# There's new clout behind the drive for brison reform in US

## Atlanta

For years calls for prison reform have been led by persons considered liforal and, sometimes, as "soft on crime."
and seldom described in either of those tarms, has called the nation's prison system "expensive," "stupld," and out of the "18th century."

Hardly had he presented his call for reform when two prison riots occurred earlier this month - one in Louisiana and the other in Washington State - further underscoring the need for change.

To add further "momentum" to reform efforts, the US Deparimeat of Justice has issued tisa first comprehensive standards for prisons and jails.

Meanwinte, a US cistrict judge in Texas has declared that state's prison system, largest in the nation, unconstitutional. In his dectaion, Judge Wiliam Justice cited the use of prisoners to cuaell disturbances by other prisoners, overcrowded cells, and payless labor.

Texas prison officials did not deny that their system is overcrowded, according to a spokesman. But hey are nonetheiess likely to appeal the decision.

The Texas decision is "probably the most important prison case" yet decided by a federal court, says Willam Nagel of the nonprofit American Foundation, whicti seeks prison reform. If upheld, he says, the decision will provide a precedent for suits in other states calling for reduced nolse in cell blocks, better recreational facilities and opportunities, and more space and privacy; among other changes.

The new Justice Department standards call for 30 to 80 square feet of space per inmate - more than duble what many Texas prisoners have, Nagel says.

The standards will help state corrections commissioners when they seek additional funds from their legislatures, he says. He also applauds the remarks by Chief Justice Burger.

Says Nagel: "Nobody ever considered Burger to be soft on crime, or a wide-yed liberal - andohe's saying the same things we're saying."

In his yearend review of the criminal justice system, Burger stressed the need íor prison reforms. "To put people behind walls and bars and do little or nothing to change them is to win a battle but lose a war," he said.

In recent years, both federal and state prison systems have made it easier for prisoner complaints to be heard. And organizations have been set up to help ex-offenders Kind jobs.

But most prisons remain in what officials consider dangerously overcrowded conditions, and most states are hardpressed to find construction funds for new facilities.

Reformers continue to suggest that less expensive alternattves be used, such as greater use of probation and halfway houses, the residents of which may work or attend classes.

Other new Justice Department standards cover inmate access to the courts and communication, health faclities, and rules of disclpline and their fair enforcement.

Nationally, however, court orders for prison changes are seldom carried out rapldly. A court-appointed monitor of the Georgia State Prison at Reidsville reported Jan. 6 that many changes ordered in 1976 still have not been made. As a result, the monitor said, the prison remaing "volitlle."

They have come trom all waiks of life, including from those who are in prisun. The kind letters from prisons especially warmed my heart.

I thank you for sending your checks to Spirit foundation, It came in 50 cents, one dollars, five dollars, and has now reached 100 thousand dollars in total. John and I kept the Spirit Foundation statf to the minimum: John, I and a iawyer friend. All three of us, naturaily, were unpaid. All expenses were paid out of John's and ry own pockets. Since there is no reson to change this good system now or ever in the future, your money, every penny of it plus the interest it generates will go straight to the people in need at the end of the yeax. In order to maintain the simple and effective operation, Spirit Foundation has not and vill not suthorize or participate in any outside activity or merchandising.

I thank you for your concern for prople who are making money on Jobn's nape after his death. There are some of you who feel quility about recelviag paychecks for the lemon articles you have uritten for the media. Do not feel quilty. Feople who wish to do business in a shall scale in tribute to Joha, using bis name but in good taste: you have my biessings. Remember, John wes a man with a great sense of humor and understanding. "Whatever gets you through your ilfe," he would say. He would have felt better that you had a nice meal on hira than if you had wallowed in quilt. Spend well for your children and loved ones. If there is any lest, give to the ones who are in need. Do nut ask for my authoxiaation of your ventures, though, since it wili be unfair to give to one and not to the others. Individuals and orporations who wish to exploit John's name in a large scale: I ask your voluntary act to report to me of your intentions and plans, respecting the feelings and legal rights of bis family, and make arraigements to satisfy them.

I thank you for your feeling of anger for John's death, I share your anger. I am angry at myself for not having been able to protect dohn. I ain angry at sind at all of us for allowing our society to fall spart to this extent. The only "revenge" that would mean anything to us, is to turn the society around in time, to one that is based on love and trust as John felt it could be. The only solace is sbow that it could be done, that we could create a world of peace on earth for eachother and for our children.

If all of us just loved and cared for one person each. That is all it takes. Love breeds love. Maybe then, we will be able to prevent eachother from going insane. Maybe then, we will be sble to prevent eachother from becoming violent, as violence is in our hearts and not in the weapons. Guilt is not in the one who pulls the trigger, but in each of us who ailows it.

When John fell right beside me, I felt, like we were in a guerilla war, not knowing who or where the enemy was. I kept telling my staff, who were hiding razors and newspaper articles from me, to show me everytbing: every telegram, every letter and every message. I was in the dark. I had to know. I saw the death photo. John looked peaceful, Like in the kack of the Imagine cover. Are you trying to tell me something, John? I saw the photo where be signed the autograph. It was flashed on the TV again and again.

Somehow that photo was haxder for me to look at than the death photo. Joha was in a hurry that aftermoon. He did not have to give his autograph but he did, while the man watched hirn, the man who was to bettray Joha Later. I looked at the photo. I noticed that it was the photograph shown on TV where John's head was bent forward, obviously to sign bis name eut it was a strange posture for John to show. Then I realized that he was slgning for the gate of heaven.

John and I believed that we were one mind takiag two bodies at this time "for comveniences" and it's more fung ss he put it. Lately, we were calling ourselves "the group," because of the recording. "I like both or you," he used to tease me. Fox the past five years, I was working dounstairs in my uflice during the day, snd John, upstaixs in the apartment. Now I an still downstairs and be is in the big upstairs.

I Pelt that I owed this letter to you. This may not answer is 21 your questions but it is the best I can do now. This is also in place of giving interviews, personal appearances, and private talks which many of you have asked for. I would like to have sone time to myself

An extremely effective excursion into the realm of the supernatural, this Rangoon production combines the best elements of "The Haunting" and "The Legend of Hell House."
