

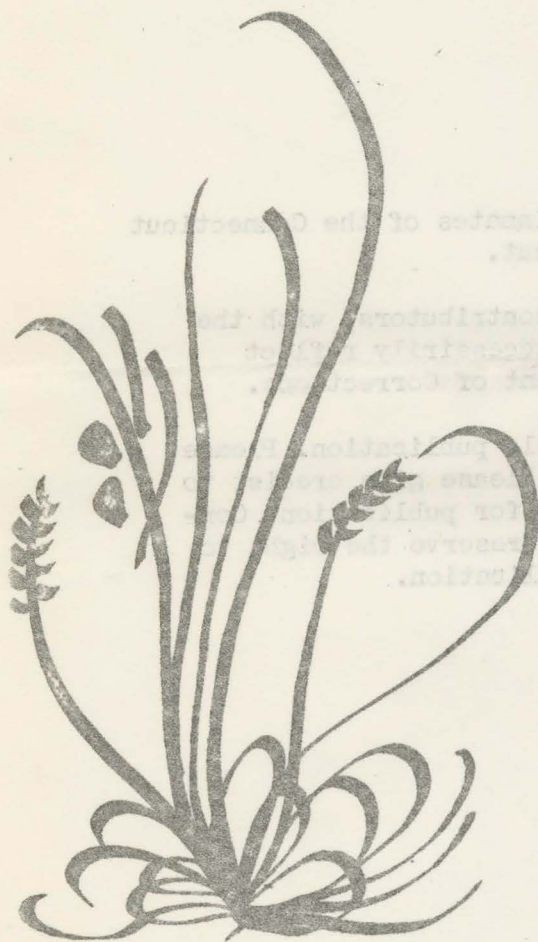

CALLIGRAPHY

Calligraphy, meaning "beautiful writing", is witnessing a renaissance all over the U.S. People seem to want quality and beauty again in their lives. We search for a means to slow down, relax, to escape the boring existence of prison life. Calligraphy as a hobby in prison offers this and more. It is a creative approach to solving ones anxiety about many things common to prisoners, from worry over loved ones to the noise of prison life. The concentration, determination, patience and practice it requires affords you little room to dwell on negatives, at least for the time you're working on your calligraphy. It is, or can be, a form of meditation.

Calligraphy is an art that is as old as recorded history but was almost lost with the advent of typeset, printing and typewriters. A lot of people are interested in hand lettered things, especially personalized note cards, posters, menus, signs, stationary and the like. In prison it can help supplement your pay by selling your calligraphy at the Prison Store in Bloomfield or out front in the showcase in the visitors waiting room.

Calligraphy, always equated as an art form, was also an essential part of the Muslim way of life. Women and men practice their penmanship with patience, for their religion required them to copy the Koran at least once during their lives. The art of beautiful writing is an art of enjoyment and patience. Yet, one does not need to be artistically inclined to become a good calligrapher. It is much like coming into Somers never before having played handball, after a month or so you find yourself beating many of the players that used to run you ragged around the court. Like anything, it requires practice, but that practice offers you something that is at a premium in prison.....relaxation. It's great to listen to music while you practice. It gives you a good rhythm and flow as you write. When done properly, calligraphy teaches you good posture and breathing. You learn to adopt a slow comfortable pace.

The art of beautiful writing requires only a small financial investment. A good Osmiroid or Platignum pen costs from eight to ten dollars. These pens are recommended by professional calligraphers and permanent or water soluble inks are only a few dollars.

You may choose almost any surface to write on, that is the freedom of the art. You will need a large practice pad that will cost about five dollars.

There are many books on the subject and the library here at CCIS carries some excellent ones. Mr. Rosa will be glad to locate them for you. Two books that are highly recommended are "Speedball Textbook for Pen and Ink Lettering - 20th Edition, and Calligraphic Lettering by the late Ralph Douglass, \$8.95. Both can be ordered through the library and supplies like ink, paper, pens, etc. can be ordered through the school or left by visitors but be sure to obtain prior approval from Mr. Jones at the school.

there are clubs that can be joined and on a separate page I list some of them. Calligraphy is indeed well suited for prisoners since it doesn't require elaborate equipment or a lot of space, can be done in your cell and keeps your creative instinct alive. It will teach you a lot as you delve into literature for something to letter. Shakespeare, Emerson, Gibran, Plato,...calligraphy adds a beauty to the words of the men. Women especially love receiving cards, etc. from their men, knowing how much time and work went into your labor of love. FAMILY VISITING PROGRAM

Applications are now being accepted for this program. All inmates who have served a minimum of one (1) year from their sentence date are eligible for participation in this program.

Send Inmate request Form to Family Visiting Co-ordinator, Mr. Steven Tozier.
Include with your request all of the following information:

- A. Your sentence and sentencing date.
- B. To whom you are requesting to visit with and their relationship to you.
- C. Town, State and Zip Code of visitor.
- D. Telephone Number of visitor.
- E. Birthdate of all visitors requested.

In view of the sensitivity of the implementation of the Family Visiting Program, the first three (3) scheduled visiting days for the family visiting program will accommodate an extended visit between parents and Inmate only; There after all authorized family members will be scheduled.

The method for determining placement on the waiting list for this program will be based on length of time served in sentence status. For the first (3) visits only an Inmate may waive his place on the waiting list.

All inmates in non-voluntary administrative segregation and punitive segregation will not be eligible for the program.

Those inmates presently receiving furloughs or gain furlough approval will not be eligible for the Family Visiting Program.

Inmates who have been found "Guilty" in a disciplinary hearing will be denied Family Visiting Privileges for the following periods:

- Class "A" Infractions- 6 months from conviction
- Class "B" Infractions- 4 months from conviction

AUTHORIZED VISITORS

Family visits are limited to immediate family members only; immediate family is defined as, inmate's legal spouse, children of a legal marriage, natural parents, grandparents, step-parents by virtue of a legal marriage to the inmate's parent in the inmate's formative years. Common-law marriages will not be recognized as meeting criteria for participation in this program. Brothers and sisters are not eligible for participation in family visiting.

Regardless of immediate relationship, persons under the age of eighteen (18) years, other than the inmate's wife, will not be permitted family visits without the presence of another adult family member.

Inmates from other institutions will not be allowed family visiting. Victims of the offense will not be allowed to participate in family visiting under any circumstances. Only one (1) inmate will be allowed to participate in the family visit at one time. No brothers or fathers and sons will be allowed combined family visits. Immediate family on parole or probation will be allowed to visit, with notice sent to the Parole or Probation Officer.

PROGRAMA DE VISITAS FAMILIARES

Actualmente se esta recibiendo solicitudes para este programa. Todo preso que haya servido un minimo de un (1) año desde la fecha de su sentencia esta elegible para participar en este programa.

Mande una Formula de solicitud de Preso al Coordinador de Visitas Familiares, el Sr. Steven Tozier. Incluya en su solicitud toda la informacion siguiente:

- A. Su sentencia y la fecha en que fue sentenciado.
- B. Con quienes usted esta solicitando la visita, y el parentesco que tienen con usted.
- C. Ciudad, estado, y numero de zona (Zip Code) del visitante.
- D. Numero de telefono del visitante.
- E. Fecha de nacimiento de cada visitante solicitado.

En visita de la sencibilidad de la implementacion del Programa de Visitas Familiares, los primeros Tres dias de vista catalogadas. Seran pala una visita entre Los padres y el preso unicamente. Despues de eso todas los miembros de Familia autorizados seran puestos en la lista de espera.

El Metodo para determinar colocacion en la lista de espera para el programa, sera determinado en el tiempo servido desde la Fecha de sentencia. Para las las primeras tres visitas solamente, el preso puede renunciar su lugar en la lista de espera.

Todos los presos en segregacion administrativa involuntaria y segregacion punitiva no estaran elegibles para el programa.

Todos aquellos presos que actualmente estan recibiendo pases p que reciben aprobacion para no estarna elegibles para el programa de Visitas Familiares.

Todo preso que haya sido encontrado "Culpable" en una audiencia disciplinaria perdera los privilegios de Visitas Familiares durante los siguientes plazos:

- Infracciones Class "A" - 6 meses desde la conviccion
- Infracciones Clase "B" - 4 meses desde la conviccion.

Visitantes Autorizados

Las visitas familiares se limitan unicamente a miembros de la familia inmediata; la familia inmediata se defina como, la esposa legal del preso, hijos de un matrimonio legal, los padres naturales, abuelos, padrestro o madrastra por medio de un matrimonio legal con la madre o el padre del preso durante sus años de crianza. No se reconoceran matrimonios informales (common law)) para los criterios de participacion en este programa. Hermanos del preso no estan elegibles para participar en las visitas familiares.

Sea cual sea el parentesco de familia inmediata, ninguna persona menor de dieciocho (18) años, excepto la esposa del preso, podra tener visitas familiares sin la presencia de otro miembro adulto de la familia.

No se permiten visitas con presos de otras instituciones. No se permitiran en ningunas circunstancias visitas familiares con victimas de la ofensa. Solamente un (1) preso podra participar en la visita familiar a la vez. No podran combinar visitas familiares hermanos o padres e hijos. Miembros de la familia inmediata que estan en libertad gajo palabra o probatoria podran visitar, con un aviso mandado al oficial de Libertad Bajo Palabra o Probatoria.

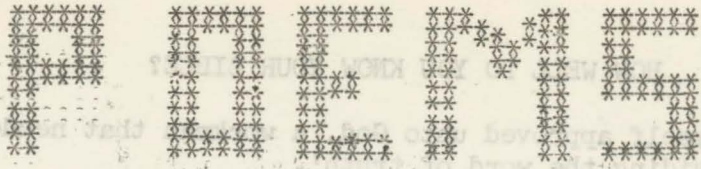
