

NEW YORK—Nashville isn't the only place that celebrated country music month in October. The Port Authority here staged a three-day series of concerts spotlighting country performers in its main concourse of the new extension building.

The shows were held Oct. 22-24 from 4-6 p.m. daily, with artists El-wood Bunn and his Down Yonder group, Rockytop from Manhattan, and Rhonda Mattern with the City Squares, who performed a square dance exhibition. All shows were free to the public.

### Bonneville Will Tape Special Country Events

NEW YORK—It seems everyone is getting into country radio these days. Bonneville Broadcast Consultants, which is best known for its syndication of beautiful music, is introducing special event country music shows.

During Country Music week in Nashville (Oct. 13 to 18) the Tenafly, N.J.-based company introduced "An American Country Holiday," two four-hour country specials, one for Christmas and one for New Year's Day.

The American Country Christmas will include holiday music and interviews with such country stars as Willie Nelson, Waylon Jennings, Barbara Mandrell, Eddy Arnold, Tom T. Hall, Oak Ridge Boys, Jerry Clower and the Statier Bros.

Bonneville is mailing demo records and promotional material to more than 2,000 stations. The show is hosted by Kris Kane and is produced by Bonneville's Cross Country Communications with consultation by Dick Broderick, former Country Music Assn. chairman, and Brad McCuen, former president of the Country Music Foundation.

## **Guccione Starts Penthouse Records**

LOS ANGELES—Penthouse Records Ltd. is the newly formed addition to editor/publisher Bob Guccione's empire of Penthouse, Omni and Forum magazines.

Heading up the new Penthouse label is Barney Ales, former president of Motown Records and more recently Elton John's Rocket Records.

His top priorities include marketing and setting up independent domestic and foreign distribution.

Penthouse Records' first release will be the soundtrack from the '17.5 million film "Caliqula," written by Toni Biggs. The two-record set features the single "We are One" and the "Caligula" love theme in ballad and dance versions performed by a vocalist named Lydia.

Guccione says, "The new label is in response to inquiries from people who want to buy the soundtrack of 'Caligula'."

According to Ales, "We already have orders for 100,000 records."

"Caligula," a controversial film, has played New York, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Boston, Portland and Chicago.

Produced by Guccione, the movie has also been successful in France, Germany, Switzerland, Belgium, Holland and Japan.

The effects of computers on the world are almost limitless. They help researchers to analyze data more rapidly than ever befor. They speed business transactions, banking, world trade, navigation, learning, airplane reservations, car rentals and paychecks. They are used more recently for weather forecasting, curing diseases, diagnosing illnesses, controlling traffic signals (in some places), automating factories and assembly lines, analizing substances, and thousands of other jobs requiring long calculations and fast decision making.

Space program developements for checking the physical conditions of the astronauts led to many medical inventions, including automatic equipment to monitor patients at hospitals. Some of the rocks from the moon contained substances unknown to us. Careful experimentation on those rocks led to important discoveries in medicine, chemistry, physics, metalurgy, alloy smelting and refining, and crystals. Observations made from telescopes in orbit have made clearer shapes, sizes, and distances to other galaxies, as well as speeds of motion of these collections of stars. Equipment left on the moon sends us signals about the changing shapes and sizes of our continents, also helping to eventually predict earthquakes.

Anst about energy? Solar cells were developed for extracting the sun's energy for NASA. Now, they may turn out to help solve some of our energy needs. Fuel cells were also a MASA invention and generate energy and pure water at the same time. Insulation technology took some giant steps when NASA began work on heat-shields for returning spacecraft. Bearing technology developed by NASA is now used to make car transmissions operate more efficiently.

And, of course, NASA's strive for better nutrition made us all more aware of our eating habits and brought us TANG. What else did all of these discoveries do? They increased our standard of living and made jobs. That helped our economy, trade, and national strength.

Now, NASA's budget is one-quarter what it was in the 60's. Half as many people work for NASA, and, since they are'nt spending as much money for equipment, less people are employed at the companies that built that equipment. For example, United Technologies has one-third of the people working on space equipment now, than it had in 1969. Where are those other people? Helping to crowd the unemployment lines, and taking jobs away from still other people.

Space exploration can help solve many of the problems facing the United States. In the short-run, it can create jobs. In the long-run, space platforms can be built to beam energy to Earth and help solve the energy shortage. Asteroids, the moon and other Planets can be mined for valuable metals and other materials. Atomic waste can be transported into space and shot into the Sun, where it will be consumed. Complex and difficult chemical reactions can be carried out faster in the weightlessness of space and sid in development of cures for many diseases, including cancer.

The possibilities are endless, just as they were in 19-1 when John Kennedy announced goals for the space program. Who would have imagined that someday watches would display the time digitally, or that ovens would cook food with microwaves, or that a hand-held device with many buttons could be purchased for under \$100. to solve math problems or balance checkbooks...




