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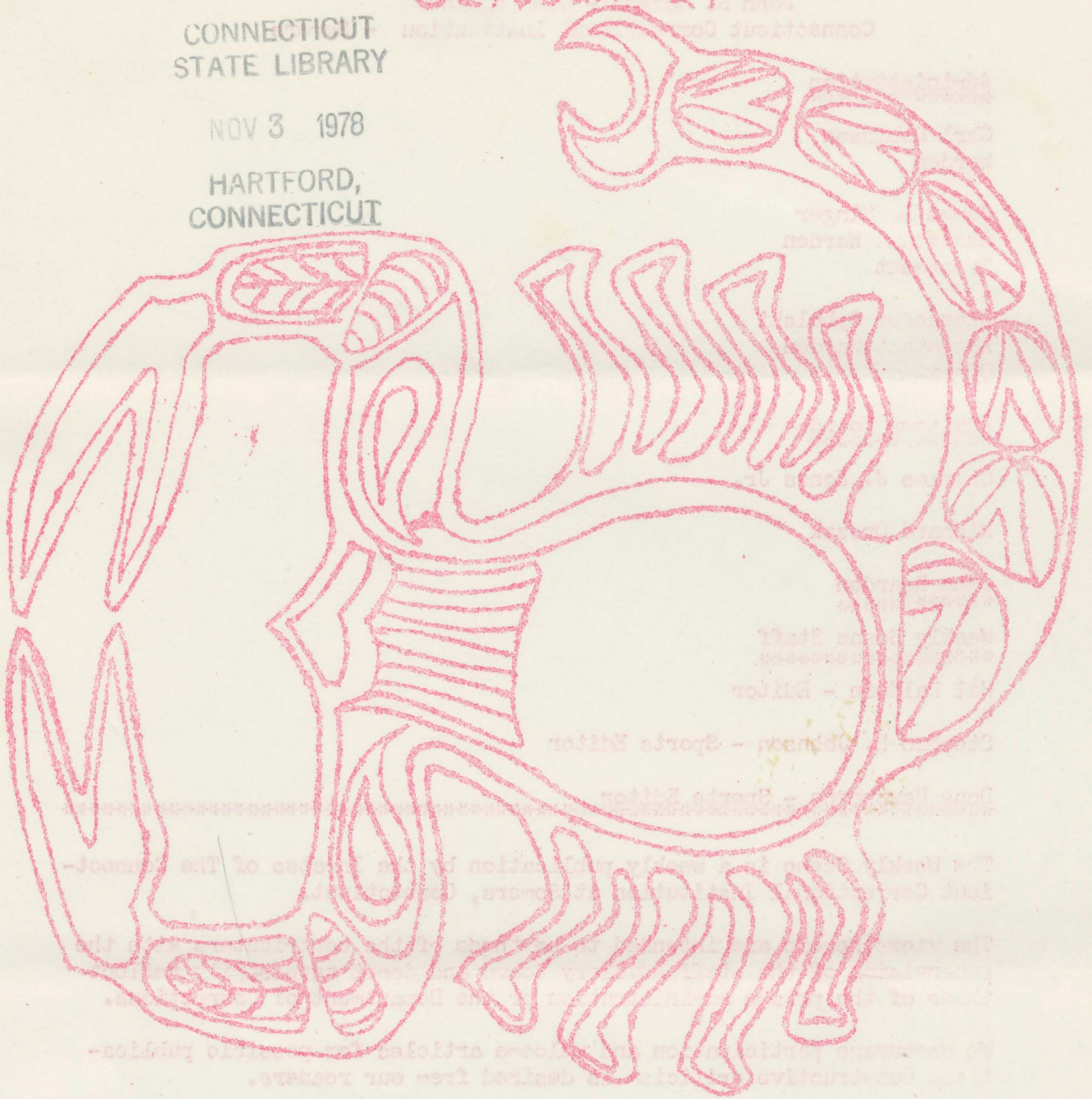

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Minority Representation Within The Judicial Profession

Although most prisons throughout the United States are populated "wall to wall" with a rather high percentage of minority prisoners, the judicial system which is responsible for the confinement of this disproportionate number of minority prisoners in prisons within the sacrilegious realm of this foundering society, in proportion, comprise of less than 10% percent of minority representation in the judicial profession.

Comparing the Connecticut Judicial system as a prime example of racially concentrated minorities comprising the majority of populations in any correctional institution within the Department of Corrections. Yet in proportion, minority representation in the grinding wheel of justice known as the judicial process (which ultimately will decide who is to be sentenced to correctional institution) is as follows:

1. Less than 2% of all judges within the judicial system of this State are representative of minority views and sensitivities.
2. Minority representation in the State's Attorney Office is non-existent except for those "oreo" token positions in any judicial district of this widely known constitutional state.
3. Lawyers licensed to practice by the Connecticut Bar Association are not representative by minorities of less than 5% of all lawyers licensed by the State to practice their class-room learnings. However, in this area, minorities would probably break at least even because most freshmen lawyers who specialize in defending the poor need a constant source of refresher courses to even rise to the level of being and remaining competent.

True, there are other important factors which contribute to minorities being the source of the population escalation in prisons, but in accordance with the latest population census of the United States, minorities statistically speaking, in this land of plenty are less than twenty-five percent of the total population - I mean all minorities.

Which infers to yours truly, that not only is the type of justice rendered by Courts dependent on the size of your pocketbook, but it now also appears that the insensitivities of Court systems to the plight of minorities adds yet another yoke of a judicial system that prides itself on the plea bargaining method to deplete crowded Court calendar, and which has excluded the balancing arm of equal representation as defined by the foundering fathers.

Time has past on, but I still remember somewhat sadly of how minorities are given up in the name of judicial plea bargaining by an instance of three very young minority youths were incarcerated because it was thought to be more expedient to incarcerate all of these youthful persons than it was to apply the rational so often extended in similar cases in hopes of salvaging a few young lives. This judiciary reasoning was prompted by a single raised voice, which cried "we don't want the thorns of Barabas - We want....."

HOLY SHROUD UNDERGOES SPACE AGE TESTS

* * * * *

American scientists using the latest techniques of the U.S. space program worked around the clock today to unravel the mysteries of an ancient piece of linen cloth revered by many as the burial shroud of Jesus Christ.

The 25 scientists, including IBM computer technicians and experts from the Jet Propulsion Laboratories in Pasadena, Calif., began their tests on the Shroud of Turin early Monday. They tentatively have been given four days to complete their work.

They are studying the Shroud in a second floor hall of Turin's 17th century royal palace complex in top secrecy, with police sentries manning the gates.

The shroud is a piece of linen 14 feet 3 inches long and 3 feet 7 inches wide. It bears the negative image of a bearded man who has apparently been crucified scourged with a whip, stabbed in the side and crowned with thorns.

Many Roman Catholics believe it was the burial shroud of Christ and that the image on it was produced by the radiance of his resurrection.

"Our aim is to discover what the image is composed of, its molecular structure and secondly, what formed it," said Kenneth Stevenson, an IBM computer scientist from Pittsburgh, who is acting as spokesman for the U.S. investigators.

Also among the American scientists examining the shroud are Donald Lynn, an image processing expert from the Jet Propulsion Laboratory, and scientists from Los Alamos Testing Laboratory.

The shroud has been shown to the public for the first time in 45 years this summer in an exhibition, in Turin's San Giovanni Cathedral, that ended Saturday. An estimated 3.33 million persons saw it during the 43 day display.

Tests being carried out on the shroud include x-ray and x ray fluorescence analysis, infrared thermal testing, spectroscopy, computer enhanced photographic analysis, mosaic photography and ultraviolet light examination.

Scientists were also carrying out "celluloid tape tests," in which a strip of magnetized tape is pressed on the surface of the shroud and lifted off for examination of particles removed.

The Rev. Peter Renaldi of Port Chester, N.Y. president of the U.S. Holy Shroud Guild, said the room where the shroud is being studied "looks like the control center for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration."

Also taking part in the tests is Prof. Max Frei, the Swiss criminologist who has studied pollen taken from the shroud for more than 12 years. He concluded the linen cloth is more than 2,000 years old and was once in ancient Palestine.

When the scientific experiments are completed, the shroud will be returned to its gold and silver case and locked in a chapel of Turin Cathedral where it has been held for the past 400 years.

NEBESIS OF EVIL ATTACKS FRAUD
WITH PEANUT BUTTER, JELLY

San Diego - Richard Pesta is not just another fat man in a caped crusader's outfit.

In the persona of Captain Sticky - Destroyer of evil, Supreme allied commander and chief of the World Organization of Evil Fighters - the 32 year old Pesta (Sticky to his friends) has been attacking evils he finds in consumer fraud for more than four years.

As a mild-mannered businessman, tired of what he saw as the oppression of the "little guy" he gave up his lucrative fiber-glass manufacturing business in Santa Ana, Calif., stuffing his 300 plus pounds into a bright blue jumpsuit, flung on a gold cape and set out to fight the forces of greed and corruption.

His first target was sub-standard nursing homes. Armed with a gun spewing 100 percent natural peanut butter and jelly Captain Sticky climbed into his sticky-mobile (a customized Lincoln Continental) (complete with bubble top and flags) and dashed off wherever informants reported shoddy conditions and abuses of the elderly.

Along the way, he provided authorities with information on possible insurance frauds in some pre-paid health plans, alleged mistreatment of patients in a publicly financed methadone program and poor conditions and abuses in several Southern California nursing homes.

But, a crusade does not run on peanut butter alone. Sticky had to turn commercial to finance his do-gooding - promoting the products of several large companies at department store openings, hosting a San Diego radio show called "Evil Fighters Hour" and producing a Captain Sticky comic book.

All the while, however, he continued to work closely with state legislatures, passing on information he gathered from his secret sources.

While most of his activities until recently have been confined to California, Sticky, who now operates out of San Diego is preparing to fight against evil nationwide.

"I want to go after the bigger and bigger fish, all the corrupt people in our society who are cheating and lying," he said.

To aid him in his nationwide campaign Sticky is constructing MARV (Mobile Attack Reconnaissance Vehicle) a 65 foot long, two story, computer operated vehicle complete with war room, quarters for a crew, steam room, disco and a television production studio that will be used to produce film reports exposing evil.

Sticky says he plans to finance his latest venture by the sale of Captain Sticky's Natural Peanut Butter.

But Stickymobiles, MARVs, and peanut butter notwithstanding, Sticky said he is involved in a very serious business - advocating consumer rights.

"People want to believe in a caped crusader," he explained, "someone who will stand up for the little guy. This thing is a lot of fun, and because it's fun it is 500 percent more effective. People really get involved."

WAGES OF EVIL ATTACKS FRAUD
WITH PEANUT BUTTER, JELLY

GOODS FROM RUINED STORE WERE TRASHED,
BUT SHOULD HAVE GONE TO POOR: PASTOR

** ** ** ** **

Manchester - Clothing and other merchandise cleared from the ruins of the K-mart store on Spencer Street are being tossed into the town dump while the area's needy have to do without, an area clergyman charged today.

Instead of hauling the bagged clothing which has lain on the shelves of the store for the past nine months, to the dump, the nationwide retail chain should have donated it to the Manchester Area Conference of Churches, which runs a "clothing pantry" the Rev. John Hollinger, rector of St. George Episcopal Church in Bolton, said.

With the start of the stores reconstruction this week, merchandise, equipment, and building materials have been plucked by crane from the stores shell and trucked to the landfill.

Hollinger charged that while poor people haven't had access to the bagged clothing, scavengers including some state employees who happened to be at the landfill when the merchandise was dropped were able to help themselves to it.

Landfill foreman Walter Kaszowski confirmed that several scavengers had picked over the clothing and other merchandise that has been hauled from the K-Mart store.

"We don't really encourage them, but if they want, they're welcome to it," Kaszowski said.

"Why the hell should this happen?" Hollinger asked this morning. "I suppose there's a tax advantage in dumping it, but it seems to me there could be a better sensitivity among area businesses towards the needs of the poor."

Hollinger says he also plans to speak with other clergymen in the Conference of Churches to find out whether the store's owners can be persuaded to donate any clothing still in the store or recover any of it that has already been hauled to the dump.

But most of the merchandise already dumped has been buried by bulldozers, Kaszowski said.

The clergymen who lives in Vernon, said he was bringing the dumping of the stores wares to public attention because, "maybe guilt is the only way of converting them"

The K-mart stores roof collapsed in January, on the same night that the roof of the Hartford Civic Center's coliseum caved in. A second roof collapse occurred at the store several weeks later.

Because different insurance companies covered the store at the times of the two roof collapses, representatives of the shopping center's and store's owners and the insurers wrangled for months over settling the calamity's cost.

In the meantime, the merchandise on the store's shelves last January continued to sit in the derelict building, sparking complaints from other merchants in that mall that the K-mart building was a health nuisance and rife with vermin.

The insurance coverage was settled last month, and the first equipment from contractors hired to rebuild the store arrived at the shopping center last Friday to start work.

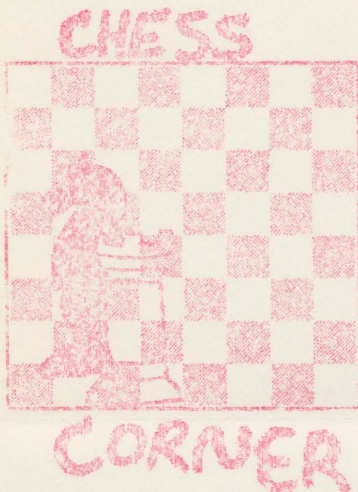

Men confined in prison take to chess as a duck will to water. It's a game of productiveness; therein lies its peculiar charm. Intellectual productiveness is one of the greatest joys of life.

The game fascinates all colors and creeds. Learn the rudiments and you're well on your way to discovery of regions unexplored. Psychologists say that the effects of this game on people is, on the whole, good, and far better than that of competitive sports. For that reason its teaching should be encouraged. Certainly it trains men and women in such desirable traits as attentiveness, logical thinking and organized thinking, besides developing a sense of justice, an element which games of chance are not likely to arouse.

When two men are in battle over the board, one sure fact is that they are not planning to escape or to become destructible; they are both in a world by themselves mind against mind.
