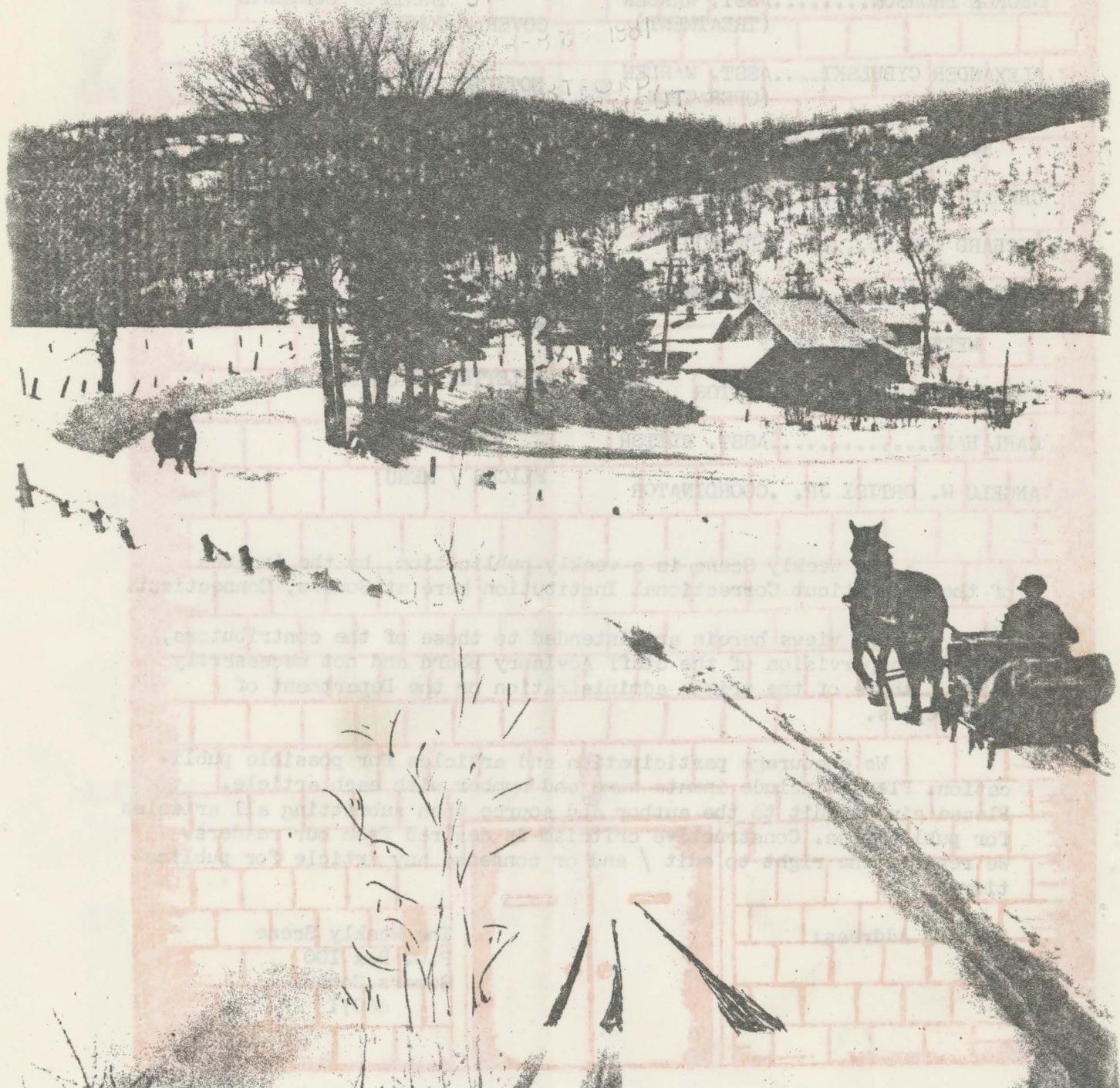

# THE LORD'S PRAYER

PART I

Matthew 6: 9-13 and Luke II: 1-12

The Lord's Prayer is the model true of prayer "after this manner," etc. ; "when ye pray, say," etc. It lays down the lines on which we should frame our petitions; removes the distance and ceremoniousness of our approach to God; counteracts the selfishness of our desire and enlargens our horizon so as to comprehend the welfare of the whole world. It was given by Christ to his disciples on two different occasions: the first in connection with the sermon on the Mount; the second after two years, when the disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray.

It is the Ten Commandments turned into prayer, the commandments to keep God's law being converted into prayer to enable us to keep that law. There is striking correspondence between each clause of the Lord's Prayer and one of the commandments, and the order in which they mutually occur.

It consists, first, of an invocation or made of address to God. The word "our" indicates the great change which introduced into the whole conception of worship. There was no social worship in the Jewish Temple. The priest went alone into the holy place while the people stood outside. But in the Christian Church the worship of God is for all the people, with one heart and one voice; and in private prayer we cannot be accepted if we come in a selfish and exclusive spirit.

Our "father" the relation as God as a father to all men alike by creation and providence; but it is by the grace of God rights maker, sovereign, proprietor- "thy name", "thy Kingdom", "thy will" and then it goes on to the recognition of man's needs- our debts, our temptations, and our deliverance. The essence of sin is the inversion of this divine order, putting the creature first and the creator last, giving precedence to man's need over God's rights.

"Hallowed be thy name" teaches us that as children we are to treat with a holy love and fear the name and relation of father in which we stand to God.

"thy Kingdom come" is a petition that god's reign of righteousness and peace and joy may be set up in our hearts, and that we may be able to extend it by our character, conduct, and work in the world around.

"Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven" shows to us that god's will is the highest ultimate good of all his creatures; that all his laws has been devised to bring about this result; and that in proportion as we obey this will is our true welfare promoted. When our will and the Father's are absolutely one, we shall know that all things work for our god.

"Give us this day our daily bread" At first sight referring to the most urgent want of man, we find that this petition is only one of several others; not the first as the most important, not the last as the longest remembered, but enclosed among those which refer to spiritual things, to the establishment of god's Kingdom and the overthrow of Satan's. If we hallow god's name and submit to his reign and seek to do his will. Then we can with confidence ask him for blessing which our natural life requires for it's support and welfare. God gives us that for which we ourselves have to toil; not arbitrarily

# "DRUGS" WHAT THEY CAN DO TO YOU!

Part 1

ALCOHOL depresses the central nervous system, slowing heart rate, brain activity and circulation. Moderate amounts produce feelings of gregariousness, relaxation and well-being; larger amounts impair judgment and produce belligerence. Tolerance is based on body weight, metabolism and experience of the drinker. Women's tolerance is particularly low during menstrual periods, University of Oklahoma studies have shown.

Large amounts of alcohol consumed over many years damage the brain, liver and circulatory system. Heavy drinkers often also suffer malnutrition because of bad eating habits.

NICOTINE is associated with cancer of the lung, larynx and mouth, and with heart disease, bronchitis and emphysema. Heavy use also depresses the sex drive, according to Dr. Alton Ochsner of the Ochsner Clinic, New Orleans. Heavy-smoking mothers suffer more miscarriages and stillbirths than non-smokers. Short-term, nicotine stimulates the nervous system. It constricts the blood vessels, increasing blood pressure and the respiratory rate.

CAFFEINE, in moderate amounts, is used to increase alertness and improve psychomotor coordination. Stay-awake pills (concentrated caffeine) are often used by students to cram for exams. Long-term use may contribute, to the development of gastric ulcers and to circulatory problems.

AMPHETAMINES, taken orally, suppress appetite and improve alertness. Medically, they are used to treat narcolepsy (a condition characterized by an abnormal need for sleep) and as diet pills, with indifferent success. Athletes use them to reduce fatigue and improve performance. Amphetamines injected directly into the bloodstream, and lumped together as "speed", provide a "kick" and produce a manic high. They are often used in a run of several days of repeated injections and produce hallucinations and paranoia, including savage violence. Long-term effects include psychosis, malnutrition, exhaustion and heart and brain damage.

BARBITURATES, like alcohol, are depressants and have medical use as sedatives. Phenobarbital, secobarbital and pentobarbital induce sleep, slow circulation and reduce blood pressure. Effects of heavy use resemble those of alcohol, including unsteady gait, slurred speech and poor coordination; driving a car is risky. They may cause long-term liver and brain damage.

TRANQUILIZERS, especially Valium and Librium, are prescribed medically to reduce tension and anxiety and to combat psychosomatic disorders. They depress the central nervous system, relax tense muscles and induce a period of calm. Long-term effects are not established.

MARIJUANA ("POT"), and other forms of cannabis, including hashish, are difficult to classify. When smoked, marijuana causes a relaxed feeling, loss of inhibition, hilarity and disorders of time and space perception. Driving a car after use is risky. Long-range effects are in dispute.

Marijuana has been implicated in disorders of the immune system in causing birth defects, and in reducing levels of the male hormone testosterone, but the findings have been questioned. Most doctors advise expectant mothers not to use marijuana during pregnancy.

# There's new clout behind the drive for prison reform in US

For years calls for prison reform have been led by persons considered liberal and, sometimes, as "soft on crime."

Now Warren E. Burger, Chief Justice of the United States and seldom described in either of those terms, has called the nation's prison system "expensive," "stupid," and out of the "19th century."

Hardly had he presented his call for reform when two prison riots occurred earlier this month — one in Louisiana and the other in Washington State — further underscoring the need for change.

To add further "momentum" to reform efforts, the US Department of Justice has issued its first comprehensive standards for prisons and jails.

Meanwhile, a US district judge in Texas has declared that state's prison system, largest in the nation, unconstitutional. In his decision, Judge William Justice cited the use of prisoners to quell disturbances by other prisoners, overcrowded cells, and payless labor.

Texas prison officials did not deny that their system is overcrowded, according to a spokesman. But they are nonetheless likely to appeal the decision.

The Texas decision is "probably the most important prison case" yet decided by a federal court, says William Nagel of the nonprofit American Foundation, which seeks prison reform. If upheld, he says, the decision will provide a precedent for suits in other states calling for reduced noise in cell blocks, better recreational facilities and opportunities, and more space and privacy, among other changes.

The new Justice Department standards call for 50 to 80 square feet of space per inmate — more than double what many Texas prisoners have, Nagel says.

The standards will help state corrections commissioners when they seek additional funds from their legislatures, he says. He also applauds the remarks by Chief Justice Burger.

Says Nagel: "Nobody ever considered Burger to be soft on crime, or a wide-eyed liberal — and he's saying the same things we're saying."

In his year-end review of the criminal justice system, Burger stressed the need for prison reforms. "To put people behind walls and bars and do little or nothing to change them is to win a battle but lose a war," he said.

In recent years, both federal and state prison systems have made it easier for prisoner complaints to be heard. And organizations have been set up to help ex-offenders find jobs.

But most prisons remain in what officials consider dangerously overcrowded conditions, and most states are hard-pressed to find construction funds for new facilities.

Reformers continue to suggest that less expensive alternatives be used, such as greater use of probation and halfway houses, the residents of which may work or attend classes.

Other new Justice Department standards cover inmate access to the courts and communication, health facilities, and rules of discipline and their fair enforcement.

Nationally, however, court orders for prison changes are seldom carried out rapidly. A court-appointed monitor of the Georgia State Prison at Reidsville reported Jan. 6 that many changes ordered in 1976 still have not been made. As a result, the monitor said, the prison remains "volatile."

In Gratitude  
Yoko Ono Lennon

I thank you for your letters, telegrams and thoughts. They have come from all over the world, including every part of America, Europe, Asia and Africa. This was a consolation to me, since both John and I believed in brother and sisterhood that goes beyond race, color and creed. They have come from all walks of life, including from those who are in prison. The kind letters from prisons especially warmed my heart.

I thank you for sending your checks to Spirit Foundation. It came in 50 cents, one dollars, five dollars, and has now reached 100 thousand dollars in total. John and I kept the Spirit Foundation staff to the minimum: John, I and a lawyer friend. All three of us, naturally, were unpaid. All expenses were paid out of John's and my own pockets. Since there is no reason to change this good system now or ever in the future, your money, every penny of it plus the interest it generates will go straight to the people in need at the end of the year. In order to maintain the simple and effective operation, Spirit Foundation has not and will not authorize or participate in any outside activity or merchandising.

I thank you for your concern for people who are making money on John's name after his death. There are some of you who feel guilty about receiving paychecks for the Lennon articles you have written for the media. Do not feel guilty. People who wish to do business in a small scale in tribute to John, using his name but in good taste: you have my blessings. Remember, John was a man with a great sense of humor and understanding. "Whatever gets you through your life," he would say. He would have felt better that you had a nice meal on him than if you had wallowed in guilt. Spend well for your children and loved ones. If there is any left, give to the ones who are in need. Do not ask for my authorization of your ventures, though, since it will be unfair to give to one and not to the others. Individuals and corporations who wish to exploit John's name in a large scale: I ask your voluntary act to report to me of your intentions and plans, respecting the feelings and legal rights of his family, and make arrangements to satisfy them.

I thank you for your feeling of anger for John's death, I share your anger. I am angry at myself for not having been able to protect John. I am angry at and at all of us for allowing our society to fall apart to this extent. The only "revenge" that would mean anything to us, is to turn the society around in time, to one that is based on love and trust as John felt it could be. The only solace is show that it could be done, that we could create a world of peace on earth for each other and for our children.

If all of us just loved and cared for one person each. That is all it takes. Love breeds love. Maybe then, we will be able to prevent each other from going insane. Maybe then, we will be able to prevent each other from becoming violent, as violence is in our hearts and not in the weapons. Guilt is not in the one who pulls the trigger, but in each of us who allows it.

When John fell right beside me, I felt like we were in a guerilla war, not knowing who or where the enemy was. I kept telling my staff, who were hiding razors and newspaper articles from me, to show me everything: every telegram, every letter and every message. I was in the dark. I had to know. I saw the death photo. John looked peaceful, like in the back of the Imagine cover. Are you trying to tell me something, John? I saw the photo where he signed the autograph. It was flashed on the TV again and again.

TEAM STANDINGS

Somehow that photo was harder for me to look at than the death photo. John was in a hurry that afternoon. He did not have to give his autograph but he did, while the man watched him, the man who was to betray John later. I looked at the photo. I noticed that it was the photograph shown on TV where John's head was bent forward, obviously to sign his name. But it was a strange posture for John to show. Then I realized that he was signing for the gate of heaven.

John and I believed that we were one mind taking two bodies at this time "for convenience," and it's more fun, as he put it. Lately, we were calling ourselves "the group," because of the recording. "I like both of you," he used to tease me. For the past five years, I was working downstairs in my office during the day, and John, upstairs in the apartment. Now I am still downstairs and he is in the big upstairs.

I felt that I owed this letter to you. This may not answer all your questions but it is the best I can do now. This is also in place of giving interviews, personal appearances, and private talks which many of you have asked for. I would like to have some time to myself

Remember, there's nothing you can do that can't be done.

An extremely effective excursion into the realm of the supernatural, this Rangoon production combines the best elements of "The Haunting" and "The Legend of Hell House." This means mixing a scientific approach with the unleashed fury of the occult. The latter is unwittingly released by a parapsychologist, played by Richard Crenna, when he opens a trap door in an old Gothic house. Revelation, the final book in the New Testament, mentions the Devil existing in a bottomless pit for a thousand years until Satan is released from his prison. He materializes during the final sequence of this film in the sinister personage of Victor Buono, who makes an eerie Satan. The film's original title was "Cry Demon." Richard Crenna and Joanna Pettet are fine in the leads. Some of their colleagues are systematically killed off in bloodcurdling fashion. Director Gus Trikonis makes it all click, with the help of Donald G. Thompson's screenplay. The Ed Carlin production is a well-made psychological horror drama that will be highly exploitable at drive-ins and in saturation bookings. Executive producers were Paul A. 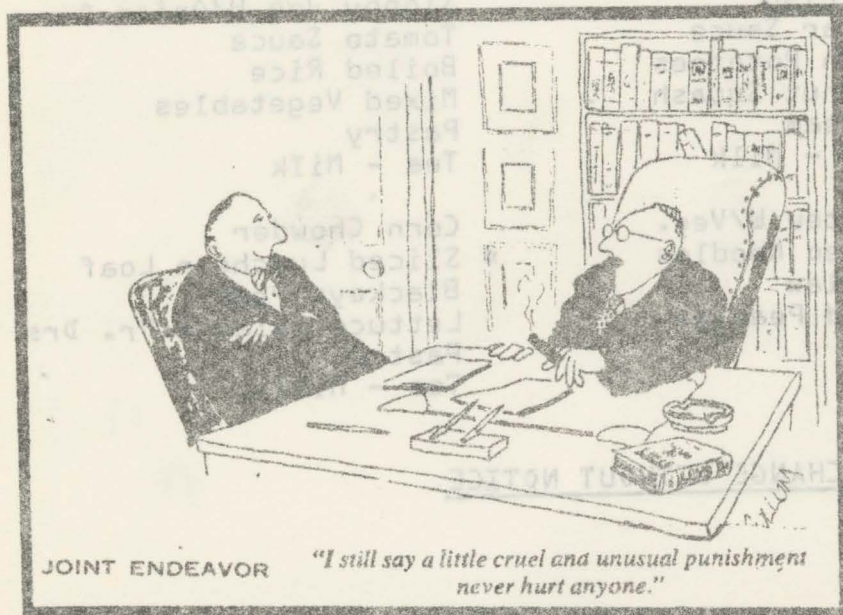
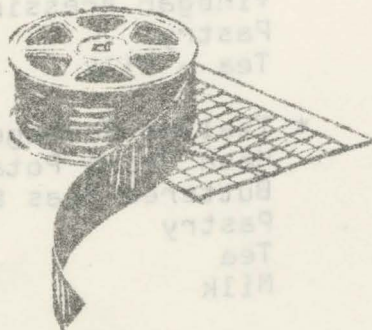
## FFOLKES

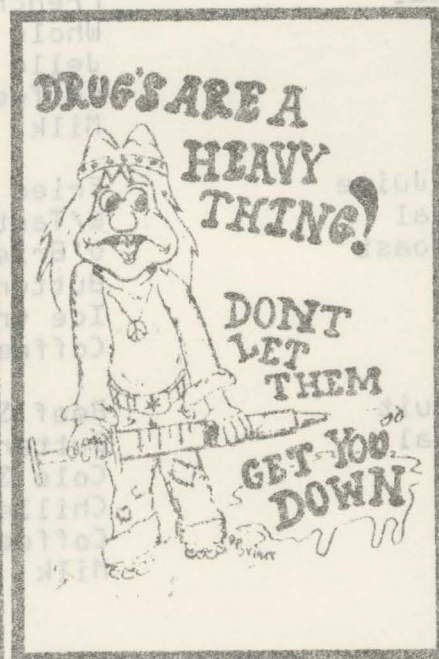
