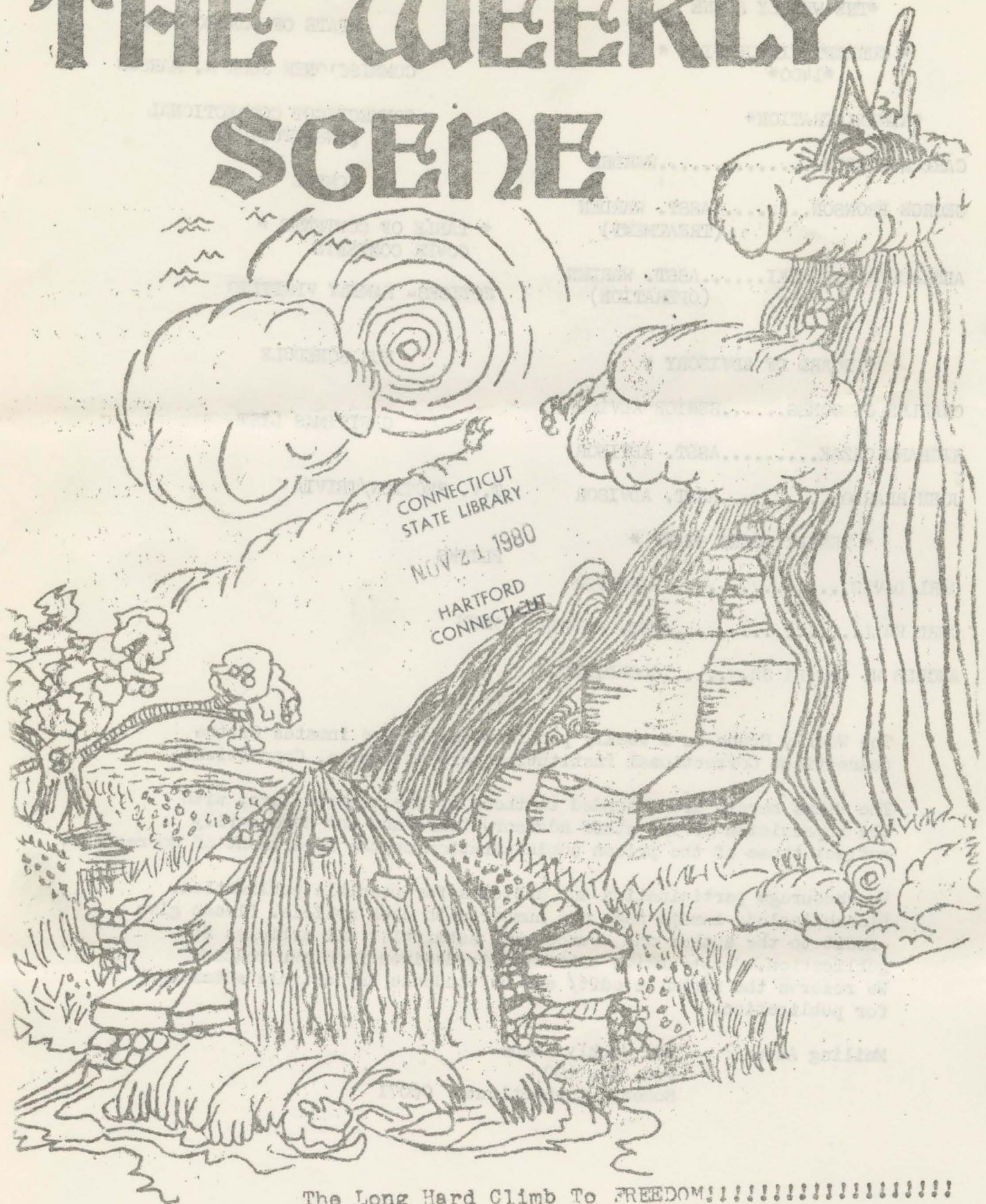

# Family Visiting Program

There have been many questions regarding this program. The following is intended to clarify some of them.

- 1) For the 1st 3 days that the program is in operation, the visits will be between eligible inmates and their parents; There after all authorized family members will be scheduled.
- 2) The method for determining placement on the list for a family visit will be based on length of time served in sentence status and the date your application is recieved by Program- Co-ordinator.
- 3) All inmates in non-voluntary administrative segregation and punitive segregation will not be eligible for the program.
- 4) Those inmates presently recieving furloughs or gain furlough approval will not be eligible for the Family Visiting Program.
- 5) Inmates who have been found "guilty" in a disiplinary hearing will be denied Family Visiting Priviledges for the following periods.

Class A Infractions- 6months from conviction

Class B Infractions- 4 months from conviction

If you have any further questions in regards to the Family Visiting Program or wish to apply for a extended family visit. Send a Inmate Request form to Mr. Steven Tozier. If requesting a visit include the following information:

- A) Your sentence and sentencing date.
- B) To whom you are requesting to visit with and their relationship to you.
- C) Town, State and Zip Code of visitor.
- D) Telephone Number of visitor.
- E) Birthdate of all visitors requested.

## BUS SERVICE FROM NEW HAVEN

The People's Bus provides transportation for families and friends of prisoners to Somers and Enfield prisons twice monthly. The busing program is operated by prisoners' families at a cost which covers the expense of hiring a bus and driver.

### Schedule

Twice a month, on the first and third Saturday of each month,  
NOTE: If there are five Saturdays in a month, there is no extra trip. Also, if either of these Saturdays falls on a State holiday, the bus does not operate. If it snows, the bus trip will be automatically cancelled. Listen to WELI or WAVZ radio stations for cancellation notices, if it snows or storms.

The trip takes about two hours each way.

Reservations must be made. Call the First Methodist Church (324-1323) or N.E.O.N. (853-3403). Reservations are on a first-come-first served basis. A wait-list is maintained. NOTICE: Reservations must be reconfirmed a day or two before the trip by calling the Church or N.E.O.N

Seldom will there be a space for more than one trip a month, per person. Don't come unless you have made a reservation and have had it confirmed. There are only ten spaces from Stamford and four from Norwalk.

On the Monday before the trip no more reservations are received. On that Monday, the wait-list names are used. Children must ride on a parent's lap, if at all possible. If the child is too grown, you must indicate the need of a seat for your child when you make your reservation

FOOD: Bring your own snack, drinks; or bring money for a short stop-off at a fast food place after visiting the prison.

CHARGE: There is no charge. Nobody will be left behind because they do not have any money. However, it is hoped that each passenger will try to contribute \$6.00 to \$7.00 for each seat. This will help to meet the high costs.

ARRIVE HOME: Van usually arrives back in the Norwalk/Stamford area before 5:00 P.M.

Please do not smoke in the van.

## CHRISTMAS PACKAGES

Christmas packages may be mailed or delivered in the course of regular visits to men confined in C.C.I. Somers by family and friends ON THEIR APPROVED VISITING LIST, from November 28, 1980, through January 2, 1981 subject to the following conditions:

1. There will be a limit of one package from each person on the inmate's approved visiting list.
2. All packages must have the following information VERY CLEARLY written (Please use permanent marker or ink) on the outside:

Inmate's Name and Number  
Connecticut Correctional Institution, Somers  
P. O. Box 100  
Somers, Connecticut 06071

and complete name and address of the sender.

3. All packages are subject to inspection and all unauthorized items or excessive quantities of approved items will be returned to the sender at the inmate's expense or donated to a charitable organization.
4. Homemade cookies, cakes, candies, and other homemade items are not approved.
5. Items sealed in metal cans or tins are not approved.
6. Items may be sent in glass containers. However, these containers must not exceed the size of one quart and must bear the commercial merchandiser's label.
7. The following items are approved for Christmas packages or gifts and no other items of any nature will be accepted.

### FOOD

Crackers, popcorn, lump sugar, peanut butter, marshmallow fluff, jams, honey, jellies, candy, cookies, cheese, pickles, olives, nuts without shell, instant coffee, Pream (or other cream substitutes), instant tea, instant soup, instant cocoa, Tang, Kool-Aid, instant breakfasts, dry cereals, instant hot cereals, commercial cakes, and commercially packaged doughnuts. Only fresh fruit will be permitted; no dried or candied fruit. No meats are permitted except pepperoni, Slim Jims, pickled pigs feet, pickled sausage, and pickled herring. Small bottles only of steak sauce, mustard, ketchup, horseradish, cheese dips in plastic containers.

### TOBACCO AND MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

Cigars, cigarettes, tobacco, and pipes in reasonable amounts. Electric shavers (non-battery type), wristwatches with a retail value not exceeding \$50.00, sunglasses, puzzles, and Tupperware containers, maximum three (3).

PAQUETES NAVIDEÑOS

Los paquetes navideños pueden mandarse por correo o bien pueden entregarse durante cualquier visita a los reclusos en esta institución, durante la temporada festiva desde el 28 de noviembre de 1980 hasta el 2 de enero de 1981, con las siguientes limitaciones:

3. Todo paquete estará sujeto a inspección y todo artículo no autorizado o cantidades excesivas de artículos autorizados serán devueltos al remitente a costo del recluso, o serán donados a una organización caritativa.
4. Galletas, bizcochos, pasteles o dulces hechos en casa, u otros productos caseros no serán permitidos.
5. Productos enlatados en botes metálicos no se aceptarán.
6. Artículos pueden mandarse en frascos de cristal. Sin embargo, el tamaño de estos frascos será limitado a un cuarto de galón o menos y deben llevar la etiqueta comercial de la fábrica o de la tienda.
7. Los siguientes artículos son aceptables para los paquetes navideños o regalos, y ningún otro artículo de ninguna especie será permitido.

COMESTIBLES

Galletas, palomas, turrón de azúcar, crema de cacahuete, bombón (marshmallow fluff), miel, conservas, jaleas, dulces, bizcochos, queso, pepinos, aceitunas, nueces sin cáscara, café instantáneo, Pream (u otros sustitutos de crema para café), té instantáneo, sopa instantánea, chocolate instantáneo, Jugos, refrescos y licuados en polvo, tales como "Tang", "Kool-Aid", y los "desayunos instantáneos", pasteles comerciales cereales secos, cereales calientes instantáneos, y donas comercialmente empaquetados. Sólo fruta fresca será permitida; no se permitirán frutas disecadas o azucaradas. No se permitirán carnes con excepción de pepperoni, salchichas Slim Jims, o patas de puerco. Frascos pequeños únicamente de salsa para bistec, mostaza, catsup, salsa de rábano, salsas de queso en envase de plástico.

TABACO Y MISCELANEA

Cigarros, cigarrillos, tabaco y pipas en cantidades razonables. Rizadoras eléctricas (que no usen baterías), relojes de pulsera cuyo valor no pasa de \$50.00, lentes oscuros, rompecabezas, y recipientes "Tupperware", hasta un límite de tres (3).

CLOTHING

sweaters (dark shade, single color, zippers and turtlenecks permissible pajamas, long underwear, white only, slippers, handball gloves, and shoes. Shoes are required to have rubber heels and no large buckles. Shoes must not exceed six (6) inches in height, measured from the top of the heel. (Heels cannot exceed one inch in height.) NOTE: All shoes must be mailed by the store where they were purchased.

NOTE: We would appreciate it very much if you would package the above items in cardboard boxes.


MONEY

Persons on the approved visiting list may send money in reasonable amounts in the form of Postal Money Orders, Bank Cashier Checks, Commercial Money Orders or Certified Checks. Personal checks are not acceptable.

Since all perishable items must be consumed by January 31, 1981, it is respectfully suggested that said items be sent in reasonable amounts. Your assistance and co-operation in following the above indicated regulations will permit us to deliver your gifts without undue delay.

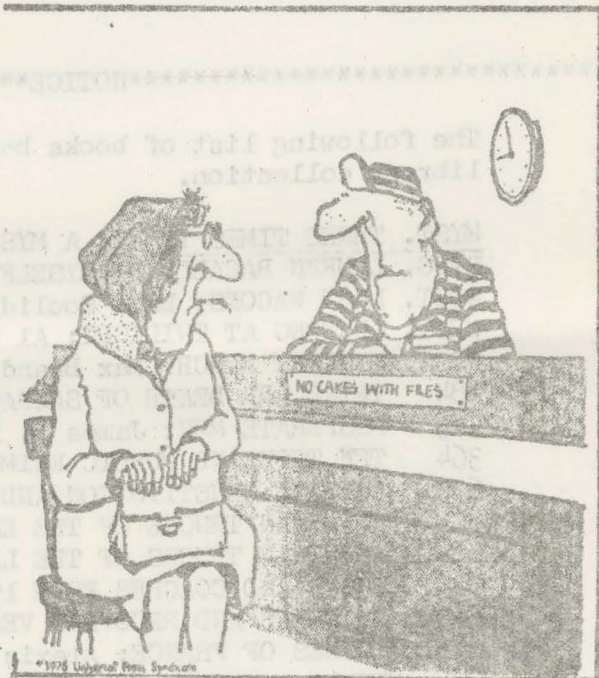
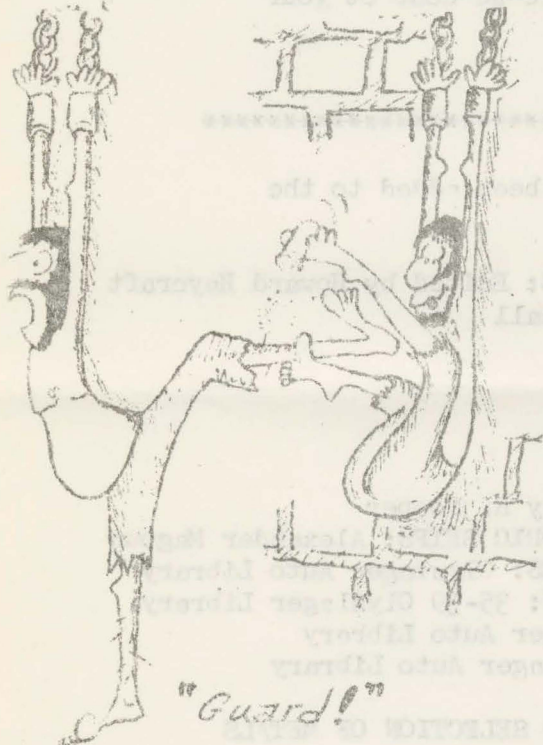

During his lifetime Tom Horn help build a railroad, drove a stagecoach, served in Cuba with Teddy Roosevelt, worked for the Pinkerton Agency and, as a U.S. Cavalry scout, captured Geronimo. Unfortunately, none of this is in the movie "Tom Horn," which covers the last days of Horn's life.

Hired by cattlemen in Wyoming to rid the area of rustlers, he is given the freedom to do it in any way necessary. But it's the 1900s and the cattlemen are becoming more interested in politics than the ways of the Old West, so they begin to fear Horn's effective but violent methods may cause a scandal. To get him out of the way they frame him for the murder of a young shepherd.

The unlikely premise is that Wells actually constructed the time machine he wrote about in his novel of the same name. He is about to test it when a physician friend of his—who turns out to be Jack the Ripper—escapes from the police and 1893 London to 1979 San Francisco via the vehicle.

It's a thin plot to be sure, but clever scripting by Meyers has beefed it all up. Inserted is a sensitive romance between Wells and a young bank executive (Mary Steenburgen) that is handled splendidly. And lots of fun results from the run-ins 19th century Wells has with 20th century Frisco, including see-through jeans, Hare Krishna followers, Big Macs (at a restaurant he describes as a pleasant Scottish pub) and traffic jams, to name just a few. The possibilities were endless.
