed new death penalty laws. Utah became the first state in the new era to carry out an execution when Gary Mark Gilmore was shot by a firing squad Jan. 17. Forst wrote that, if capital punishment deters murder, the murder rate should have increased the most in states where the risk of execution went down the most.

Instead, Forst said in an interview, "The states that ended the death penalty had smaller increases in the homicide rates. The homicide rate went up more in states which did not have the death penalty in 1960." As he descrived the findings in the report, "It is apparent that those states in which the factual use of capital punishment ceased during the 1960s experienced no greater increase in the murder rate than did the states that did not use capital punishment in the first place. "under the theory that capital punishment deters murder, one would have predicted the opposite."

In its opinion affirming the constitutionality of capital punishment, the Supreme Court speculated that for many murderers, "the death penalty undoubtedly is a significant deterrent." Pollsters have found a widespread public belief in the deterrent value of capital punishment, Forst noted. He measured what happened to murder rates in states that abolished the death penalty before 1960, those that still had a death penalty law but carried out few if any executions and those that used the law more frequently until court decisions forced an end to capital punishment. Though he found no connection between capital punishment and the murder rate, Forst did find a link between the murder rate and convictions and prison terms.

"This finding of a deterrent effect of imprisonments of persons convicted of murder is more real than spurious," Frost wrote. The largest murder rate increases tended to occur in states with a poor record of capturing and convicting killers, he said. Legal scholar Hans Zeisel called Forst's analysis "the final blow" to the theory that capital punishment deters murder. Zeisel, professor emeritus of law at the University of Chicago and a senior consultant to the American Bar Foundation, wrote in a recent article that "Forst's analysis is superior" to other statistical studies which concluded that capital punishment deters murder.

If your birthday falls in January or early February (any year), check the date given in parentheses after the year of your birth (2-12 is Feb. 12; 1-22 is Jan. 22, and so on). This date marks the start of the Chinese New Year for the year of your birth. If you were born between Jan. 1 and this date, your animal symbol is that of the preceding year. For example, this Year of the Horse runs from Feb. 7 (2-7), 1978, to Jan. 27, 1979. We are in the Year of the Snake until Feb. 7, 1978; the Year of the Horse precedes the Year of the Sheep.
